

SPIRITUALLY ADOPT A BABY TODAY

On January 22, 1973 a court decision was rendered which legalized abortion throughout the entire nine months of pregnancy. This decision, Roe v. Wade, is the reason over 1 million abortions have been committed in the U.S. each year. To help stop the anti-life push around the world, the late Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen encouraged the spiritual adoption of an unborn child. This is done by praying that the one particular but unknown child's life be spared abortion and be allowed to continue to live.

To help accomplish this, it was recommended an individual say the following daily prayer for a period of nine months.

"Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of [baby's name] the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion."

Your prayers CAN make a difference between whether a baby will be born...or aborted. Your prayers can also be a form of spiritual support for both of the parents. Please share the love of life given to you by the Lord of all life and join in spiritually adopting a baby.



The media has produced in us the belief that each one of us has the right to be, to have or to experience what some other person is, has or experiences.

Obviously, we discover that this is not possible. Envyng others leads to pain and feelings of resentment. As a result, a person can move to the second level, that of wanting to take away from others the advantages they have over us. Consequently, to prevent violence we must first deal with the sin of envy.

It's hoped that you will be able to see that there is a connection between Our Lord's baptism, our baptism and envy. A person who is fully aware of one's own personal gifts, one's own dignity, one's own calling and vocation will not suffer from feelings of envy or resentment.

In today's gospel we heard God say, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." Since our baptism identifies us with Jesus, these words are meant to be applied to each one of us as well. As a result of baptism, each Christian is God's chosen, his beloved sons and daughters, with whom he is well pleased. If we look at the baptismal ritual, we will find that after the actual pouring of water there is an anointing with consecrated oil. This anointing makes us sharers in the priesthood of Jesus, in the kingship of Jesus, sharers in the prophetic role of Jesus. Thus, we are priestly people, royal people, we are people called to be prophets.

Part of the rite of baptism is to give the parents a candle, and the parents are told to light this candle each year on the anniversary of their baptism. Celebrating this anniversary is a reminder of the special gifts that make us a special person. Becoming aware of these gifts removes any reason that might make us envious of others. What more can we aspire to than living out as fully as possible our status as royalty, priests and prophets?

Each Christian is singled out to perform a unique function within the body of Christ. We are reminded of this obligation whenever we celebrate the Eucharist because we come here, not just to receive communion, but to grow in union with Jesus, with everyone within these walls, and with all of the human family.

BE A PRAYER PARTNER WITH POPE FRANCIS

NEW DIOCESAN COVID PROTOCOLS

Having conferred with Fr. Flannery, we share the following: Our Bishop has issued a mandate requiring face masks be worn by everyone entering and attending mass at St. Mary's. The Bishop states "since a vaccine verification requirement would be difficult, if not impossible, for churches to implement, we believe the mask mandate is the most efficient option for parishes of the Diocese of Albany. While we realize that this may not be convenient or comfortable, we want to do all we can to ensure the safety of those who celebrate, assist at and attend Mass throughout the remainder of the Advent and Christmas season. This mandate is effective now through February 1, 2022, at which time we will reassess its effectiveness based on public health conditions."

Respectfully, we ask that all (over 2yrs old), including those who have been fully vaccinated to properly wear a mask whenever we are inside church. In addition, we encourage the use of hand sanitizers and ask that all continue to follow the directions of the ushers. The church continues to be completely sanitized after each mass in order to provide a safe environment.

At this time, we will not be checking vaccination status, reintroducing 6 foot social distancing or gathering of information for contact tracing. Therefore, the wearing of masks is that much more important to maintaining a safe environment.

Unless you are arriving with a group or are part of a family we ask that you choose your seating in order to maintain a respectful distance from others and when receiving communion. Ushers will be glad to assist you in locating appropriate seating (this may include seats upstairs).
