

#### **ORDINARY TIME: WINTER**


What do the words Ordinary Time mean? Dorothy Day said, "The words 'Ordinary Time: in our prayer books put me in a state of confusion and irritation. To me, no time is ordinary."

She was right, The Ordinary in Ordinary Time refers to ordinal—counted—time, not to a lack of something celebrate. The Roman document *General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar*, says: "Apart from those having their own distinctive character (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Triduum, and Easter), 33 or 34 weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the Mystery of Christ in all its aspects." (#43)

How do we celebrate "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects"? We gather every Sunday. Sunday is our original feast day. Christians gather on Sunday—the day of Christ's resurrection, the first day of the week—ever since there were Christians.

Each year there are two blocks of Ordinary Time, one in winter between Christmas and Lent, and the other in summer and fall from Pentecost through Christ the King. When we gather on Sundays in Ordinary Time, as always we hear the scriptures proclaimed. We systematically read through the gospels. The first readings from the Old Testament were chosen for their relationship to the gospel passages. The second readings come from the various letter of the New Testament. The mystery of Christ "in all aspects" unfolds.

What is the heart of our Sunday celebration? We do our Eucharist that is we do our thanksgiving. We praise and thank God for all creation, we pray for the whole world, as we remember Christ's life, death and resurrection. We share the bread and wine, the body and blood. We are sent forth to be the body and blood of Christ in the world.



## JESUS' ACTION TODAY

The purpose of an inaugural address is to announce a president's ideals goals at the beginning of the administration and to do so in such a way that those ideals and goals capture the minds and hearts of those who hear it. In announcing his ideals and goals through the prophet

Isaiah, wanted to bring glad tidings to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. Surely, those things would be pleasing to everyone who heard them.

The words of Scripture were fulfilled by Jesus during his lifetime, for at his baptism the Spirit of God empowered him for his lifelong mission to God's people. His Spirit-filled words and deeds would be spirit and life for all in need.

Jesus truly fulfilled the words of Isaiah during his early lifetime. But what about now? How will it be fulfilled in our hearing today? The only way it will be fulfilled is for Jesus to fulfill it in *us*. Today, is there any human need, any need at all, where the saving presence of Jesus is required? If there is, then we have to be there to do the work of Jesus. Jesus has eyes and ears in this world, no hands and feet for service but ours. If we do not make God's favor in Christ seen and heard and felt in this world, it will not be seen or heard or felt here.

Our words and deeds are to be Jesus' spirit and life for all in need today. That is how his mission is fulfilled today in our world. We have been empowered for this service by the same Spirit who empowered Jesus at his baptism

#### **NEW DIOCESAN COVID PROTOCOLS**

Having conferred with Fr. Flannery, we share the following: Our Bishop has issued a mandate requiring face masks be worn by everyone entering and attending mass at St. Mary's. The Bishop states "since a vaccine verification requirement would be difficult, if not impossible, for churches to implement, we believe the mask mandate is the most efficient option for parishes of the Diocese of Albany. While we realize that this may not be convenient or comfortable, we want to do all we can to ensure the safety of those who celebrate, assist at and attend Mass throughout the remainder of the Advent and Christmas season. This mandate is effective now through February 1, 2022, at which time we will reassess its effectiveness based on public health conditions."

Respectfully, we ask that all (over 2yrs old), including those who have been fully vaccinated to properly wear a mask whenever we are inside church. In addition, we encourage the use of hand sanitizers and ask that all continue to follow the directions of the ushers. The church continues to be completely sanitized after each mass in order to provide a safe environment.

At this time, we will not be checking vaccination status, reintroducing 6 foot social distancing or gathering of information for contact tracing. Therefore, the wearing of masks is that much more important to maintaining a safe environment.

Unless you are arriving with a group or are part of a family we ask that you choose your seating in order to maintain a respectful distance from others and when receiving communion. Ushers will be glad to assist you in locating appropriate seating (this may include seats upstairs).
