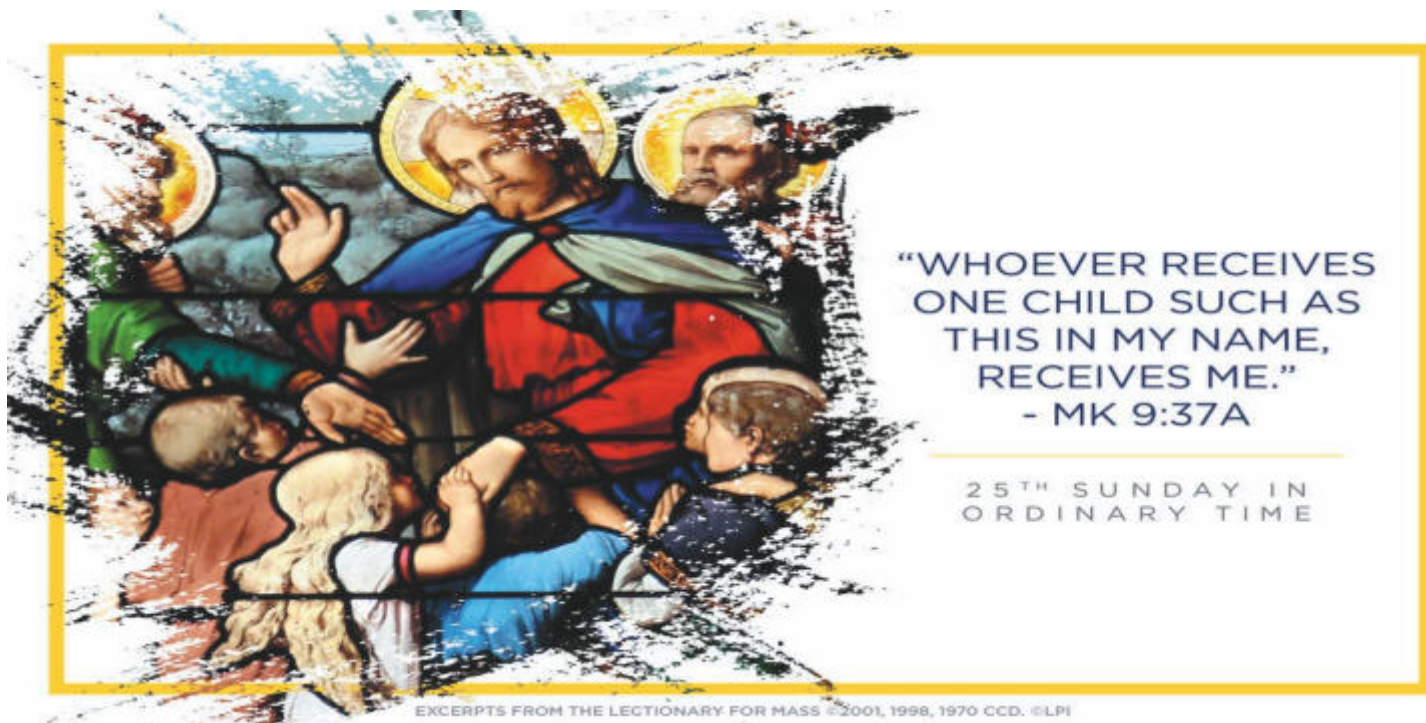

In last week's gospel Peter identified Jesus as the Messiah and Son of the Living God. But what Jesus' disciples fail to understand is that Jesus' messiahship will never be mistaken for a successfully run campaign. The Lord's disciples have missed the truth of Jesus' life and message. Today, they are "discussing among

themselves on the way who was the greatest." The answer to the disciples' question of "greatness" comes when Jesus places a child in their midst. Our Lord invites us, with the child, to see this child as a model of godly life. We must be careful or we will find ourselves, with the disciples, also misunderstanding Jesus. We might see Jesus placing a child in our midst as a sign of innocence over the cynicism as a sign of true discipleship. When Jesus places a child in the midst of the disciples, he wants us to see something more. In Jesus' day childhood was not seen as a time of innocence. Childhood was not something to be savored. It was meant to be grown out as quickly as possible. Children in the ancient world were not highly regarded. They lacked the status and prestige given to "real people." When Jesus offered *childhood* as a model of discipleship, the disciples were probably shocked. An insignificant child is named Jesus' official representative. Someone regarded as "less than human" is chosen as our Lord's ambassador, received as Jesus himself. We may feel sorry for the disciples because they just don't get it and we, ourselves, remain confused. The world God intends is not found in striving and strength but in the grace of the Lord's own choosing of us in our weakness. Prestige, power and well-placed positions among the important are tempting. Jesus shows us a different world. The disciples and all of us gathered around the Lord are not welcomed because we have said or done the right things to receive the credentials and be welcomed by Jesus. We are welcomed through the grace of God.

