Last Friday morning, my family faced an emergency with our youngest child, Elijah, ending up in the ER at Boston Children's Hospital. As my wife took the ambulance to Boston, I took the older two to the playground, fretting on what to do. Of course I wanted to go to Boston, but with my parents out of town for the weekend and friends at work, I had no one to watch the older two. As I stood there texting family and friends, a familiar face from the parish approached with her two year old son. My eldest, Ethan, ever the talker and over-sharer, didn't lose much time before telling her what was happening with Elijah.

A stay at home mother of five (let's call her Susan), Susan, had recently been to the ER with her two year old where he received stitches on his forehead (still noticeable). After expressing knowing words of empathy, she could see the vulnerable situation I was in and inquired whether she could help with the kids so I could be with Diana and Elijah. Insisting she was free the rest of the day, had plenty of toys and would be happy to help, I had a feeling I could trust her generous heart and genuine Christian spirit. With her other children soon to be home after a half-day of school, they would be in good hands.

However, I hesitated, uncomfortable accepting the help. *Sometimes, accepting the help of others is a great challenge.* I nervously looked at my phone in my hesitation and saw that Diana had sent a picture of Elijah on the stretcher in the ambulance. One glance at the picture and any hesitation evaporated. My kids were, mind you, thrilled with my decision to leave them behind to explore this new toy wonderland.

After a CT scan revealed that, although the injury to Elijah was significant, surgery was not needed and he would heal quickly on his own with antibiotics, Diana, Elijah and I drove back by dinnertime. When we arrived at Susan's house, pizza was just being delivered and chocolate chip cookies taken from the oven. We were greeted by a house full of happy children and overflowing hospitality. It was truly a day of contrasts: the horror of holding a child with a serious injury and the grace and charity of a magnanimous woman and her family.

Midway through the Easter Season, we have been able to contemplate together the empty tomb and have encountered the Risen Christ, but how do you and I respond to this amazing gift of God? How must this affect me and my way of life? Jesus answers that question in today's Gospel with a command: you must "love one another as I have loved you." A tall order!

Christ's love is always gratuitous and overflowing. It goes beyond expectations. My love is cramped. When I am open to receiving Jesus's love, however, my heart overflows. My love will expand as I surrender myself to the abyss of love that is God's heart, then give it away.

"This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have for one another." Without this witness, how can we encounter Christ living and active in the world 2000 years after He walked the earth? Jesus wants our love to be so palpable and profound that others notice and see glimpses of God's love. He wants everyone walking in doubt and hopelessness to see and say "Maybe I am noticed by God and loved," daring to hope for true and lasting joy.

When we allow our hearts to be open to Christ's love, sharing His love becomes second nature, simple, and effortless. What to Susan was probably just a simple gesture of kindness to a family in need was precisely the kind of love that can move or reinvigorate hearts to see Christ active and well amidst an otherwise dark and troubled world.

Will you accept God's boundless love today, then give it away gratuitously? This is, after all, how all will know you are Jesus' disciple...


MOTHER'S DAY SPIRITUAL BOUQUET CARDS ON THE ALTAR FOR ALL OF MAY
