Dear friends,

There is a quote from Oscar Wilde that came to my mind with today's readings. It is a wonderful line from his 1893 play "A Woman of No Importance": "[E]very saint has a past, and every sinner has a future." This quote seems so appropriate when reflecting on Jesus' encounter with the woman caught in adultery, and with the self-righteous scribes and Pharisees who have to turn away with rare humility, as they silently admit that they themselves are not sinless.

One meaning of Wilde's quote is perfect for today: no person is so good that s/he has not failed at some point, and no one is so bad that s/he cannot be saved. All of our Lenten Gospels have reminded us of this: that God is always "doing something new" by opening our blinded eyes, softening our hardened hearts, and healing our sin-wearied souls.

A closer reading of Wilde's work probably points to yet another dimension of his own unique, humorous and irreverent insights: he actually preferred the "fascinating" sinners over the "boring" saints! While Jesus was drawn to the sinner in love and mercy, Wilde humorously believed that "to turn an interesting thief into a tedious honest man was not his aim."

In Jesus' own days, or Wilde's late Victorian era, or our own 21st century, sin can indeed fascinate and lure us, but God's loving call to repentance and healing is never far from us: "where sin abounds, grace abounds much more." Repentance becomes the "moment of initiation" into a new way of living and relating. That was true for the woman caught in adultery, perhaps even for some of the humbled Pharisees who walked away recognizing their own sins, and true also for Oscar Wilde, who asked to be baptized a Catholic on his deathbed.

Is repentance true for us now as well? Remember: "every saint has a past, and every sinner has a future." God is always doing something new. Embrace your new, healed, and graced future!

Let us all pray for each other and for peace.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is a great sign of God's mercy? We read in the Gospels how after His baptism, Jesus withdrew to the desert to fast and pray for forty days, and while there was tempted by Satan. Our Baptism renders our souls pure, but afterwards like Christ, we also are subject to temptation by Satan. Unlike Jesus who resisted sin, due to our human weakness we often give in. To remedy this tendency of humans to sin and its harmful results, the Church offers us through Reconciliation the means to have our sins forgiven and begin anew with a pure soul. In the Gospel of John 20:19-23, we can read of Jesus' establishment of this sacrament on the evening of His resurrection day, "...He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." The Church teaches us that in Confession God forgives our sins through the action of the priest who stands in the place of Christ. This gift of mercy is available to us to receive forgiveness, to be relieved of our guilt, and to be strengthened against future temptations. Out of love, God offers us this beautiful gift of Reconciliation...will we accept or reject His gift? Lent provides us with the perfect opportunity to accept and embrace His forgiveness and peace.




