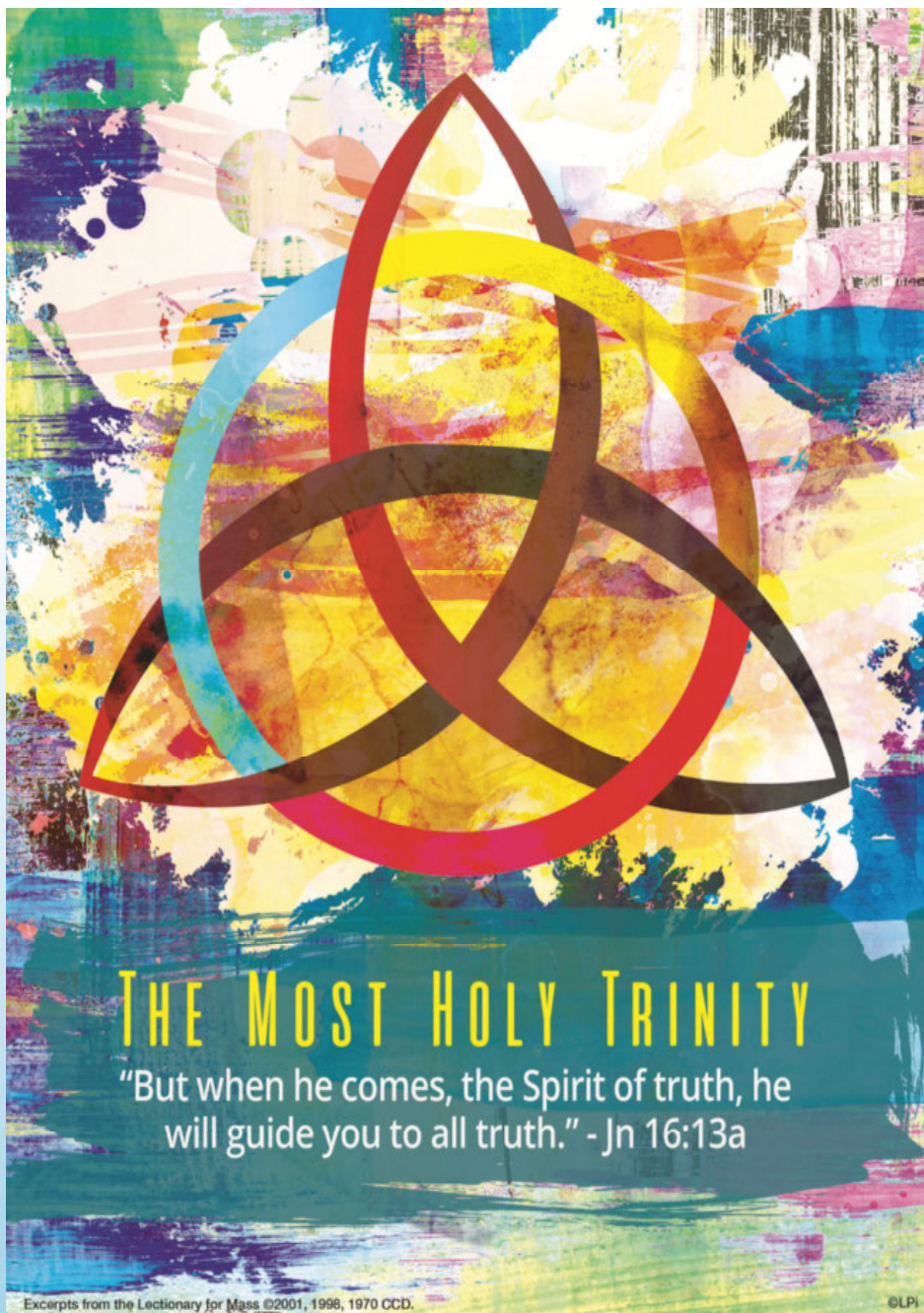

From The Pastor's Desk - "I will not leave you orphans" -

The other day, I happened to be watching the remake version of Little Orphan Annie.

Can we even begin to imagine what it must feel like to be without parents and not have a family to call one's own. As one of the kid's in the Orphanage said to Annie: "She's never going to find her family...none of us are."

Today's celebration of the Holy Trinity reminds us that our greatest and deepest desire and need is to belong.

When Adam was placed in the Garden, despite all that God had given him he was sad, he felt incomplete. That is because God was saving His best creation for last, that which would complete the creation of Adam so that He might know the fullness of being human and the fullness of God's love who created him.

When he sees Eve, Adam erupts with joyful praise: "this one at last is bone of my bone and flesh of my flesh." We are created for togetherness because of who has created us...the Holy Trinity.

God Himself is an eternal communion of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit and He has destined us to share in that communion. Our experience of the Trinity is first and foremost FAMILY, because our first experience of life is to be born into a community we call our particular family which is part of the extended family of mankind which is drawn forth from the infinitely extended family of eternal love who is the Holy Trinity.

During our lives we belong to teams, classes, armies, work groups, in-laws etc. Our whole lives are about connecting, belonging and interacting. God is able to do that perfectly...us not so perfectly, which exposes us to all sorts of problems, issues and pains none worse than dying and death which is the absolute worst separation and being pried apart there is.

Jesus says "I am the way, the truth and the life." Because of who created us we were not meant to experience death, which is why we have so deep an ingrained fear of it. As we hear from Wedding Ceremonies, "what God has joined together no one must separate." But what God joins...sin and Satan separate.

But rather than allow us to drown in our misery...God extends His hand from Heaven to rescue us. And not just His hand but His entire Human Body in fact, we call this the Incarnation.

