Bricks Build Memories

Over the last several weeks BTBJ has been thrilled to join with Jewish communities from all over the greater Philadelphia area to celebrate 75 years since Israel's Declaration of Independence. From the Community Mitzvah Day on April 23 at the Horsham Center for Jewish Life and the blood drive at Or Hadash, to our BTBJ Israel 75 Shabbat dinner on April 28th to the upcoming celebration on Sunday, May 7th in Wynnewood, this has been a month filled with celebrations. Each gathering has served as a reminder of the importance to support and appreciate *Klal Yisrael*, the Jewish people.

When reading our ancient texts, in which the Jewish people long to return their land, the existence of the modern state of Israel continues to feel nothing short of miraculous. And for those who have been fortunate enough to travel or spend time in this holy land, you too have had the opportunity to experience this miracle firsthand. In fact, the rabbis of the Rabbinical Assembly also recognized the miracle that is the state of Israel, and just as we add a paragraph to our *Amidah* known as "Al Hanissim" on Hanukkah and Purim to rejoice in the miracles of these holidays, so too did they create an "Al Hanissim" insertion specifically to be recited on Yom Ha'atzmaut, Israeli Independence Day:

"We thank You for the miraculous deliverance, for the heroism, and for the triumphs of our ancestors from ancient days until our time. In the days when Your children were returning to their borders, at the time when our people took root in its land as in days of old, the gates to the land of our ancestors were closed before those who were fleeing the sword. When enemies from within the land, together with seven neighboring nations, sought to annihilate Your people, You, in Your great mercy, stood by them in time of trouble. You defended them and vindicated them. You gave them courage to meet their foes, to open the gates to those seeking refuge, and to free the land of its armed invaders. You delivered the many into the hands of the few, the guilty into the hands of the innocent. You have revealed Your glory and Your holiness to all the world, achieving great victories and miraculous deliverance for Your people Israel to this day."

May we continue to immerse ourselves in the culture, food, music, language, history and current events of the land and people of Israel. May we celebrate her successes and mourn her losses, and may we dedicate ourselves to always learn about and support the thriving communities on the ground, until such a time that we merit a return (or first time) trip to this holy land. I hope to see you on Sunday May 7th for our community celebration of Israel 75!

President's Message

A Fresh Perspective

Shalom to my BTBJ Community,

On Saturday morning I arrived at BTBJ a little late for services, about 10:15am. The parking lot was filled, the sanctuary was packed, and Val was opening the folding wall to add more chairs – 160 attendees for a B'nai Mitzvah. It was a beautiful sight.

These days when I attend services, I tend to make my way up to the front, seems like it's the right place to be for the President. But because it was so crowded, I slipped into one of the seats that were being set up in the back and joined the community as the ark was being opened.

It's been a while since I sat in the back, and as I settled in, I took in the change of scenery – at first it was mostly backs of heads. But turns out, when you sit in the back, you really get a unique view of the entire Bimah. From this vantage point, the activities, rituals, songs, and movements on the Bimah all look like a well-choreographed show.

On this particular morning, the Bimah was absolutely alive with grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, and parents all reading Torah and chanting the Aliyah blessings. Rabbi Roni and Cantor Benjamin were completely in sync with songs and prayers and managed the flow of the family, friends, and community members who were all lending their voices to the service.

From the back of the sanctuary, I was watching in real time, I'dor v'dor, generation to generation, family members participating in age old traditions and celebrating the rite of passage with the Bat Mitzvah girl. I heard the cherished words of family members bestowing their wishes and pride. And I listened to the Bat Mitzvah deliver her thoughtful D'var Torah and connect it to her passion for animals, specifically sea turtles. And then, from my perch, as I looked at the back of the heads of all the attendees, I realized that I was literally looking at a sea of sea turtles – because

the kippot given out, were lovingly crocheted with sea turtles on them, so the sanctuary was filled with dozens of sea turtles!

It was a picture, a perspective, I would have missed sitting in the front row. I am so glad I was a little late — I would have completely missed this special moment. Over the past few days, I have been sharing this experience with others because it filled me with such joy, the joy of a family and a community coming together to celebrate.

Then tonight, 3 days later, I attended another life cycle event, a shiva. The home was packed with family, friends, co-workers, and community members all there to comfort the mourners and honor a life well lived. As we began minyan, I closed my eyes and listened to the house full of voices rising up in prayer. And what struck me at this moment was that everyone in the room was chanting the blessings together and was actively participating in this age-old tradition. Both experiences were reminders to me of how truly vibrant and special our community is. Over just a few days, I witnessed our community coming together to participate in 2 very different Jewish traditions passed on for centuries. One marking the beginning of Jewish adulthood and one marking the end. I am not sure I have ever felt the strength of our heritage and the bond of our sacred BTBJ community as profoundly as I did in these back-to-back moments.

We are indeed a Kehillah Kedoshah filled with the kindest of people and I am so grateful to be a part of it all.




