

# "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

As we enter into the most sacred week of our liturgical year, it is a joy to reflect on the deep meaning of the liturgies that await us between now and next Sunday. These are liturgies that mark the climax of our story as Christians.

Palm Sunday, also known as Passion Sunday, involves a strange balance between holding the joy of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and holding the darkness of knowing what awaits him there. We cry out to him in the words of praise said long ago, words of "Hosanna" while waving palm branches. "Hosanna" means "Save us!" What an interesting cry of praise. To praise the Lord is also to acknowledge that it is he, and he alone, who can save us. It is an acknowledgement of his Lordship and his infinite love, and also an acknowledgement of our own shortcomings and fallenness. We praise by asking for the grace to enter into the divine love, the love for which we were created. The text, "Hosanna" is familiar to us as Catholics because we sing it at each and every Mass. Why is that? We believe that it's the text of the song being sung in all eternity – right now! – by the angels in Heaven. This is why, just before we sing this line at Mass, the priest does not simply say, "Let us sing," but rather, "Let us join our voices with the angels as they proclaim..."

As we depart Mass this weekend, we prepare our hearts to enter the Paschal Triduum, a Mass so significant that it cannot be confined to a single day. The Triduum Mass begins on the evening of Holy Thursday and does not conclude until the end of the Easter Vigil Saturday night. Have you ever noticed how Holy Thursday does not end with the traditional, "Mass is ended, go in peace?" That's because it is not ended. It continues throughout Friday and into Saturday. Friday's service does not have a beginning or an end as a usual Mass does, and Saturday does not have a usual beginning. The word "Triduum," in fact, means "three days." And the days are measured according to the way Jews of Jesus' time would have measured a day: beginning at sundown. The three days of the Triduum are: From sundown Holy Thursday to sundown Good Friday, from sundown Good Friday to sundown Holy Saturday, and from sundown Holy Saturday to Sundown Easter Sunday.

The events we commemorate this week mark the most solemn, most sorrowful, and most joyful events in our story. Christ washes the disciples' feet, gives his body and blood to them in a new and eternal covenant at the Last Supper, agonizes in the garden of Gethsemane (which is why Holy Thursday ends with a solemn vigil in which we "keep watch" with Jesus, trying to "stay awake" as he asked the disciples in that garden), is tortured, crucified, and killed. And, then, in the darkness before Easter morning, the light of his eternal victory shines – he is risen! If you are able to attend the Triduum liturgy this week, please do. They are a time of beautiful grace and mystagogy. Of special note is the joyous occasion of welcoming new Catholics into the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Did you know that the Easter Triduum (also called the Paschal Triduum), though only three days, is considered to be one of the seasons of the Church's year? The Triduum begins on Holy Thursday and also encompasses Good Friday and Easter Vigil/ Easter. The Fathers of the Second Vatican Council wrote, "...the Easter Triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the **entire liturgical year.**" Each year, the faithful are invited and encouraged through their participation in these celebrations to immerse themselves in the great mystery of redemption that Christ has wrought for us by His suffering, dying, and rising from the dead. Please join our Catholic family as together we commemorate Christ's institution of the Eucharist and the Priesthood at the Last Supper, His washing of the Disciples' feet, His passion and death, and finally His glorious resurrection. Witness also the continual new life in our Church as we welcome new Catholics through the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil Mass!




