

Just a reminder that we are accepting illustrations for our two paschal candles until the 14<sup>th</sup>. Any young person from the parish can submit a design. With Covid, we may not be able to have a big group make the candle; it may have to be a smaller number. But, in any case, it's great to say that we built this ourselves and offer it to the Lord.

It's already the Third Sunday of Lent. This is a good time to take stock of how Lent has been going so far. Perhaps, this has been a fruitful season; perhaps we haven't been as diligent as we would have liked. Well, there's no day like today to recommit ourselves to the Lord. Take a step back, ask for His help during this time, and let's continue to delve into this beautiful season.

A little St. Mary's update. This past Friday the Building Committee did a walk through and punch list with the contractor. The floor is finished, God be praised, and we were going through all the little things that needed to be addressed before we open. Once the contractors are done, we are going to have a day when we get some volunteers and we ourselves do a deep clean of the place and then put back everything that was stored in the choir loft. We then need to replace the sound system. Once that is done, we will basically be good to open. After all we've been through, I'm very reluctant to give a timeline on when I think this will be. Instead, I've listed the steps we need to take to get done. That way no one is disappointed when an opening date comes around and passes us by.

As I think I had mentioned before, when St. Mary's is ready to open the first event will most probably not be Sunday Mass, but an Evening Prayer and tour during the week. I'd like to give people an opportunity to walk through and see the place. With Covid, we may have to restrict the numbers for the Evening Prayer and most likely won't have refreshments (or they would have to be outside and spaced). But we would have it open for a couple hours so that people could file through and take a look.

As far as worshipping there on Sundays, our current numbers should allow for us to have 7 a.m. Mass with no need of making reservations. The first couple of weeks we may have that issue, but we should be okay after that. As the summer gets closer, we'll have to have a discussion about if it should be a) first come first serve or b) a reservation system.

I'm also considering having one of our daily Masses at St. Mary's and perhaps a time (either a few hours in the morning or the afternoon) when the church can be open for people to pop in to visit. My thought is for the visiting time we would need a docket, not simply for security purposes, but to give an explanation of the church if people were interested. I'd hate to have done all this work at the church and then only have it open for an hour on Sunday at a time when many visitors, if we're being honest, aren't awake yet. So, please give me some feedback in terms of having a daily Mass there as well as a day when St. Mary's is open just for people to pop in and see it.

As we get closer to being able to worship at St. Mary's again, I want to thank now (I'll certainly do so again) everyone who has been involved in this project, from the parishioners, to the Building Committee, to the contractors, to Fr. Stanislaw who began this undertaking. Soon(ish) we'll be able to pray once again in the church that started it all for us here in Ocean City. St. Mary Star of the Sea, pray for us.


There is a wicker basket in the entrance of church that has been set up for you to recycle your palms. These palms will be burned in the Easter Vigil Fire. Thank you.

## RCIA ~ THE SCRUTANIES

For the next three Sundays the Elect (Unbaptized members) of the RCIA will participate in the scrutinies. These Rites don't have the most comforting of names. On these days we engage the elect in rites and prayers called scrutinies and exorcisms. The scrutiny is meant not simply to critique and assess readiness—remember that readiness was established at the Rite of Election two weeks ago with the godparents' testimony and Father Solomon's acceptance of the catechumens' names. The purpose of each of the scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect" and "to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, and good" (Taken directly from the RCIA, Rites book 141). The true pastoral sense of this two-fold act of uncovering and strengthening is emphasized in the next sentence of 141: "For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ." At its core, the scrutinies are not about the sinfulness of the elect but about the overwhelming grace of God in Christ. The exorcisms are not fear-laden bouts with Satan but are grace-filled encounters with the healing power of the Spirit. So, although these Rites are directed toward the Elect it is also an invitation for us to take some time and to scrutinize our lives and our relationship with our God! Please continue to hold all of our RCIA in prayer as they each take steps to strengthen their relationship with God and let us remember that we are all called to continuous conversion and follow their example!

## Tax Free Charitable Distribution

Need a tax break? Congress has permanently enacted qualified charitable distributions from your traditional IRA accounts. These distributions can be used to satisfy all or a portion of your *Required Minimum Distribution* and are free of federal and state income tax. Also, these gifts help you avoid the Medicare high income surcharge and can help reduce your income taxes on your social security benefits.
