

From The Pastor's Desk

- Ascension Every Day -

Why is the Ascension an event every bit as significant as Easter?

After His Resurrection, Jesus appeared to His disciples during forty days, speaking about the kingdom of God. We are somewhat familiar with the Kingdom of God when we recite the Our Father: "Thy Kingdom come thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven."

In that one statement, Jesus is elevating earth to the status of Heaven. And this is the nature of the Ascension it is less about a physical elevation and more about a moral elevation, by way of the Ascension we are elevated from the status of sinners to children of God redeemed in Christ, why we can with confidence say and pray Our Father.

Perhaps this example from bygone TV days might help our understanding. How many of you remember the hit show *The Six Million Dollar Man* that came out in 1974, or the more abbreviated title... *The Bionic Man*?

Steve Austin is an astronaut who is seriously injured when his spaceship crashes. Austin undergoes a government-sanctioned surgery, which rebuilds several of Steve's body parts with machine parts, making him cyborg-like. When Steve recovers, his machine parts enable him to have superhuman strength and speed, as well as other powers. With these powers, Steve goes to work for the Office of Scientific Information, battling evil for the good of mankind.

Remember the tag line: "Steve Austin, astronaut. A man barely alive."

Oscar Goldman: "We can rebuild him. We have the technology. We can make him better than he was. Better, stronger, faster."

What a great description of Redemption, it is a rebuilding project which concludes with Jesus ascending into Heaven...returning to the Father to announce: "Mission Accomplished."

Sin had all but destroyed us...inflicting on us what could have been a most fatal and mortal wound, permanent death or worse the permanence of hell.

Perhaps the Redemption Tag line might run like this: "...insert your name...humans...men and women barely alive soon to die because of sin."

God the Father: "We can rebuild them...I have the Son, He can make them better...stronger...holier."

Having ascended to His Mighty Throne on High...let us try to imagine what this homecoming must have been like. When Christ initially left that throne prior to His conception in the womb of Mary...He was the invisible Son of God, when He returned He was the now visible and glorified Son of Man...what's different?

He left as God and returned as both God and Man, so

that, when the Father sees Jesus standing before Him in all OUR glorified Humanity, He sees in that Human Face...your face, my face, all our faces.

In and through Christ, Man has been rebuilt, better stronger holier than ever before, but rather than the bells and whistles of fancy technology, we were rebuilt by the Body of Christ broken on the Cross...the blood of Christ spilled to the last drop from that broken body on the Cross.

And rather than working for the government, battling evil for the good of mankind, as disciples commissioned to go as Jesus insists into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature, we are laborers who must build up the body of Christ to battle evil for the good of all creation.

Though six million dollars is quite the price tag then and now for anything or anybody, we have been rebuilt with a price beyond calculation, as Saint Peter reminds us in Scripture: "realize that you were ransomed from your futile conduct, not with perishable things like silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christm as of a spotless unblemished lamb."

Our redemption was purchased at the cost of the life of Christ who because He is God having infinite dignity has infinite value; therefore, purchased at so great a price as we see from this Cross, we too have a value that is infinite.

This is how God the Father now sees us in His Son who has assumed His throne beside Him, and how it is we must see each other standing beside each other in this life...encouraging and supporting each other collaborating with each other in building up the body of Christ and His Kingdom here on earth.

As Pope Saint John Paul II reminds us: Through the incarnation, the Son of God in a certain manner united Himself with every human being, and the nature of that union, you have an extraordinary experience of in Holy Communion, except, we are now united with the Risen Christ, we are filled with the power of His Resurrection so that we might be that force for good in this world.

That being in possession of more than superhuman strength, being in possession of Divine strength...we can do as Jesus promises: in my name you will drive out demons, You will pick up serpents with your hands, and if you drink any deadly thing, it will not harm you. You will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.

We are more than bionic men and women, we are divine men and women with an infinite power at our disposal to establish the Kingdom of God here on earth in preparation for the life of the world to come.

The Catholic Academy of Bridgeport is one school on four campuses in the inner city of Bridgeport - St. Andrew, St. Ann, St. Augustine and St. Raphael—and is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC).

Its mission is to provide a Christ centered, academically rigorous learning environment where cultural diversity is welcomed, Catholic values taught and all faiths celebrated. Students are nurtured, encouraged and challenged in preparation for a successful life of leadership and service.

This year the Academy will serve 900 children. Despite tuition being only \$5,150 a year, 85% of families cannot afford this so the school must award more than \$2 million annually in financial assistance. More than 80% of students perform at grade level compared with only 23% in the Bridgeport public school system, and 100% of student's graduate high school compared with barely 70% of Bridgeport public school students.

Donations to the Bishop's Appeal enable inner-city youth to become faith-filled, industrious, responsible and well-educated adults. Our world and the Church need these young students to excel academically and to develop a strong and active faith in God..

You learn why we do everything in the Mass: Sure, swinging the censer (the smelly incense thing) is kind of fun but why is it that we do it? By becoming an altar server you begin to learn these things and it makes all the symbols of the Mass so much more understandable and interesting.

You get fully involved in the Mass and get more out of it: When you start to understand why we do something you get so much more from it. By focusing and understanding what's going on, the Mass can then lead you into a much deeper relationship with God and you feel the impact of Mass far greater!

You learn some fantastic life skills: Communication, teamwork, perceiving what needs to be done and doing it, punctuality, self-confidence, and the list goes on. Serving on the altar is a great place to start building these skills.

You become more involved in the community: By taking up a responsibility at Mass you start to recognize more and more people in the church in general. This slowly changes your experience of the church community, from a group of random people you stand next to at Mass, to a large and diverse family who you care for more deeply and will increase your love and concern for the global Church family as well

It helps you discern your vocation (purpose in life) better: Every vocation (whether marriage, consecrated single-hood, religious life or priesthood) is awesome and leads us to a greater and deeper understanding and relationship with God and others. Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession

Please join us for our Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession following the 12:00 PM Mass on June 19th.

What is a Eucharistic Procession? The Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life. A Eucharistic procession, therefore, is a public witness of the veneration toward the most holy Eucharist, conducted through public streets, though in this instance in and around our parking lot.

It takes place in this way: A consecrated host – that is, the real and substantial presence of Jesus Christ: body, blood, soul and divinity – is placed within a monstrance, which is then lifted and carried by a priest who leads the faithful in procession. Like a pilgrimage, a Eucharistic procession normally starts at one holy place and ends at another. This earthly journey reminds the Catholic faithful of their spiritual journey toward eternal life with God.

By processing with the Holy Eucharist in a reverent, prayerful and joyful manner, Catholics can honor Christ in the Eucharist and serve as witnesses to the intimate presence of God in the world and in each individual. Processions powerfully display the Incarnation, or God becoming human, and thus speak of his merciful love for all who journey to eternal life with him.