In the story, Annie meets up with a billionaire who eventually adopts her, paying the ransom of her being an orphan so to speak. But Christ ransoms us from the Orphaned condition that sin placed us in with something infinitely more valuable than all the wealth in the world.

Saint Peter tells us: "Realize that you were ransomed from your futile conduct, handed on by your ancestors, not with perishable things like silver or gold but with the precious blood of Christ as of a spotless unblemished lamb."

Faith is like a Relay race...you drop the baton you are disqualified and the race is lost...that baton is the legacy of Faith that parents, grandparents and God parents must pass along to their children unless they/we become Orphaned from God our Father...the Holy Trinity our Family and losing Heaven, becoming always homeless.

In Annie she is always the voice of hope, reminding the other children "you are going to get adopted I promise, we all have family somewhere." And this is God's promise.

As Saint Paul explains: "You received a Spirit of adoption, through whom we cry, "Abba, Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him."

This is the awesome generosity of God, of claiming our status as children of God.

One of the kids, irate over Annie's Pollyanna like optimism and relationship with Daddy Warbucks: "you think your life is a fairy tale...there is no happily ever after." In all good fairy tales before there is that happily ever after, there are any number of obstacles that must be hurdled and hurts to endure and be healed from.

The hope of happily ever after was temporarily squashed at Calvary and then resurrected forever on Easter Sunday. God the Father is able to adopt us...remove us from the prison and orphanage of our sinfulness by purchasing us with the blood of His Son Jesus Christ who reassures us: "In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be."

Like Annie goes from the dungeon to the penthouse, we go from death to life...for the better translation of My Father's House is that of a Mansion. But what is a home if not for the Mom who lives there too?

The woman who helps Annie adjust to her new life is called Grace. We have Mary our Mother who helps us adjust to the life of grace being the fullness of Grace who gives to us the body and blood of Jesus Christ in the holy Eucharist from her own body, which assures us of our communion with God our Father and all the Angels and Saints in Heaven who form our extended family.

In those Good Friday moments of her life...Annie could sing with confidence "The Sun will come out tomorrow". Three tomorrows later the Sun/Son did come out...emerging from a Tomb so that sandwiched between Mother's and Father's Day we can all celebrate Holy Trinity or Family Day.

Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession

Please join us for our Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession following the **12:00 PM Mass on June 19th**.

What is a Eucharistic Procession? The Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life. A Eucharistic procession, therefore, is a public witness of the veneration toward the most holy Eucharist, conducted through public streets, though in this instance in and around our parking lot.

It takes place in this way: A consecrated host – that is, the real and substantial presence of Jesus Christ: body, blood, soul and divinity – is placed within a monstrance, which is then lifted and carried by a priest who leads the faithful in procession. Like a pilgrimage, a Eucharistic procession normally starts at one holy place and ends at another. This earthly journey reminds the Catholic faithful of their spiritual journey toward eternal life with God.

By processing with the Holy Eucharist in a reverent, prayerful and joyful manner, Catholics can honor Christ in the Eucharist and serve as witnesses to the intimate presence of God in the world and in each individual. Processions powerfully display the Incarnation, or God becoming human, and thus speak of his merciful love for all who journey to eternal life with him.

Convalidation of Marriage

Like other couples in your parish or family, you may be wondering if your marriage is fully recognized by the Catholic Church. Catholic Church law ordinarily requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a priest or deacon.

Catholics who exchange marriage vows in the presence of only ministers from other religious traditions or authorized civic officials (i.e.. Justice of the Peace) are not considered validly married in the eyes of the Catholic Church, which offers Marriage in the unique form of a Sacrament called Holy Matrimony: a sacrament similar in scope and power to that of Holy Communion/Eucharist. In fact, Holy Matrimony is meant to signify (a sacrament is a visible sign indicating a greater invisible and/or supernatural reality) the enduring and unbreakable love for Jesus Christ the Bridegroom for His Bride the Church.

If you feel as though you are in a position where Convalidation is possible, please call the Rectory to discuss the process involved. Couples who are not in a recognized Catholic Marriage should not receive Holy Communion and are not qualified to be Catholic godparent until the Convalidation process is complete.

Regardless of what happened in the past, the Catholic Church invites you to bring new meaning to your lives by embracing the vocation of marriage and dedicating your family's mission to sharing God's love.

Other Reasons for becoming an Altar Server.

You learn why we do everything in the Mass: Sure, swinging the censer (the smelly incense thing) is kind of fun but why is it that we do it? By becoming an altar server you begin to learn these things and it makes all the symbols of the Mass so much more understandable and interesting.

You get fully involved in the Mass and get more out of it: When you start to understand why we do something you get so much more from it. By focusing and understanding what's going on, the Mass can then lead you into a much deeper relationship with God and you feel the impact of Mass far greater!

You learn some fantastic life skills: Communication, teamwork, perceiving what needs to be done and doing it, punctuality, self-confidence, and the list goes on. Serving on the altar is a great place to start building these skills.

You become more involved in the community: By taking up a responsibility at Mass you start to recognize more and more people in the church in general. This slowly changes your experience of the church community, from a group of random people you stand next to at Mass, to a large and diverse family who you care for more deeply and will increase your love and concern for the global Church family as well.

It helps you discern your vocation (purpose in life) better: Every vocation (whether marriage, consecrated singlehood, religious life or priesthood) is awesome and leads us to a greater and deeper understanding and relationship with God and others. Altar Serving is a great way to begin to see that beauty more fully.

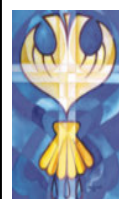
