## From The Pastor's Desk

### - The Most Valuable Treasure -

### This week the Church celebrates the life of Saint Clare of Assisi on August 11th.

She was one of the first followers of Saint Francis who like him, founded a religious order of the Poor Ladies or Poor Clares. Like Francis despite coming from a distinguished and wealthy family, she renounced that wealth in favor of a greater treasure...Jesus Christ.

There is no greater treasure in all the world than the Holy Eucharist...none! And yet entrusted to us, how many share this infinite wealth, share it for the benefit of others who are utterly destitute of spiritual, mental, emotional, and physical health, as though we were refusing them desperately needed medical care.

The Eucharist must be our treasure as this incident from the life of Saint Clare so powerfully captures and instructs.

Once, during an enemy attack against Assisi, a city beloved of the Lord, the Saracen army entered through gates of Assisi, and massed like bees, the fierce Saracens invaded San Damiano, entered the confines of the convent and even the very cloister of the Nuns. The women were in terror as they called out to their Mother, St. Clare.

With a fearless heart, St. Clare commanded them to lead her, sick as she was, to the enemy, preceded by a silver and ivory case in which the Body of the Saint of Saints was kept with great devotion. From the case she produced a Monstrance where the Holy Eucharist is placed/exposed, during every First Friday for example, for the people to adore Christ.

And prostrating herself before the Lord, she spoke plaintively to her Christ: "Behold, my Lord, is it possible that Thou wouldst deliver into the hands of pagans Thy defenseless servants, whom I have taught out of love for Thee? I pray Thee, Lord, protect them who I cannot now save by myself." Suddenly a voice resounded in her ears from the Monstrance: "I will always protect you!"

Then the virgin, raising a face bathed in tears, comforted the sisters: "I assure you, daughters, that you will suffer no evil; only have faith in Christ."

Upon seeing the courage of the sisters, the Saracens took flight and fled back over the walls they had scaled, unnerved by the strength of the sister whom they saw praying, holding the Monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament aloft for all of them to see and quake with terror. More than a story to tell, that same presence, that same power is given to us.

As we heard from today's first reading: "For in secret the holy children of the good were offering sacrifice and putting into effect with one accord the Divine Institution", referring to the Passover, however; we have the greater Passover. The greatest offering in fact in our possession to offer to God the Father on behalf of ourselves, those we love and the entire hurting world, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass...Jesus Christ the true Lamb of God.

The Psalmist says today Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own, and we are his own, we are His treasure.

And there is no more mighty work than the Eucharist which empowers us with that same love that created an entire universe, that same love which conquered all sin, suffering and death...the Resurrection. For where your heart is so shall your treasure be and where is the heart of God, it is in a human body just like our own except glorified...there, the Incarnation and Resurrection remind us that there is nowhere on earth, more so than in any Church, Christ most prefers to dwell than in us, like a child prefers to dwell home with his or her family, if only we do not evict Him by way of the awful sin of sloth.

Sloth is one of the seven deadly sins which today may be the most prominent sin committed amongst Christians. Sloth becomes a sin when it depletes the energy we must expend in using the means to salvation.

In other words, sloth refers to that attitude Christ mentions at the conclusion of today's Gospel, that despite all the treasures given to one, one could hardly care less, it's spiritual indifference, apathy, the worst ingratitude there is...much will be required of the person entrusted with much...and as Catholics we have been entrusted with everything by way of the Holy Eucharist, a word that means to give thanks.

When it is announced that one is to be a parent and then when holding that child in one's arms for the first time there is incredible joy, and so we must maintain and cultivate the joy given to us by way of the Holy Mass and the Holy Eucharist. Yes, as any parent will tell you, there is great responsibility, great sacrifice required in raising a family, but there is nothing more worth it, nothing that requires more love to do so and the love without end needed to accomplish that is ours, entrusted to us by way of the Holy Eucharist.

Let us then allow Christ to transform our hearts into the shape of a Monstrance, so that as Saint Clare did, He may show us to the world, so the devil and his legions may turn tale and run, that offering the Christ we receive consistently in Holy Communion may bring healing and conversion to those we pray for...extinguish the fires of hell that seem to be raging out of control all over the world especially here in this country.

We have the remedy...the Holy Eucharist...the greatest most valuable treasure there is, please share the wealth and encourage others to do so.


