

At the Saturday 5:15 p.m. Mass on the 20th we will be receiving into the Church Mason Burt Hetherington, Allison Paige Hunter, Philip Littleton, Kristen Littleton, Makenzie Littleton, Tenley Littleton and Sawyer Littleton. Previously baptized Christian in another denomination, they are becoming fully initiated Catholics. This is a very exciting moment, not only for those coming into the Church, but for us all. It's a time to reflect on the gift of Faith and the goodness of God. For some time, those who were already baptized and were desirous of becoming Catholic were encouraged to enter with those also needing Baptism at the Easter Vigil. Now, the direction is to have those already baptized Christian to be received at a normal Sunday Mass. It's an opportunity for the community to welcome them and also to consider: "Is there someone whom I know who might want to be Catholic?" We are blessed to have a great many converts in our parish, people who bring a great energy and love for Christ. Let us continue to pray for God's Will in people's lives, that His voice is heard in their hearts. And, if possible, please come to the Saturday night Mass on the 20th to support the newest members of our Church and our parish.

Just a reminder, Daylight Savings Time is this weekend. If you're reading this on Friday, take note. If you're getting this on Sunday; well, I hope you made it to Mass on time J .

The Holy Father just finished an historic trip to Iraq, the first Pope to do so. Let us pray that his visit will bring not only peace to the area, but warmer relations between Christians and Muslims. Also, may we pray that the many Christians who have left the Middle East in search of peace may, one day, not only be able to return home, but desire to do so, to continue to enrich the ground made holy with millennia of saints.

Keep an eye out for the Easter Schedule of Masses. I'll mention more about this later, but if you've never been to the Easter Vigil, I certainly recommend it. It's the first celebration of the Resurrection and the highpoint of the liturgical year. But more on that later.

This Summer (I know, it's coming so quickly) we are going to continue with our Sunday evening Masses at 6 p.m. I was planning on continuing it at Holy Savior, but someone recently mentioned to me, what about St. Mary's? I'm not opposed to the idea, but there is, of course, less parking. Also, I'm not sure what distancing rules will be in place by then. So, perhaps Holy Savior is most practical. But I am open to suggestions, especially if a lot of people feel strongly one way or the other. Let me know what you think.

“Indeed, man is weakened by an intense influence, which wounds his capacity to enter into communion with the other. By nature, he is open to sharing freely, he finds in his being a strange force of gravity that makes him turn in and affirm himself *above* and *against* others: this is egoism, the result of original sin. Adam and Eve, seduced by Satan's lie, snatching the mysterious fruit against the divine command, replace the logic of trusting in Love with that of suspicion and competition; the logic of receiving and trustfully expecting from the Other with anxiously seizing and doing on one's own (cf. *Gn 3, 1-6*), experiencing, as a consequence, a sense of disquiet and uncertainty.” (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, *Message for Lent 2010*)



God, thank you for sending Jesus to wash away my sins.


Something to Draw

Tax Free Charitable Distribution
