

The other day someone wanted me to stop by for the Anointing of the Sick and Confession. They were nervous about doing so, for obvious reasons. But he had a plan. We met in the garage, masked up, and distanced. For anointings, priests currently lay hands on from a distance instead of touching someone's head and for the blessing with oil we use cotton balls dipped in oil, instead of our fingers. The cotton ball is then burned. So, we are taking all the necessary precautions. If you are homebound and are desirous of Confession or Anointing, and are comfortable having me visit, please let me know. Especially with our current ban on Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion visiting people, there are surely many who have gone a long time with the sacraments.

This Tuesday, December 8th, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, patroness of our country, and a Holy Day of Obligation. We have Mass that day at 8:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. Instead of a vigil Mass, we're just having Mass on the evening of the feast. I look forward to seeing you all at Mass as we honor Our Lady.

As I've mentioned before, December 15th is our penance service. As of writing, we will have nine priests, including myself, who will be there. Because I would like to minimize the time we are all together, I'll preach on preparing for confession the weekend before. The actual penance service will be very short and then we'll head directly to individual confession. Most of the confessors will be in the Parish Center classrooms. We will have ushers directing you where to go. We will also post online and email out an Examination of Conscience including how to go to Confession. You are of course welcome to Google one yourself ahead of time to prepare. Whether you go to Confession regularly or it has been many years, do not be afraid. The Lord does not want to punish us; simply to give us his mercy and love. And besides, if you forget something, we priests can help you out. We've done this before. Finally, St. Luke's is adding extra Confession days. These are not penance services with many priests, but simply added

days when the priests from St. Luke's will be hearing confessions. Here is their schedule (NB: all Confessions are 6-7:30 p.m. at St. Andrew's, not St. Luke's). Wednesday, December 9, Thursday, December 10, Wednesday, December 16 and Thursday, December 17.

While we still have a couple donations coming in each week, here are the pretty much final numbers from our deficit reduction: 165 Donors for a total of \$100,827. Once again, I am overwhelmed with everyone's generosity. I didn't expect anything near what we received. It's a testament to your charity. Thank you.

Finally, we have several parishioners in the medical field: in administration, helping patients on the floor, and helping test for Covid. To all those who serve, know of our continued prayers as a parish.

Comfort us, O Lord, for we are like your disciples on the storm-tossed seas, unsettled by what lies ahead.

We turn to You, our Healer and Guide, to still our hearts in our time of need and hear our prayer:

Heal those who are sick with the coronavirus and protect the elderly and most vulnerable.

Give strength to all who tend to our health and wisdom to researchers who work toward a cure. Open our eyes and hearts that we may look beyond our

immediate needs to care for others who need help. Through the Holy Spirit, guide our leaders to make wise decisions for the welfare of all the people they serve.

Grant eternal rest to those who have died from the virus.

May Mary, Our Mother, who has heard our pleas in the storms of our lives,

intercede with her Son, that we may find healing and a prompt end to this illness.

Mary, Star of the Sea, pray for us.

Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior, heal us. Amen.

Second Sunday of Advent

FAITH FORMATION

So, here we are, the Second Sunday in Advent! Last week we were reminded to be watchful...be alert! Advent is a time of waiting. But we associate waiting with impatience, anticipation, and anxiety. Think about all the things we wait for and how we react to those moments. At that red light, in the grocery line, in the doctors office and especially this year, how are we handling the wait for a change in our world. Are we Apathetic or are we Empathetic? Are we lost in our own impatience or are we working to make the struggles easier for others?

We as Christians need to be able to put ourselves in the others "shoes." Can we let the rushed mom in the store in line in front of us because her child is on the brink of tantrum and just needs to be done? We daily have so many opportunities to "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." In preparing to write this column to day I read several awesome articles and they helped my brain tie it all together. I was reminded to try to remember this Advent season we are not only looking forward to the birth of Christ. We also seek Jesus, who was God incarnate in the river Jordan. Through our baptism, we are called to be part of that incarnation as the Body of Christ. We have a role to play. So in the midst of our Advent waiting, these scriptures we read today do comfort us. But they also address a comfort that is BIGGER than our desire to "feel good" around Christmastime. We know that story of Good News. We know about God's love for us and for ALL in God's creation. We have heard it proclaimed again and again. So remember we are called to be the ones who proclaim comfort to others who are suffering--to others who wait. Yes, we know it can be so difficult. Knowing that God is with us won't speed up the lines at the grocery line or ease congestion at the traffic light. But knowing God is with us in the midst of this waiting can ease the impatience, guide the anticipation, and comfort the anxiety in these situations. And as God's faithful people, we, like the prophet, must find our own voices to speak words of comfort and healing and hope to anyone who feels separated or abandoned by God. God will come. God will enter the experience of all who wait. God will bring them peace. And God will bring US peace. So as you work your ways through the weeks of advent just remember in those quiet moments we try to find just whisper **MARANATHA** (Come Lord Jesus) and the wait has meaning! Have an awesome week!



Tax Free Charitable Distribution


Need a tax break? Congress has permanently enacted qualified charitable distributions from your traditional IRA accounts. These distributions can be used to satisfy all or a portion of your *Required Minimum Distribution* and are free of federal and state income tax. Also, these gifts help you avoid the Medicare high income surcharge and can help reduce your income taxes on your social security benefits.

Distributions must be made *directly* from your IRA account to St. Mary Star of the Sea Catholic Church. For questions, contact the parish office at 410-289-0652

Electronic Giving

Electronic giving (called WeShare) is the preferred way to make your weekly offertory. By giving electronically, it relieves the need for about 6 parishioners to count money every Sunday (about 10 hours total). Furthermore, the parish could eventually save money on envelope printing and mailing and you would not have to write checks. The Finance Council would also be able to budget more efficiently.
