#### Bulletin Reflection May 29, 2022

Today is the last Sunday of Easter. This past week we celebrated the Feast of the Ascension. While John's Gospel today tells of Jesus' prayer in the Garden on Holy Thursday, it speaks very much about Jesus' hope for His disciples and the world in general as He leaves for Heaven. He asks God to allow them to carry on His work, and to bring them to Heaven some day.

As I read today's Gospel, it reminded me of the song "The Commission", sung by Cain (<u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=APATH3ea-D0</u>). The song is basically Jesus commissioning His disciples to "Go tell the world about Me", and it promises that we will be with Him someday. Here is one verse and the chorus.

Don't forget the things that I taught you I've conquered death and I hold the keys Where I go you will go too, someday But there's much to do here before you leave

Go tell the world about me I was dead but now I live I've gotta go now for a little while But goodbye is not the end.

As Christians, we are also commissioned to tell the world the story of Jesus' teachings, both in words and in deeds. If we can do that, we fulfill Christ's desires for us, and we cement our place in Heaven with Him. Living a Christ-centered life makes us joyful, and others will see it, and will want it too. Are we living our lives in a way that inspires others to emulate us? Have you invited someone to join you at church, either for worship, or for a function? My favorite line in the Gospel is "Father, they are Your gift to Me." How will you be that gift to others?

This weekend we also celebrate Memorial Day; it is a time when we remember those who died in service to our country, but also those we love, who are no longer with us. As Jesus says, "Where I go, you will go too someday...". It is comforting to think that those we have lost are with Him in Heaven now, and that we will reunite with them when we are done with our work here on earth. When we miss our loved ones, we remember the good that they did – they are God's gift to us. How will we be remembered by those we leave behind? Will others think of us as God's gift to them?

It is never too late to start over as we try to be good Christians. God loves that we try, even when we aren't perfect. We "practice" our Catholicism so that we get as close to perfect as possible; don't let a stumble slow you down. Remember, "Goodbye is not the end."

#### A Letter and Thank You From Our Volunteer in the Ukraine

"I must say that I am humbled by the generosity shown by Sacred Hearts parishioners who donated goods for Ukrainian refugees, thank you. Because of your efforts, two completely full suitcases were bought to Poland for distribution to Ukrainian refugees. (Shout out to Delta Airlines for waiving the overage fees). In Poland, I was in a resettlement center where refugees would come to transition prior to their relocation into other parts of the globe. Initially, 650 beds were available for this effort, but the Polish authorities required the center to reduce to 450 as we were no longer going to be housing persons staying within Poland. Our guests included young families, the elderly, cancer patients, and even an injured Ukrainian soldier awaiting transport to a hospital for a leg amputation. As no young men are allowed to leave Ukraine, when I say families I really mean mothers and children. Another casualty of the war – the family unit.

In addition to being provided a clean, safe bed, our guests were offered hot food, clothing, bedding, and personal hygiene supplies. While some people arrived with a suitcase, others were forced to evacuate with nothing but the clothes on their back. As needed, people were given a suitcase or bag in which to store their family's newly acquired goods. In fact, one woman was over joyed just to receive a plastic bag in which to put the blanket she had been just given. I was taken aback by the compassion of the volunteers at the center. Guests were escorted to their cots and these volunteers insisted on carrying the guests' bags along with the bedding, like a bell hop would do. And they did so with humility, respect, and a smile. Truly Christlike!

Finally, I guess the biggest lesson I took away from this endeavor is that somethings are important and the rest is just a distraction. Having a roof over your head, not having to worry about bombs dropping around you, having electricity and water, and not having to run for your life is important. That car that just cut you off, despising the person who doesn't like your political candidate, talking about others behind their back, or not being able to find your favorite brand of peanut butter are just distractions. I, for one, will concentrate even more on what it means to follow the path of Jesus. "SLAVA UKRAINII!"

# **DID YOU KNOW?**

Did you know that a **novena** is a nine-day period of prayer usually said to petition God or to give Him thanks? The word "novena" comes from the Latin word "novem," meaning "nine" (...though in our present day, novenas can last for longer periods). On May 26th, the Church celebrated Ascension Thursday in observance of when, forty days after His resurrection, Jesus ascended to His Father in Heaven. We know from Acts 1:14 that after Christ's ascension, the disciples were gathered together praying for the coming of the Holy Spirit who then descended upon them at Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4), fifty days after Easter. It is believed that possibly those nine days of the disciples' prayer between the Lord's ascension and Pentecost served as a model for the first novena. Regardless of the actual origin of novenas, the Church today still encourages the faithful to use these nine days between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost to pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit in their own lives, in our Church, in our country and in the world.
