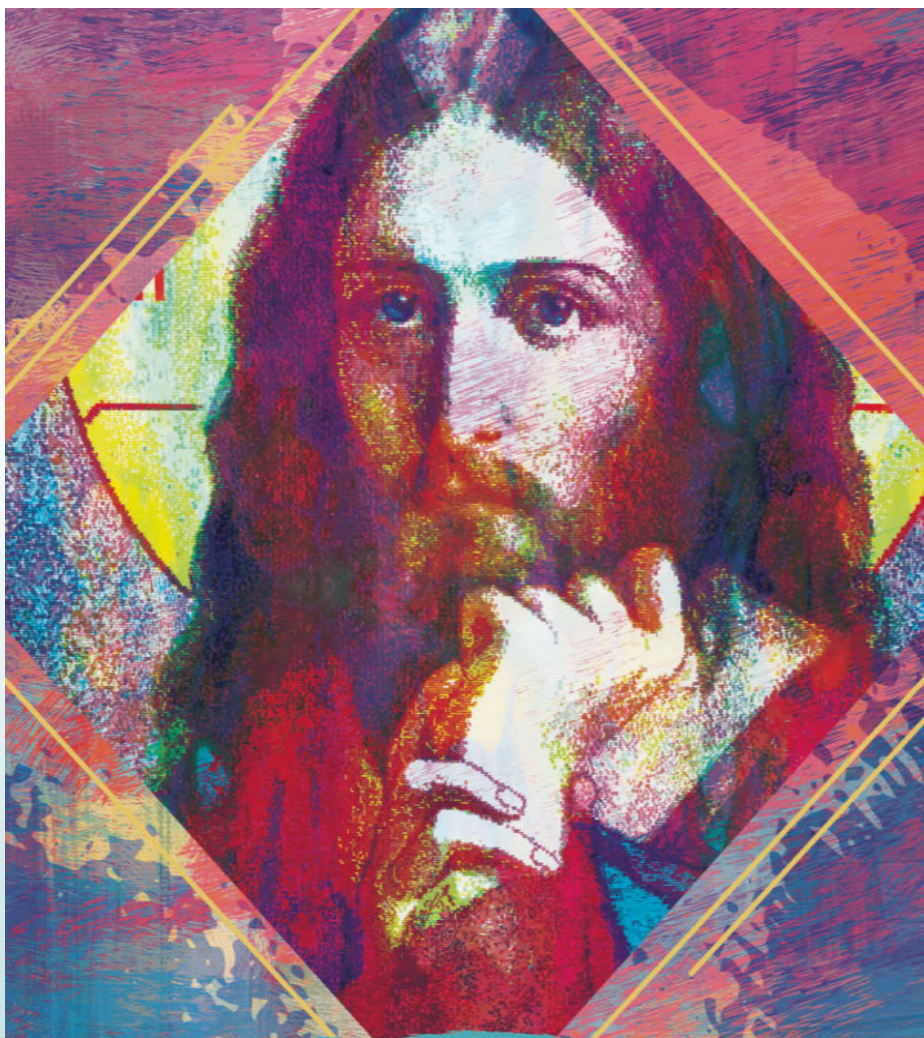

## From The Pastor's Desk

### - Treasure Seekers -

#### **Alexander the Great: He led many military campaigns and created one of the largest empires ever.**

He did this all while he was about 30 years old and then the great Alexander fell gravely ill.

While he was on his death bed, he thought of the vast empire he had built, each and every spoils of war he captured and the might of his military machine. He went into depression, realizing nothing was worth it as even after an extremely successful life he could not avoid death. More than seeing all that wealth, he simply wanted to see his mother for the last time before he departed, but he knew he would not be able to do it and would soon pass away.

So he called in his Generals and made three last wishes before dying.

"My first wish is that my doctors should alone carry my coffin.

My second wish is that the path towards my grave shall be strewn with gold, silver and all the precious possessions in my treasury.

My third and last wish is that both my hands shall be kept dangling out of my coffin."

Curious about such strange requests the Generals asked Alexander what the point of these wishes might be, to which he responded:

"I want my doctors to carry my coffin to let know that no doctor can cure anybody. They are powerless and cannot save a person from the inevitability of death.

To strew gold, silver and other precious stones on the way to the graveyard, to let the people know that though I spent all my life accumulating riches, not even a grain of gold will come with me when I leave this world. It is a sheer waste of time, energy, and peace of mind when one yearns to be rich.

Having my hands dangling out of the coffin, I want people to know that I came empty handed into this world and likewise will go empty handed from this world."

I am sure we have all had those sandcastle moments in life...having put forth so much effort into something, maybe the accumulation of wealth only to see it so quickly disappear. Perhaps in the form of astronomical medical bills...have I worked hard all my life only so that I can afford to die?

As we hear Jesus warn today...though one may be rich one's life does not consist of possessions...what then does life consist of...especially since it always ends in death? What are those treasures that matter most to God that we are to accumulate with the little time we have in this world?

How many of you when looking at a coffin or burial urn

would compare them to a treasure chest? In them lie what was once a person...who had a family, a job, so many memories but who appears to be no more. Do we not instinctively crave permanence? Do we not long for more life, better life and not less and worse? And yet nothing seems more cruel than the all too quickly passing of time and the unstoppable aging and growing infirmity process and it frustrates us...angers us...makes us anxious. And it is then we must heed the advice of Saint Paul: Think of what is above not of what is on earth.

Our bodies are treasure chests, but we must not allow ourselves to get to the end of our lives and have our hearts, minds and souls empty of what matters most to God. And what matters or rather who matters most to God is Jesus Christ, and how full are our lives of Christ.

As much as I love sports...really love sports...I continue to be amazed at all the non-stop Sport talk shows there are. Can you imagine if people put in even half the time they spend on their fanaticism with sports, politics, social media, Netflix into growing their faith, this planet would be more than Heaven than even Heaven itself, well almost.

What matters most to God, that should be the compass point we follow each morning we have been given the grace to see and live another day. If people do not want God in this life, they will not want Him in the next life so with that in mind...taking it to heart so as to fill the soul with the enduring possessions of faith, hope and love, we must lest we die and remain dead: "put to death those parts of us that are earthly...immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire and the greed that is idolatry...stop lying to one another since you have taken off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self which is being renewed for knowledge, in the image of the creator."

And rather than a depressing image of the empty dangling hands of the deceased Alexander, let us rejoice and savor that moment when extending our hands we receive the Body of Jesus Christ and then consuming Him, allow Him to fill our souls and our whole lives with the power and strength of His renewing love. Being in possession of Jesus Christ, we do have it all, both here on earth and forever in Heaven.
