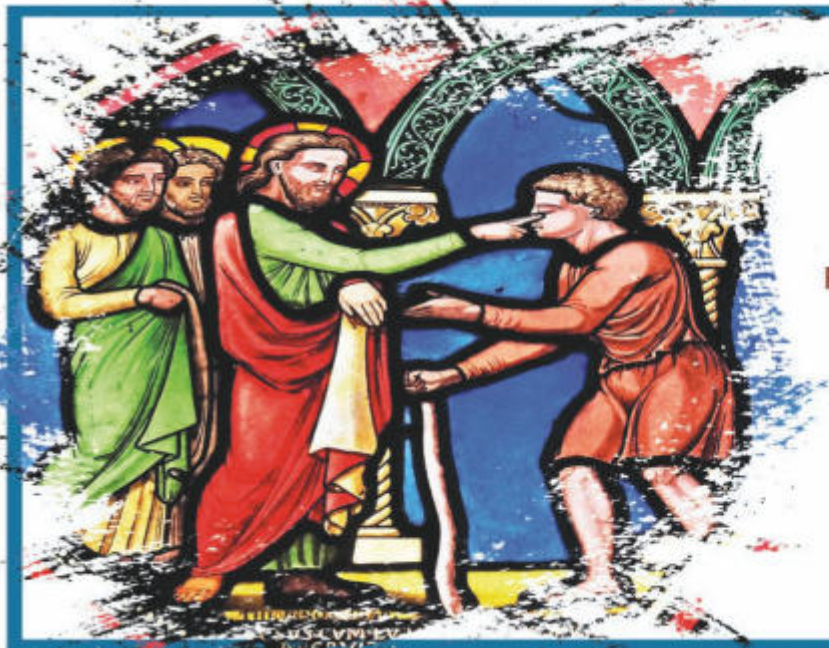

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY



On World Mission Sunday we Catholics, who have not left the comfort and security of our own homes to bring the message of Jesus to "all the world," are asked to support by our financial generosity those clergy, religious and lay persons who are doing so.

Even more, we are reminded to encourage them by our prayers. It is most appropriate that prayer should be the special theme.

First, prayer should be very *personal*. Our deepest self should be engaged in any praying we attempt. It is not enough to simply recite formula prayers such as the Rosary without any personal reflection or involvement. Prayer is an act of human communication. It involves both giving and receiving. It demands both talking, pondering, listening and responding.

Second, our prayer should be *perennial*. It should be constant and year long. Many spiritual authors have suggested ways of constant, conscious prayer.

Third, our prayer should be *persistent*. Jesus stresses again and again that nothing is too trivial or too worldly to be an object of our prayer requests. In a parable Jesus tells his disciples that we should be persistent in our prayer requests – "call out night and day," until God answers our prayers.

On this World Mission Sunday we know that we, too, by our prayer life, as well as by our donations this weekend, can help bring the person and message of Jesus both to our families and neighborhoods and to the far corners of the earth. Let our prayers for these missionaries and our loved ones always be personal, perennial and persistent. Our prayers will be heard as Jesus promises us they will.

PERSONAL CARE CLOSET COLLECTION

Historic St. Mary’s is participating in a *Personal Care Closet* drive for Catholic Charities Care Coordination Services during the month of October. Clients served by Catholic Charities Care Coordination Services generally have a fixed, limited income. Once basic needs are met, they have little or no money left for other necessary items such as personal care products, toiletries, and laundry supplies. The *Personal Care Closet* provides personal care products, toiletries, and laundry supplies. these types of items that cannot be purchased with food stamps and are not usually available through food pantries or other sources and are difficult to obtain for free or reduced cost. While enjoying the Fall days which are upon us, we, in the pantry, are now preparing for the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. I am happy to report that we will be able to give both Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners to our families. Out of an abundance of concern for all, we will again be giving our families gift cards from either Walmart or Target to the children. We would like to be able to give the cards to parents when we distribute Thanksgiving food so that they have time to shop for the special gift their children desire. Our request is for \$25.00 gift cards to either store being accepted by December 5th.. During the month of September, 234 meals were given to our families. Thank you, our Parishioners for your continued support of this important Ministry at St. Mary’s. May God continue to Bless you for all that you do for us.

CURRENT COVID PROTOCOLS

The Diocese recently issued new recommendations from the Bishop’s Office that state: “Regrettably, several of the counties of our diocese are experiencing a substantial uptick in COVID cases. Out of an abundance of caution, and consistent with CDC recommendations, our parishes may want to consider re-instating masking protocols. At the Pastoral Center (Bishop’s Office) we are asking all personnel to wear a mask upon entering the building, in all common areas, and when social distancing is not possible, regardless of one’s vaccination status. We further encourage all to do their part to stop the spread by washing their hands frequently, sanitize their workspace regularly and social distance when possible.”

Respectfully, we ask that all follow the recommendations of the Diocese that strongly recommend and encourage the wearing of face masks (by all—including those who have been fully vaccinated) whenever we are inside church. In addition, we encourage the use of hand sanitizers and ask that all continue to follow the directions of the ushers. The church continues to be completely sanitized after each mass in order to provide a safe environment.

Unless you are arriving with a group or are part of a family we ask that you choose your seating in order to maintain a respectful distance from others. When possible, try to maintain a safe distance by leaving an empty pew between groups. Ushers will be glad to assist you in locating appropriate seating (this may include seats upstairs).

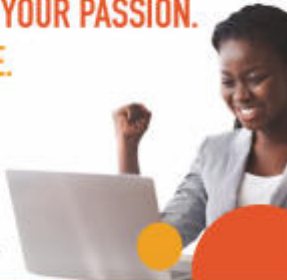
