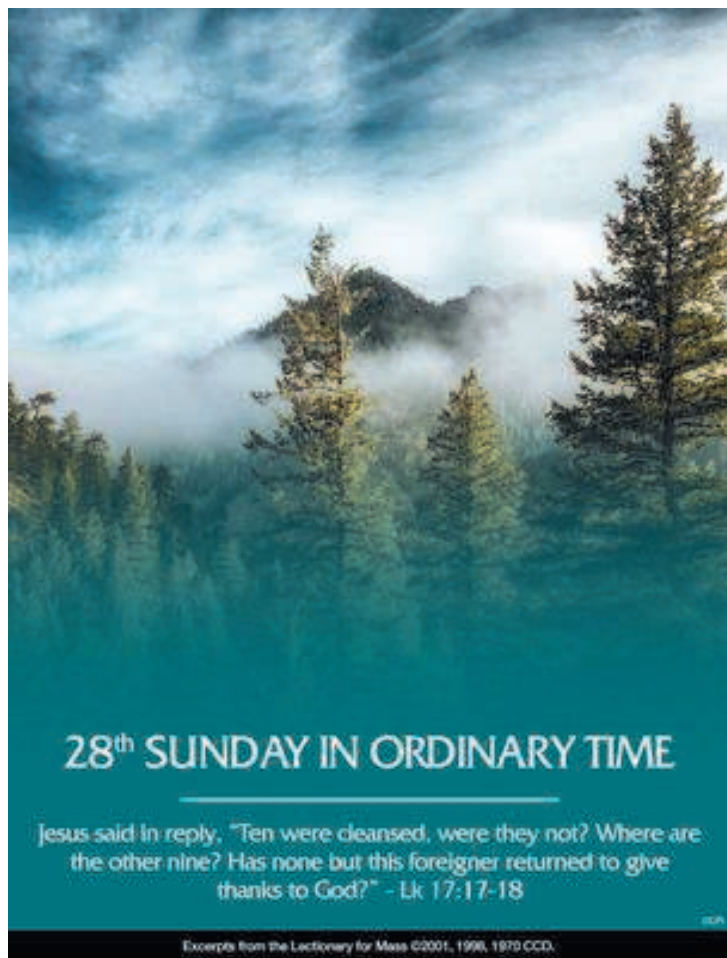

PASTOR'S CORNER

Our Gospel reading today urges us to be aware of the gifts and blessings in our lives so that we may express our gratitude to God. As important as a grateful heart is, that is really secondary to the main theme of our readings as a whole today. We have the tail end of the story of the healing of Naaman the Syrian in our first reading and then we hear the response to the Psalm; "The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power."



Seen in this light the Gospel, while stressing knowledge of gifts given, and gratitude, is also a message in the universality of Christ's salvific mission. Who is the one who comes back to say thank you?? A Samaritan – "a foreigner" as Jesus states. Jesus has come to save all people. That means something for us – here and now. There are no folks we can write off. As Christ extended himself to everyone so must we treat all people as we would want to be treated. May we always be honest before the Lord so that we may offer our thanks for his blessings and always ask that he help us to be His presence as He continues, through us, to "reveal to the nations his saving power."

Many people go to Mass with the expectation that they are supposed to "get" a lot out of it. But, what you get out of Mass is dependent on what kind of changes you are willing to make in your efforts before, during and after Mass, because what you put into Mass determines what you get out of it. Yes, you will receive grace when you receive the Eucharist. But, the depth of the impact of grace is awaiting a simple "yes" from you.

Make sure your attitude is adjusted properly

Don't expect to be entertained. You are there to offer God worship and receive grace. It isn't about being 'engaged'.

Look for God in every part of the Mass.

Don't let outside distractions disturb your internal peace.

Find one nugget in the preaching to take home with you.

Maine Catholic Men's Conference
