Staff Reflection

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which brings to an end our liturgical celebration of the Christmas Season. As we contemplate the scene of Jesus' baptism in today's Gospel and feel the power of the Holy Spirit and fire with which we ourselves were baptized, perhaps we could reflect on the gift of our own Baptism. I have the privilege, here at St. Patrick Parish, to encounter parents who are preparing to have their child baptized, and also, to walk a journey of faith with adults who are desiring and seeking baptism for themselves. These experiences and encounters have led me to reflect more on my own Baptism and what it means for me that I am a baptized Catholic. Just some thoughts to share with you...

Baptism is a second birth, our birthday into God's Family. Do you know the date of your Baptism? If so, you should celebrate it or note it each year, as you do a birthday.

At Baptism, each one of us is given the grace and the call to become a saint. Depending on your perception of what a "saint" is, you may protest that you could never be a saint. But simply, a saint is a friend of God. A saint was a real person who was not perfect but who took their baptismal grace seriously enough to keep trying. We look to them because, well, if they could do it, we can do it! At Catholic baptisms, the Litany of the Saints is prayed. It is like a roll call of all the saints to come and witness this new soul starting on their road to sainthood, to join in their company. Why not choose a saint to companion you throughout the coming year. Read about them, learn about their lives, pray to them. How did they live the graces of their baptism? Ask them to help you along the way.

The Paschal Candle, that very large candle that we see by the Baptismal fountain, represents Christ and his light to us. This light dispels the darkness of sin and illumines our way back to heaven. At each Catholic's baptism, that large candle is burning bright, and from it a baptismal candle is lit for each newly baptized. That large Paschal Candle is brought out at another point in a Catholic's life...at their funeral liturgy. The promise of eternity, given to each Christian at their baptism, is fulfilled when their earthly life ends. So, we who are baptized into Christ already have eternity in us. Wow...

I ask you to keep in your prayers all the parents who are bringing their little ones to the waters of Baptism. May they remain steadfast in their commitment of faith to their children. Prayerful support is also asked for those preparing for their Baptism this coming Easter through the RCIA process. Grace, light, holy friendship, holy membership, eternity, these are just some of the blessings of our Baptism. Today is a good day to reflect on my Baptism and thank God for the gift of this Sacrament.

Growing Together as a Family of Faith Update - \$500,000 to go!



You may have noticed these figures on the widows as you enter the vestibule of the church. A few months ago, there were 227 of these images, representing students and members of our parish needing seats in our new Early Childhood Education Center and Spirituality Center. Today, due to the generosity of many of our parishioners and friends there are only 69 still standing; all these others

now have seats.

Three years ago, our goal was to raise \$6 million to ensure the completion of four projects. To date we have \$5.5 million in pledges and gifts. That is an amazing gift for our parish. The hope is that we will reach our goal before the start of Lent, the beginning of March. To reach our goal all are encouraged to participate, every gift moves us one step closer to preparing for the future of St. Patrick Parish.

Although it's only the early days of January and we may have only begun to put away our Christmas decorations, we are encouraged to begin to reflect upon “what will Lent look like for me?” Will it be a time for me to grow in holiness and allow myself to be drawn closer to the Lord? Or will it arrive and be gone so quickly that my life hasn't changed. Lent begins in early March, but our parish is already preparing for opportunities to assist us in deepening our faith. All of the details are still in process, but the list below are invitations for us to be prepared to meet the Lord in a special way when Lent arrives.



Oremus – a guide to Catholic Prayer – essentials of an effective and fruitful prayer life. To begin the first week of Lent and go through 1st week in Easter (March – April 20th)

Simple Supper – An evening for married couples, that will include light food, prayer and a guest speaker.

Lenten Day of Service – for families to participate in projects in the service of others.

