

"ADOPT A STUDENT"





Sometimes we are unafraid to declare that our neighbors and fellow parishioners are not really giving glory to God because they are not acting as we think they should. Often we think to ourselves, "I may not understand God's

workings completely, but I can certainly determine where God is working and where God is not!"

In the first reading Joshua didn't want to believe that God could work through Eldad and Medad, who were not left out when it came to glorifying God. The disciples of Jesus thought like that. They didn't want to believe that God could work through someone who hadn't received their own seal of approval, and so they made quite a fuss about the strangers who was casting out spirits in the powerful name of Jesus.

Both Joshua and the disciples were guilty of throwing roadblocks in the path of God as God made the divine glory known among God's people. We are guilty of doing the same when we insist that God can act only in ways that God has revealed to us, when we think that we have a monopoly on God's grace or an exclusive recipe for producing Christian character. We make others stumble over our roadblocks when we say and act in certain ways through our words and actions.

Neither Joshua nor Jesus' disciples received praise for such thinking, and we can't expect to receive any reward for it either. But Jesus does tell us that those who give even a drink of water to his disciples will receive a reward. How do we give each other that drink of water? Perhaps by really helping each other to find God working in our lives, even if it means admitting that God may work in ways that we do not fully know or control. The way that God chooses to work in me may be very different from the way that God works in you because we think, speak, act and pray differently. Wonder of wonders, God made us to be different but still accomplishes God's good purpose in all of us. And that means that each of us gives glory to God as God works in us.

CURRENT COVID PROTOCOLS

The Diocese recently issued new recommendations from the Bishop's Office that state: "Regrettably, several of the counties of our diocese are experiencing a substantial uptick in COVID cases. Out of an abundance of caution, and consistent with CDC recommendations, our parishes may want to consider re-instating masking protocols. At the Pastoral Center (Bishop's Office) we are asking all personnel to wear a mask upon entering the building, in all common areas, and when social distancing is not possible, regardless of one's vaccination status. We further encourage all to do their part to stop the spread by washing their hands frequently, sanitize their workspace regularly and social distance when possible."

Respectfully, we ask that all follow the recommendations of the Diocese that strongly recommend and encourage the wearing of face masks (by all—including those who have been fully vaccinated) whenever we are inside church. In addition, we encourage the use of hand sanitizers and ask that all continue to follow the directions of the ushers. The church continues to be completely sanitized after each mass in order to provide a safe environment.

Unless you are arriving with a group or are part of a family we ask that you choose your seating in order to maintain a respectful distance from others. When possible, try to maintain a safe distance by leaving an empty pew between groups. Ushers will be glad to assist you in locating appropriate seating (this may include seats upstairs).
