Dear Friends and Family,

The fourth Sunday of Lent delivers one of the best known and well-loved parables: The Prodigal Son. Many of us know the story well. I offer you Bartolomé Esteban Murillo's, "The Return of the Prodigal Son (1667/1670)" for your prayer and reflection this week. Art has a way of expressing and conveying many layers of meaning. If the Spirit moves you, please take some time with this artwork and the following reflection questions:

- What do you notice most in the painting? Where is your attention drawn? Why?
- How does that aspect of the painting reflect where you are (emotionally, mentally, physically, or spiritually)?
- What depiction makes you more curious? What further questions do you want to ask the people?
- Who are you in the scene? Which character can you relate to most right now?
- Where is God in relation to you in this painting?

  The story of the Prodigal Son is a memorable parable because the people of the story remind us of our human experiences. The father loses half of his estate and for many years did not have his son in his life. Who goes through life without loss? How many



of us have hard family relationships who challenge us? The younger son demands his inheritance and leaves his home country, squandering all that he has. In his destitution, a place of "hunger," the younger son remembers his father's generosity. With courage, he seeks the father's forgiveness. What have we learned in our mistakes and suffering? Pain and suffering are part of life and can be the catalyst for some of our most powerful conversions and renewal. To forgive and ask for forgiveness are one of the most profound graces given to us. Maybe the older son resonates more with us in his self-righteous anger? Do we ever feel like our sense of loyalty, devotion, and piety go unnoticed? Is part of seeing the faults in others part of our healing story, or, perhaps our steadfast faithfulness is what God is trying to teach us?

Our lived experiences of loss, grief, compassion, longing, pride, joy, reunion, celebration, jealousy, conversion and forgiveness are part of our stories. It is fitting that we hear of this parable during Lent. Lent provides us the space to reflect on our entire human experiences and humbly orient them towards the cross. The cross reconciled our sins through the redemptive work of Jesus. St. Paul reminds us: "all this is from God...[He] was reconciling the world to Himself in Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation." Truly, it is from God's goodness and mercy, we are given hearts drawn to reconciliation. My prayer for us as we continue the journey through Lent, we have the opportunity to experience the peace and healing that comes with reconciliation...both with God and one another.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Did you know that Easter is one of the Catholic Church's movable feasts? A movable feast is one that does not have a fixed date, but can occur on varying dates from year to year. It is actually the phases of the moon which help determine on what date Easter will be celebrated in any given year. The Church has decreed that Easter will be celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the First Day of Spring. Scientists have determined that some years the vernal equinox falls on March 21st, but other years, it can fall on March 20th, or even March 19th, so for consistency's sake, the Church considers March 21st as the ecclesial First Day of Spring. Because of this determination, Easter must always fall somewhere from March 22nd to April 25th. This year, the first full moon after March 21st occurs on Saturday, April 16th, so accordingly, we will celebrate Easter the following Sunday, April 17th ...in the later range of dates! Next year, 2023, it will move to April 9th-

#### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

The Saint Vincent de Paul Society takes this opportunity to thank all of its benefactors during this pandemic, for general help and for donations specifically for the Food Pantry. These last two years have shown us just how devastating the pandemic has been to the economy, and how so many on the fringes of society have experienced the lack of a stable food source, or basic housing needs. Your generosity has helped hundreds of families in our community.

Our friends at the Knights of Columbus have been especially generous, having arranged for several deliveries of rice (about five or six tons) over the past two years, meeting a very human need. SVdP and the Food Pantry are very appreciative for the blessings that the Knights have provided for persons seeking help.

Prior to the pandemic, the pantry served 1,200 families per month; at its busiest, the food pantry has served that many each week, for months on end. This has required the help of dozens of volunteers who bagged, distributed, and sorted the food, with some persons making deliveries to the porches of families in isolation due to illness.