24 Hours with the Lord – Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for 24 Hours in the Church.

Day of Reconciliation – for 9 hours (from 10AM – 7PM) priests will be available in our church for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

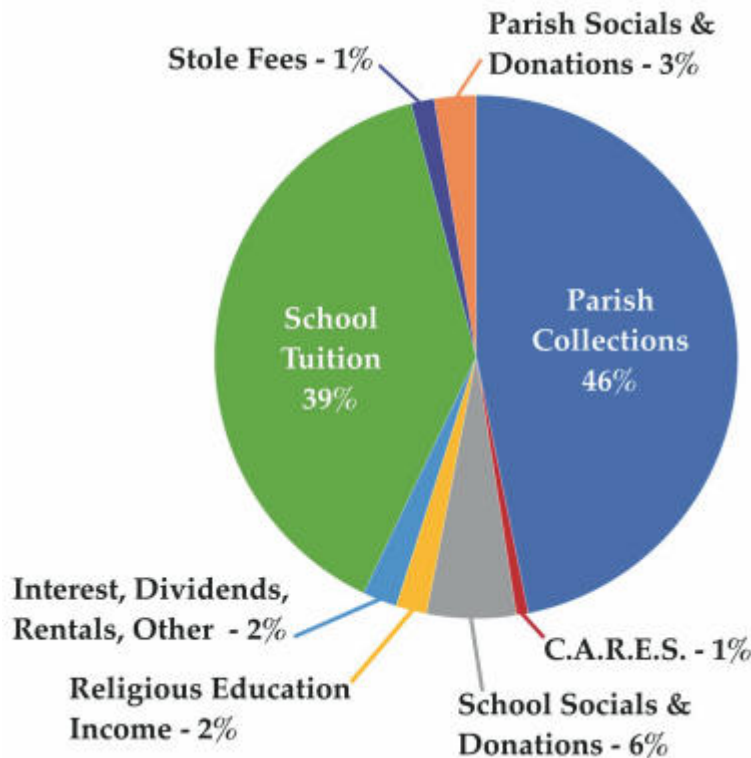

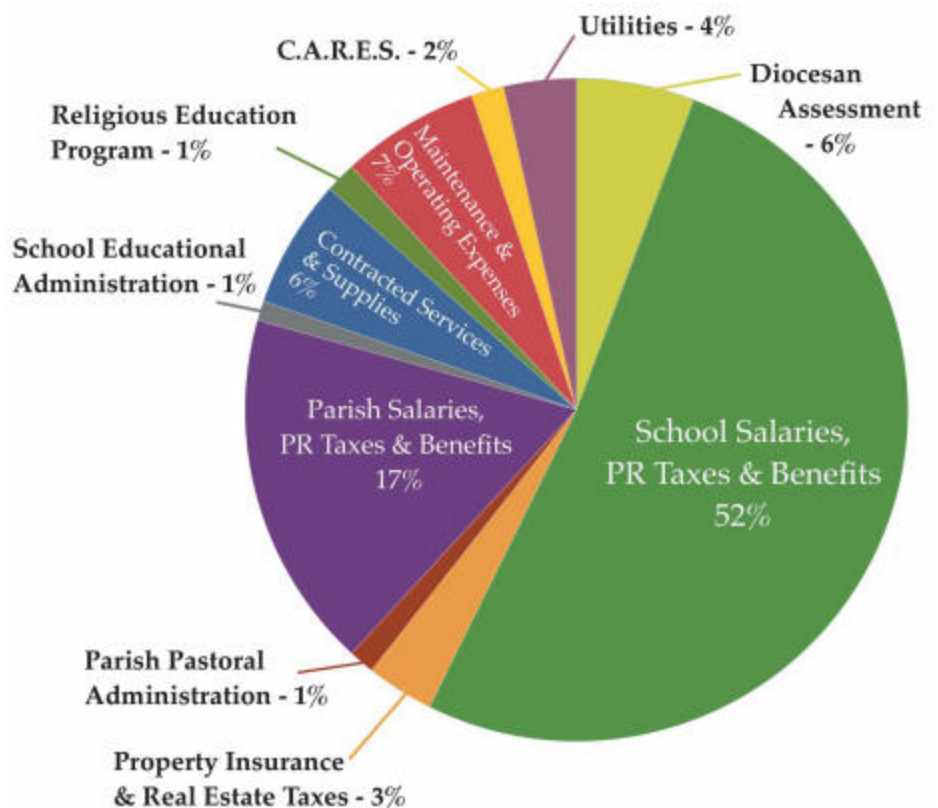
