Staff Reflection

The Holy Family, Our Example for Our Journey with Christ

Yesterday was Christmas, when we celebrated the birth of Jesus, the Son of God humbling himself to share in our humanity. Today for many people Christmas is over. It is time to go back to living life as before. Some might spend the day taking down the Christmas decorations, watching football, or checking out the after Christmas sales. Yet for us Catholics, the Christmas season is just beginning. It is a time of great joy and we need to spend this season growing with Christ so we can grow in the peace and joy that only he can give us.

In the Second Reading from The Letter of St. Paul to the Colossians, we are first reminded that we are brothers and sisters in Christ. That all of us who are baptized belong to a holy family, as daughters and sons of God and as chosen children of God, who are "holy and beloved". With this comes the responsibility to have "heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience." We must also be able to forgive one another. St. Paul then tells us that "over all these put on love, that is the bond of perfection." He tells us to let the "peace of Christ control our hearts. And to be thankful."

To do this we must be willing to humble ourselves and be open to the self giving love, given to us by God, through His Son, Jesus. To receive the fullness of this perfect love we must be willing to give our total self to God and share in this perfect love. This is not something we can do completely by ourselves, and it doesn't happen all at once. It is our journey, to grow in the love of Christ and become one with him. God has given us all the gifts we need to helps to grow in this love through Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Jesus has made these gifts available to us through His Church. We just have to be willing to receive these gifts and be humble enough to be open to God's grace which is available through them. These gifts are the sacraments, which strengthen us and helps us on our life journey with Christ. These are needed because this journey is not always going to be easy, but we can look to the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph and see how they persevered on their journey together. Along with their example in being holy and beloved, with heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. We can see by looking at their journey that we will experience in our journey times of uncertainty, times of hardship, times of anxiousness, along with times of not total understanding, but we must always maintain our trust in the Lord and follow his will allowing us to always experience his love. This is what will also always allow us to have true peace, as St. Paul says "the peace into which you were also called in one body."

So during this Christmas season why don't we do as Mary does and keep all these things in our hearts.
