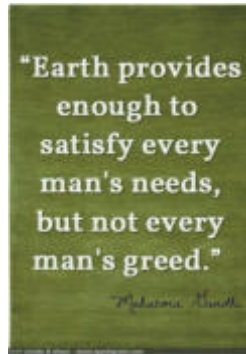
"ADOPT A STUDENT"

St. Mark's gospel is the shortest and probably the first of the gospels to be written down. Yet, St. Mark's writings can easily be distinguished from those of Matthew and Luke because Mark's writing style is filled with details.

One detail found only in Mark is that Jesus "looked at the man and loved him." This is the only place in Mark where Jesus is said to love anyone. It's not said of Mary, Peter or anyone else.

Just this man, no longer a youth, who runs up to Jesus, kneels down before him and questions what he must do to inherit eternal life. Mark leaves little doubt that Jesus loves this man because Jesus not only tells him the one thing he must do – sell what he has and give it to the poor – but Jesus also invites the man to join him. He receives the same invitation that the apostles had: "Come, follow me." We are told the man doesn't. With typical detail Mark says that "his face fell and he went away sad for he had many possessions.

How about us? Jesus looks at us today with love. He promises us eternal life if we help the poor and don't let our rich possessions come between us and him. Next weekend, World Mission Sunday, we'll have the opportunity to share our wealth with Catholic missionaries worldwide. They, in turn, will use our money to help the poor for whom they are now giving their lives in the hope of bringing them to Jesus.

These are perilous time for missionaries, especially in far-off places where the followers of Jesus are few in number and influence. Each year the Holy See publishes a "roster of martyrs," those religious who have been assassinated in the past year simply because they are followers of Jesus. The total number is astonishing.

We must not forget what we heard Jesus promise Peter and the other apostles in today's gospel – each of whom would die a martyr – that those who leave their homeland and families for his sake and the sake of the gospel will face persecution. Jesus also promised them "eternal life in the age to come," just what the rich man sought guidance for when he knelt before the Lord.

Mark also writes that the disciples were amazed when Jesus told them that it is hard for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God. They were not the destitute poor. Most of us might feel a bit uneasy each time we hear these words of Jesus because we may have a sufficiency of possessions and financial security as well. If we are generous to the poor, we need not be anxious.

BE A PRAYER PARTNER WITH POPE FRANCIS

For those who have made the commitment to pray every day for the monthly intentions of Our Holy Father, Pope Francis: For October he asks that we pray for **Missionary Disciples:** We pray that every baptized person may be engaged in evangelization, available to the mission, by being witnesses of a life that has the flavor of the Gospel.

CURRENT COVID PROTOCOLS

The Diocese recently issued new recommendations from the Bishop's Office that state: "Regrettably, several of the counties of our diocese are experiencing a substantial uptick in COVID cases. Out of an abundance of caution, and consistent with CDC recommendations, our parishes may want to consider re-instating masking protocols. At the Pastoral Center (Bishop's Office) we are asking all personnel to wear a mask upon entering the building, in all common areas, and when social distancing is not possible, regardless of one's vaccination status. We further encourage all to do their part to stop the spread by washing their hands frequently, sanitize their workspace regularly and social distance when possible."

Respectfully, we ask that all follow the recommendations of the Diocese that strongly recommend and encourage the wearing of face masks (by all—including those who have been fully vaccinated) whenever we are inside church. In addition, we encourage the use of hand sanitizers and ask that all continue to follow the directions of the ushers. The church continues to be completely sanitized after each mass in order to provide a safe environment.

Unless you are arriving with a group or are part of a family we ask that you choose your seating in order to maintain a respectful distance from others. When possible, try to maintain a safe distance by leaving an empty pew between groups. Ushers will be glad to assist you in locating appropriate seating (this may include seats upstairs).

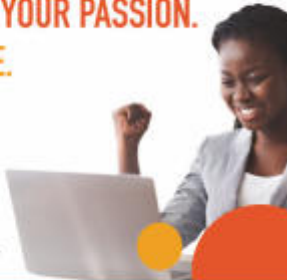
