

From The Pastor's Desk

- The Christ Samaritan -

Maybe of all emotions none reminds us more of our humanity and our obligations to care for one another than pity.

Remember the Parable of the Good Samaritan: A man lies at the point of death in the street robbed, beaten and slowly bleeding out his life; initially people pass over and around him as though he were a piece of trash or a pot-hole which includes so called religious figures. Perhaps they were too busy looking down at their cell phones to notice him. However, it is a Samaritan man who kneels down into this man's suffering, gathers him up into his arms and heart and takes him to an inn where he can recover his life and strength.

Attending to the needs of others is such a vital component to our existence that Jesus considers it the standard by which we are to be judged at the end of our lives: "When I was hungry you gave me food, when I was thirsty you gave me drink, when I was homeless you sheltered me, when I was sick or imprisoned you visited me."

To which his disciples wonder: "When Lord did we see you naked and clothe you, hungry or thirsty and feed you or give you drink or visit you when you were sick or in prison. And Jesus responds: I solemnly assure you, whatever you did to the least of my brothers and sisters you did to me."

Which should be quite the catalyst to keep our eyes and hearts more open to the needs of others all around us, making better eye contact with the sufferings of the world.

A few years ago a gentleman put together a video poem addressing this exact issue entitled "**look up**":

*I have 422 friends, yet I am lonely.
I speak to all of them every day, yet none of them really know me.*

*I took a step back and opened my eyes,
I looked around and realised,
That this media we call social is anything but
When we open our computers and it's our doors we shut*

*But when you step away from this device of delusion
You awaken to see a world of confusion.
A world of self interest, self image and self promotion
Where we all share our best bits but, leave out the emotion.
We edit and exaggerate, crave adulation
We pretend not to notice the social isolation
We put our words into order and tint our lives a-glistening
We don't even know if anyone is listening*

*Being alone isn't a problem let me just emphasize
If you read a book, paint a picture, or do some exercise
You're being productive and present, not reserved and reclusive
You're being awake and attentive and putting your time to good use*

*So when you're in public, and you start to feel alone
Put your hands behind your head, step away from the phone
You don't need to stare at the menu, or at your contact list
Just talk to one another, learn to co-exist.*

*We're becoming unsocial, it no longer satisfies
To engage with one another, and look into someone's eyes.*

*We're surrounded by children, who since they were born,
Have watched us living like robots, who now think it's the norm.*

*It's not very likely you'll make world's greatest dad,
If you can't entertain a child without using an iPad
When I was a child, I'd never be home
Be out with my friends, on our bikes we'd roam
I'd wear holes in my sneakers, and scrape up my knees
We'd build our own clubhouse, high up in the trees*

*Now the park's so quiet, it gives me a chill
See no children outside and the swings hanging still.
There's no skipping, no hopscotch, no church and no steeple
We're a generation of fools, smart phones and dumb people.*

*So look up from your phone, shut down the display
Take in your surroundings, make the most of today
Just one real connection is all it can take
To show you the difference that being there can make.
Be there in the moment, that she gives you the look
That you remember forever as when love overtook
The time she first held your hand, or first kissed your lips
The time you first disagreed but you still love her to bits*

*The time you don't have to tell hundreds of what you've just done
Because you want to share this moment with just this one.
The time you want to start a family, and the moment when
You first hold your little girl, and get to fall in love again.
The time she keeps you up at night, and all you want is rest
And the time you wipe away the tears as your baby flees the nest.*

And the time he calls you granddad and makes you feel real old.*

Jesus says: I have come not to be served but TO SERVE!

Other Reasons for becoming an Altar Server.

You learn why we do everything in the Mass: Sure, swinging the censer (the smelly incense thing) is kind of fun but why is it that we do it? By becoming an altar server you begin to learn these things and it makes all the symbols of the Mass so much more understandable and interesting.

You get fully involved in the Mass and get more out of it: When you start to understand why we do something you get so much more from it. By focusing and understanding what's going on, the Mass can then lead you into a much deeper relationship with God and you feel the impact of Mass far greater!

You learn some fantastic life skills: Communication, teamwork, perceiving what needs to be done and doing it, punctuality, self-confidence, and the list goes on. Serving on the altar is a great place to start building these skills.

You become more involved in the community: By taking up a responsibility at Mass you start to recognize more and more people in the church in general. This slowly changes your experience of the church community, from a group of random people you stand next to at Mass, to a large and diverse family who you care for more deeply and will increase your love and concern for the global Church family as well.

It helps you discern your vocation (purpose in life) better: Every vocation (whether marriage, consecrated singlehood, religious life or priesthood) is awesome and leads us to a greater and deeper understanding and relationship with God and others. Altar Serving is a great way to begin to see that beauty more fully.

Convalidation of Marriage

Like other couples in your parish or family, you may be wondering if your marriage is fully recognized by the Catholic Church. Catholic Church law ordinarily requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a priest or deacon.

Catholics who exchange marriage vows in the presence of only ministers from other religious traditions or authorized civic officials (i.e.. Justice of the Peace) are not considered validly married in the eyes of the Catholic Church, which offers Marriage in the unique form of a Sacrament called Holy Matrimony: a sacrament similar in scope and power to that of Holy Communion/Eucharist. In fact, Holy Matrimony is meant to signify (a sacrament is a visible sign indicating a greater invisible and/or supernatural reality) the enduring and unbreakable love for Jesus Christ the Bridegroom for His Bride the Church.

If you feel as though you are in a position where Convalidation is possible, please call the Rectory to discuss the process involved. Couples who are not in a recognized Catholic Marriage should not receive Holy Communion and are not qualified to be Catholic godparent until the Convalidation process is complete.

Regardless of what happened in the past, the Catholic Church invites you to bring new meaning to your lives by embracing the vocation of marriage and dedicating your family's mission to sharing God's love.
