

PASTOR'S CORNER

Happy First Sunday of Advent!!! Today we begin our new Liturgical Year. I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving with lots of good food and good times with family and friends.



We enter into Year A for our readings as we begin our Advent Season of expectation & anticipation. Even when I wasn't Catholic, I loved this month of December. While I was going through the RCIA program I realized why Christmas was always so important to me – it really wasn't the presents! This season leading up to our celebration of the Incarnation is a reminder, for me, of my childhood.

December was a special month in our household. My father owned his own business, so December meant the biggest revenues of the year and it meant staying open til 9 PM 6 nights a week and opening on Sunday!! Unheard of at the time! Of course, as I got older, I was there working too. After school or after dinner I would be helping folk pick out gifts and wrapping them up! This all culminated with the wonderful day of Christmas Eve when the store would be come a day long Christmas party. I would look forward to this time all during the year because there was so much going on – people seemed to be happier, warmer, more willing to let small slights slide. I remembered all this as I lived through my first Advent as an aspiring Catholic and began to see that my excitement over the season, and my anticipation of the events of Christmas Eve & Christmas had its roots in the true meaning of the season. Even though I was not a professed Christian in my youth, I understood what Christmas was about. If challenged I might even have been able to pull off Linus' speech from a Charlie Brown Christmas. With all that knowledge, however, belief still wasn't there. I see now though, that my excitement, by enthusiasm for the season was a way of the Lord speaking to me. I didn't get the message at the time, but he was patient with me as he is with all of us. May we allow ourselves time to be awed at what we are preparing for this Season. There will be plenty of craziness, shopping, visiting, decorating – along with those activities may we find time to be still, to be silent and rest in the Lord.

A Teaching Moment: Advent hymn O Come O Come Emmanuel



Emmanuel – "God is with

us" – Doesn't that just amaze you that God Himself stays with us?

Advent is a time of welcoming, anticipation, and waiting. Our prayers rise up, "O come, please come and be with us, Lord. O come, Emmanuel." This name, which Matthew refers to in his Gospel (Matthew 1:23), was first given to Jesus by the prophet Isaiah 700 years before His birth (Isaiah 7:14).

"<u>O Come, O Come, Emmanuel</u>" is a favorite hymn to sing during Advent. Its history originates in the medieval Roman Catholic Church. This mournful melody was originally a Plainsong or Chant, which is the earliest form of singing in the church. It is believed that the traditional music stems from a 15th Century French processional for Franciscan nuns, but it may also have 8th Century <u>Gregorian</u> origins.

An unknown author wrote seven antiphons– short lines to be sung before and after psalms. Those seven antiphons all begin with the "O," and thus became known as "<u>The O Antiphons</u>." Just think, to the people of the Dark Ages-few of whom read or had access to the Bible-this song was one of the few examples of the full story of how the New and Old Testament views of the Messiah came together in the birth and life of Jesus.

And we still sing the words, connecting us throughout the centuries to our fellow believers. The next time and any time we sing it at mass or elsewhere, may we remember this connection and remember too, Christ of the past, present, and future is with us – always.
