From The Pastor's Desk

- Christ's Blood Transfusion -

July is the Month in which the Church honors the Blood of Christ.

Imagine this...you're driving home from work next Monday after a long day and you tune in your radio and you hear a little blurb about a village in India where four people have suddenly been found dead from a flu that's never been seen before. By Tuesday morning when you get up it's the lead story only now it's not four people dead but 30,000 people dead and it's spreading.

Panic strikes. As best as they can tell, after you contract it you have it for a week before you even know it. Then four days of unbelievable symptoms and then you just die. The President of the United States makes the following announcement: due to a national security risk all flights to and from America have been cancelled. If you have loved ones overseas, I'm sorry, they cannot come home until we find a cure for this thing. America is plunged into an unbelievable fear.

Then all of a sudden the news comes out; the code has been broken – a cure can be found-vaccine can be made. But it's going to take the blood of somebody who has not been infected. And so you and I, we're asked to go to our nearest hospital and have our blood tested. By the time we get down there it's late Friday night, they've got long lines of people. Doctors and nurses coming out, taking blood, putting labels on it. They take your blood.

Suddenly a young man comes racing out of the hospital. He's screaming your name, waving a clipboard. Your son tugs at your jacket and says, "That's my name they're calling."

They race your son into the hospital: "wait a minute, that's my son."

Then an old gray-haired doctor walks up to you and your spouse and says, "thank you. Your son's blood, it's clean, it's pure, it's perfect. We can use it to make a vaccine." As the news begins to spread, people begin to scream and pray and laugh and cry. Then the old doctor pulls you aside again, says, "We're going to need you to sign a consent form. We didn't realize it would be a child."

As you begin to sign the form, you realize that the box for the number of pints to be taken is empty. So you stop signing. You look up at the old doctor and say, "How many pints?" And that is when the old doctor's smile fades. He says, "we had no idea it would be a child, we weren't ready for that."

You say to him again, "How many pints?" He says, "we're going to need it all." You say, "well he's my only son." The doctor grabs you by your shoulders: "we're talking about the whole world here, do you understand that?" You respond, "but can't you give him a transfusion?" He says, "if we had clean blood we would but we don't. Please would you sign the form?"

And then he says to you, "would you like to have a moment with your son before we get started?" Could you walk back into that hospital room where your son sits who says, "mommy, daddy, what's going on?" Could you tell your son you love him?

And then when the doctors and nurses come back and say, "I'm sorry we've got to get started. People all over the world are dying," could you just leave- just turn around and walk out while your son sits there saying, "where are you going? Why are you leaving?"

And then next week, next Sunday when they hold a ceremony to honor your son and his phenomenal contributions, some people don't bother to come 'cause they got better things to do, a whole bunch of people come with a pretentious smile and just pretend to care but they really are more interested in the whole social aspect of it all and another bunch of people sit around and say, "this is pretty boring."

Wouldn't you want to stand up and say, "Excuse me, I don't know if you're aware of it or not but my son, he died so that you could have the extraordinary life you have?" Maybe that's what God wants to say?

And why we arrive at this of July in particular, to celebrate the gift and power of Christ's body and blood...the Holy Eucharist. In the Passover Story from Exodus, we are told that the Israelites are saved from death when the Angel of Death seeing the blood smeared on the doorposts and lintels passes over them.

The wood of those doorposts is an image of the Cross when upon that wood, the blood of Christ would be spilled, but only so that one day...having gathered up that blood...and placed in the Chalice of His Glorified Body...we may drink from the cup of Salvation in Holy Communion.

When Leukemia strikes the body it causes cancer in the blood, the bone marrow which produces blood to fight infection is itself infected, a cure is possible, remission, but a serious regimen of therapy and medication and self-care is required.

And to live and love another day with family and so many friends to love and support you, you'll do whatever it takes, so strong is the life instinct and desire in us...life is so worth living and love so worth giving and receiving.

Here in lies the vaccine of all vaccines...not to prevent some bad disease from harming us, but preventing death from harming us...sin from destroying us...hell from enslaving us...as Jesus Christ Himself promises and assures us: Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink.

You learn why we do everything in the Mass: Sure, swinging the censer (the smelly incense thing) is kind of fun but why is it that we do it? By becoming an altar server you begin to learn these things and it makes all the symbols of the Mass so much more understandable and interesting.

You get fully involved in the Mass and get more out of it: When you start to understand why we do something you get so much more from it. By focusing and understanding what's going on, the Mass can then lead you into a much deeper relationship with God and you feel the impact of Mass far greater!

You learn some fantastic life skills: Communication, teamwork, perceiving what needs to be done and doing it, punctuality, self-confidence, and the list goes on. Serving on the altar is a great place to start building these skills.

You become more involved in the community: By taking up a responsibility at Mass you start to recognize more and more people in the church in general. This slowly changes your experience of the church community, from a group of random people you stand next to at Mass, to a large and diverse family who you care for more deeply and will increase your love and concern for the global Church family as well.

It helps you discern your vocation (purpose in life) better: Every vocation (whether marriage, consecrated single-hood, religious life or priesthood) is awesome and leads us to a greater and deeper understanding and relationship with God and others.
