

#### "...for they drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was the Christ."

St. Paul was schooled at an early age by a famous rabbi by the name of Gamaliel. He became proficient in Greek and Hebrew and was well versed in the law as a devout Jew.

When he became an Apostle of Jesus he travelled throughout Asia minor which is near where he was born in Tarsus, an eastern city of the Roman empire located in what is today Turkey.

Paul wrote four letters or "epistles" to the early church in Corinth, a city state (Polis) on the Isthmus of Corinth which is a narrow stretch of land which joins Peloponnese to mainland Greece. This location was roughly halfway between Athens and Sparta.

Since St. Paul was well versed in the Torah in today's second reading, he references the first reading from Exodus where Moses interacted with God - at God's initiation - to lead His people out of bondage in Egypt. God's purpose was to fulfill the covenant made with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob - the forefathers of the Israelites.

The Epistle intricately reminds his readers what Moses understood that "not everyone was on board" so to speak. Because of man's sinful nature we are all prone to teeter between being faithful and spiritually inert.

The Exodus reference of Moses leading people to the rock from which life-giving water flowed to save them while wandering in the wilderness is delicately tied to Jesus as the new "rock" from which we can gain eternal life. In Exodus, the legend established by rabbinic scholars is that the rock travelled with the people providing sustaining life. In the New Testament, St. Paul witnessed that Jesus replaced the rock as the new source of life - a veritable, sustaining, and refreshing source of "water." St. Paul concludes that only through baptism can we connect to this "water" and that otherwise the consequences in distancing ourselves from it will be spiritual death.

Baptism is not just a physical act but also a sacrament and ultimately a state of mind. We either choose to stay baptized or to wander aimlessly into our own wilderness. A thoughtful examination of our past will help confirm that choosing the path of baptism aligns us with God's will which provides the dual benefits of blessings in this life and assurances for the next one.

Reflect on Sunday's readings: Luke 13:1-9, Exodus 3:1-8, 13-15; Psalms 103:1-2, 3-4, 6-7, 8, 11

#### ICON OF ST. JOSEPH AT OUR PARISH

Every few years, the Knights of Columbus selects an icon of a saint whose patronage is particularly inspiring to Knights and their communities. Each jurisdiction receives



one or several of these icons which travel from council to council and serve as the centerpieces for prayer services in parishes throughout the Order. Since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979, more than 174,800 council and parish prayer services with some 22 million participants have been held.

#### DISCIPLES IN MISSION UPDATE

Lifelong Faith Formation Committee: We have been hard at work planning some exciting initiatives including retreats, lectures, and a Lenten Bible study. **Hospitality Committee**: We have had one successful meeting in which we discussed how to get newcomers - people who have never been inside our parish buildings - to try us out. We brainstormed a host of exciting events that might draw newcomers. Our next meeting is scheduled for 11:15am at St. Patrick's Church. Won't you join us and be part of the discussion?

Service and Justice Committee: This is our largest committee, with one representative from each of the groups here at the parish who participate in charity work. This includes scouts, Catholic Daughters, Saint Vincent de Paul, the Knights of Columbus, the Food Pantry, and a few other volunteers. They are preparing to work together to increase the breadth and depth of their individual efforts, coordinating with one another to bring our parish opportunities for service all year. Won't you pray for them in this important task!

**Vocations** Committee: This is our smallest committee, and we need your help in making it all it can be! Do you have a few hours a year (approximately one meeting per quarter) to help think of ways to promote the religious life (and education about it) in our parish?

#### Did You Know?

Did you know that while we hear no words from **Saint Joseph** in scripture, the Church regards him as someone endowed by



God with many graces and human gifts which allowed him to fulfill his mission of being head of the Holy Family as protector and provider? We know from scripture that Joseph was a humble man who worked as a carpenter, but we also learn in Luke 3:31 that he came from the royal lineage of King David, and the angel who appeared to him in a dream in Matthew 1:20 addressed him as "Joseph, son of David." St. Joseph is seen as a model of trust in God, following His guidance without questioning. In 1870, Pope Pius IX named him Patron of the Universal Church, and his many virtues and strengths have led numerous groups to claim him as their patron, including fathers, families, workers, home-buyers/ sellers, the dying, and more. Two feast days in the Church's calendar honor St. Joseph: the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the Husband of Mary on March 19th and the Memorial of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1st. #### The Sacrament of Reconciliation




Dr. Elizabeth Woodard, Pastoral
