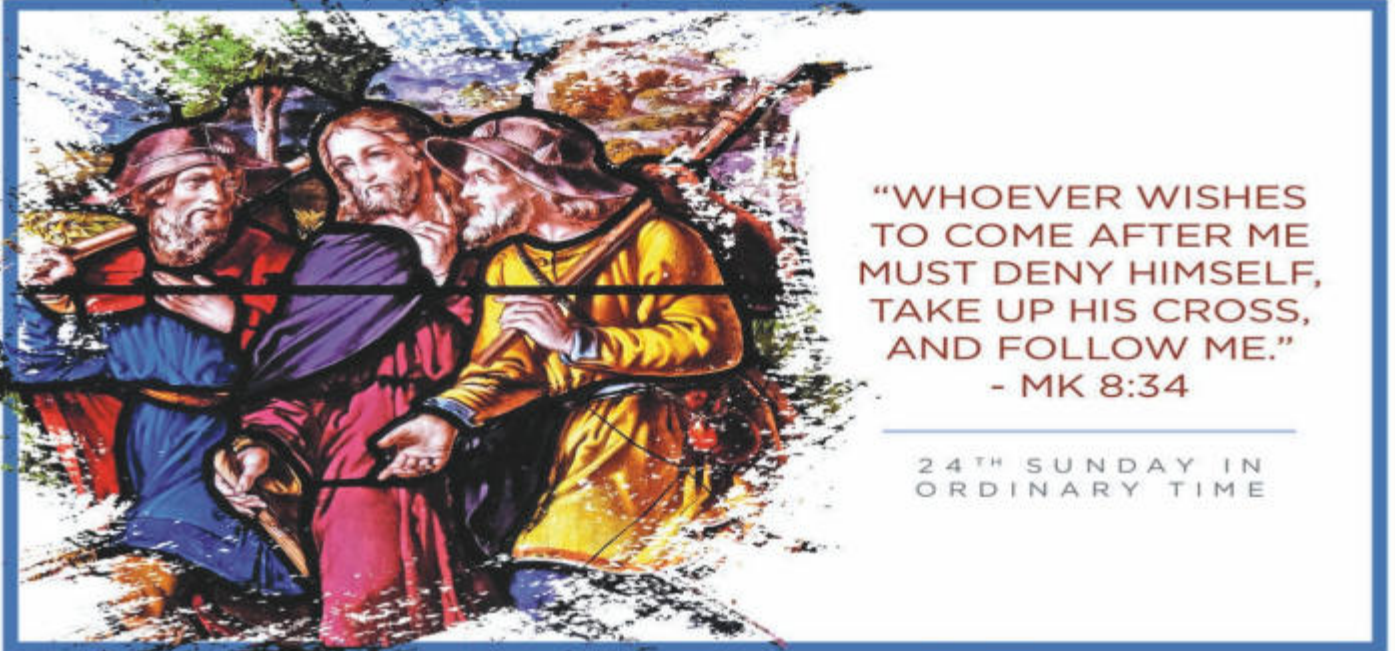

“ADOPT A STUDENT”

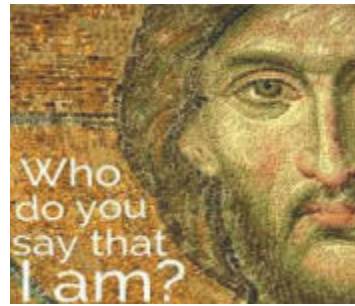

In person or online, schools have welcomed all students to the start of another academic year. There is an obvious connection with the opening of schools and today's gospel for Christ is here to be our teacher.

Jesus asks two questions: “Who do people say that I am?” and “Who do you say that I am?” The disciples of Jesus included four fishermen and one tax collector. These occupations provided opportunities to hear the marketplace reactions of people who wondered who Jesus might be. They linked Jesus to John the Baptist whose preaching was well known. Jesus' reputation was an honorable one to be associated with such venerable spiritual leaders. The second question – “Who do you say that I am?” is answered by Peter: “You are the Christ.” In Greek the term “Christ” means “messiah.” The messiah would regain the superiority that Israel knew in the olden days. The messiah would lead the people.

How disappointed the disciples, especially Peter, were when Jesus warned them not to broadcast his title. Peter does not hesitate to challenge Jesus, to rebuke him. Peter left a lucrative job as a fisherman to follow a leader whose destiny was doom and death. Peter anticipated profit not persecution, success not failure. Peter's rebuke convinced Jesus that his disciples had much to learn about his mission. Jesus would have to teach them that “the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.” He had to teach them the hard truth that “If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.”

What kind of Christ do we want? Is he a leader who is willing to let us plot our own course, or is he the one who says “Follow me?”

His cross is the most constant and recurring image we have of the one who comes week after week at Mass to teach us his principles and priorities. He will review and renew his immense suffering for us. He will not just tell us the meaning of those words – “rise after three days” – he will share his resurrection from the dead

The day will begin with a special prayer for God's strength, and an uplifting message from Father Bob Longobucco, Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia. From this morning prayer, the day will continue with time to reflect more deeply on the gift of God's hope, led by Bob McCarty, well-known national presenter and former director of the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry. Finally, the day will conclude with a Holy Hour and a recommitment to "go announce the Gospel of the Lord!"

CURRENT COVID PROTOCOLS

The Diocese recently issued new recommendations from the Bishop's Office that state: "Regrettably, several of the counties of our diocese are experiencing a substantial uptick in COVID cases. Out of an abundance of caution, and consistent with CDC recommendations, our parishes may want to consider re-instating masking protocols. At the Pastoral Center (Bishop's Office) we are asking all personnel to wear a mask upon entering the building, in all common areas, and when social distancing is not possible, regardless of one's vaccination status. We further encourage all to do their part to stop the spread by washing their hands frequently, sanitize their workspace regularly and social distance when possible."

Respectfully, we ask that all follow the recommendations of the Diocese that strongly recommend and encourage the wearing of face masks (by all—including those who have been fully vaccinated) whenever we are inside church. In addition, we encourage the use of hand sanitizers and ask that all continue to follow the directions of the ushers.

Unless you are arriving with a group or are part of a family we ask that you choose your seating in order to maintain a respectful distance from others. When possible, try to maintain a safe distance by leaving an empty pew between groups. Ushers will be glad to assist you in locating appropriate seating (this may include utilizing seats upstairs).

For the distribution of communion— all should proceed in lines down the aisles toward the front of the church beginning with the front pews and moving toward the back. Please try to maintain a safe distance. Fully vaccinated people (including Eucharistic ministers, if they desire) need not wear a mask. Those wishing to receive "in the hand" should approach the Eucharistic minister who will be standing at the head of the aisle, reverently receive communion and then return to your seat. Those wishing to receive "on the tongue" - upon reaching the head of the aisle may step to one side and proceed to the altar rail where they may kneel and wait for the Eucharistic minister assigned to the altar rail to approach them to offer communion. Reverently receive communion and then return to your seat. Move slowly, respecting others, and maintain as safe a distance as possible given the width of the aisles. This process may take a bit longer. We want everyone to stay safe and healthy.

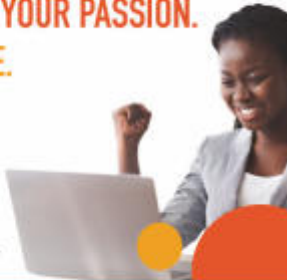