CONSECRATION TO ST JOSEPH

Bishop Edward B. Scharfenberger is inviting everyone to join him beginning September 29 in a Consecration to Jesus through St. Joseph. For the faithful who are preparing for the Consecration to St. Joseph, Bishop Ed has chosen Fr. Donald H. Calloway's book *Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father*. The daily reading takes only 3-5 minutes and then is pondered during the rest of one's day. If you start the readings late or fall behind, don't worry, just catch up when you can. The preparation can be done alone or in a group. It concludes on November 1 at 5:15pm in the Cathedral with mass and the consecration. PERSONAL CARE CLOSET COLLECTION

Historic St. Mary's is participating in a **Personal Care Closet** drive for Catholic Charities Care Coordination Services during the month of October. Your assistance will help in filling unmet needs for their clients living with HIV/AIDS and/or other chronic illnesses including substance use and mental health who they serve throughout all of their programs. Clients served by Catholic Charities Care Coordination Services generally have a fixed, limited income. Once basic needs are met, they have little or no money left for other necessary items such as personal care products, cleaning, and laundry supplies. The **Personal Care Closet** provides these types of items that cannot be purchased with food stamps and are not usually available through food pantries or other sources and are difficult to obtain for free or reduced cost. Please consider making a donation anytime during the month of October. A bin will be available near the main door. Your assistance is appreciated. Call Holly in the office for more details.

CURRENT COVID PROTOCOLS

The Diocese recently issued new recommendations from the Bishop's Office that state: "Regrettably, several of the counties of our diocese are experiencing a substantial uptick in COVID cases. Out of an abundance of caution, and consistent with CDC recommendations, our parishes may want to consider re-instating masking protocols. At the Pastoral Center (Bishop's Office) we are asking all personnel to wear a mask upon entering the building, in all common areas, and when social distancing is not possible, regardless of one's vaccination status. We further encourage all to do their part to stop the spread by washing their hands frequently, sanitize their workspace regularly and social distance when possible."

Respectfully, we ask that all follow the recommendations of the Diocese that strongly recommend and encourage the wearing of face masks (by all—including those who have been fully vaccinated) whenever we are inside church. In addition, we encourage the use of hand sanitizers and ask that all continue to follow the directions of the ushers. The church continues to be completely sanitized after each mass in order to provide a safe environment.

Unless you are arriving with a group or are part of a family we ask that you choose your seating in order to maintain a respectful distance from others. When possible, try to maintain a safe distance by leaving an empty pew between groups. Ushers will be glad to assist you in locating appropriate seating (this may include utilizing seats upstairs).

At our Outreach Center, we move into the month of September looking forward to cooler days and sunshine. We continue to provide pantry meals for those we serve and provide for the many needs of the homeless of Albany who pass through our doors each day. During the month of August, 486 meals were given to our families. During the pandemic, our families welcomed stimulus monies and increased unemployment benefits. Those benefits are now ending and we are seeing people who haven't been in for a while returning to the Pantry. We continue to see new families coming to us. Out of an abundance of caution, we still require all who come to us to wear a mask. The weekly donations brought to Church are always welcome. I am so grateful to our faithful volunteers who have tirelessly come each week to serve the needs of our clients. We could not do it without them. Thank you, our Parishioners for your continued support of this important Ministry at St. Mary's. May God continue to bless you for all that you do for us.

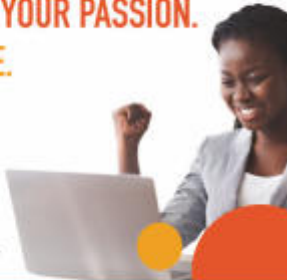
