from the Pastor . . .

I pray that everyone had a safe and blessed Thanksgiving. Even if we could not be together with family as usual, we are connected in spirit. We recall that at every Mass we are united to the whole Church; those worshipping around the world, those suffering in Purgatory, and those reigning in Heaven. We are never alone.

This weekend begins Advent, a beautiful season of anticipation for the great gift of our Savior at Christmas. May we prepare well this year. With Advent, we also begin our Wednesday Adoration schedule. From after morning Mass until Noon, every Wednesday we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Please stop by and visit Our Lord. Even if we can only stop in for five minutes, it's great to pause during the day and put ourselves in God's presence.

The 13th of December, the Third Sunday of Advent, we will continue the tradition of blessing the Baby Jesus statues for your manger scenes. Known as Bambinelli Sunday in Italy (Child Jesus), it's a great opportunity to have us continue to prepare a place in our hearts for the Lord. So, at any of the Masses on the 12th and 13th bring your Baby Jesus statue and I will bless them at the end of Mass.

Speaking of Christmas, our Christmas Mass Schedule is as follows: Christmas Eve 4 p.m., 6:30 p.m., and Midnight. Christmas Day 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. We are adding an 8 a.m. Mass in order to accommodate increased numbers in this uncertain year. Additionally, I would like to ask a favor of you all, especially those that attend the 4 p.m. Christmas Eve. That is usually the most crowded Mass and, while we may have less people this year, we conversely may still have a very large number. I would ask that those who usually go to the 4 p.m. to come on Christmas Day if possible. That way if we have a lot of visitors, there will be more room for them at the Mass that is usually the busiest. On Christmas Day, there is usually lower attendance, so we should be okay then. I understand 8 a.m. Christmas Day isn't ideal with kids opening Christmas gifts, but let's be honest; they'll be up at 5 a.m. anyway and will have awokened you long before 8 a.m. Of course, a lot can

change between now and the 25th. We may be only allowed to have a small number of people in church. But, for now, if we could plan on adjusting our normal Christmas Eve Mass schedule, especially for the 4 p.m., I think that would be helpful. It may turn out that everyone goes to the 8 a.m. and there is no one at the 4 p.m., but with restrictions on capacity I would just hate to have to tell someone on Christmas Eve there's no room for them at the inn. Thank you.

Congratulations to our winner who won our Parish Bazaar 50/50. The total amount was \$10,200, half of which being \$5,100. She graciously decided to gift the money back to the parish. While I don't like pressuring parishioners to do so (if you want to spend it all at the casino that's fine by me), I'm certainly grateful for the gift, especially this year. Thank you so much to everyone who has made this Virtual Bazaar so successful. It's been an odd year, but you've pivoted wonderfully to make things work. Thank you.

To conclude, some words of comfort from St. Thomas Aquinas: "Sorrow can be alleviated by good sleep, a bath and a glass of wine." Yes, you are allowed to get that on a plaque on your wall. Of course, he also said, "The things that we love tell us what we are." And, "How can we live in harmony? First we need to know we are all madly in love with the same God." Let us fall in love with God again and again, and yes, enjoy his good gifts of sleep, a bath, and a glass of wine.

Electronic Giving

Electronic giving (called WeShare) is the preferred way to make your weekly offertory. By giving electronically, it relieves the need for about 6 parishioners to count money every Sunday (about 10 hours total). Furthermore, the parish could eventually save money on envelope printing and mailing and you would not have to write checks. The Finance Council would also be able to budget more efficiently. Tax Free Charitable Distribution

Need a tax break? Congress has permanently enacted qualified charitable distributions from your traditional IRA accounts. These distributions can be used to satisfy all or a portion of your *Required Minimum Distribution* and are free of federal and state income tax. Also, these gifts help you avoid the Medicare high income surcharge and can help reduce your income taxes on your social security benefits.


