

A happy and blessed Fourth of July to you all. As a nation, we remember the freedom desired and fought for by so many. While this is a day marked now by parties and fireworks, and there's nothing wrong with that, we also recall the danger our Founding Fathers were braving as they declared independence. May we always be grateful for those who fought for a better life for their children and communities and may we continue to honor them by doing the same.

It's good to be back after vacation. I had a relaxing time with family, and it was particularly good to see my sister the Sister who was on her annual two week home visit. I did learn, though, that I can't eat as many desserts as I could when I was younger, but I gave it the old college try.

I was very happy to return, though, especially with the reopening of St. Mary's. While this bulletin goes to print before reopening, but I'm sure it will be a magnificent event. This has been a project and a half, but God has been good throughout. Let me give you an example.

Most sacristies have a vesting case or vesting cabinet in them. It is a piece of furniture that holds vestments, vessels, and the like for Mass. They were often made out of solid oak and were quite durable. Well, in many places, these became discarded over the years, whether in the hustle and bustle after Vatican II, or later down the road. In our parish here with two churches, both vesting cases were missing. For some time, I've been thinking about getting some for our churches. A) They are handy for actually storing these items, but B) with the close of many churches in the Northeast of this country, a lot of these vesting cases were no longer being used or were being destroyed. Because of their size and weight (more on that later) many were simply thrown out.

I don't like the idea that objects created for liturgical use not only become obsolete, but are destroyed. Especially as they still have a very practical use.

So, I started officially looking for a vesting case (or two) and talking to religious goods stores and

contacts one year ago. And the early returns were not good. They are hard to find, expensive to move, and now that the liturgical taste of many younger priests has swung back from that of their immediate predecessors, these cases are becoming increasingly expensive. To have a new one made the same way as the old ones would be around \$5000-6,000.

Through the St. Jude's Shop in Philly, though, we were put in contact with St. Joe's Prep high school that had a vesting case for a very reasonable \$2500 donation. Tony, our able Facilities manager, helped with getting pictures and dimensions. We decided to give it a go. So last Thursday Tony and John Rego (a parishioner and also the contractor for our work on St. Mary's) got into a u-haul at 4:30 a.m. to drive to Philly to meet me and my Dad. We arrived and looked at the case and, let me tell you, it was not small. It was also about an inch from the wall on each side and, we later learned, had hidden screws in it. But with hard work and some added assistance (two of the maintenance men from the school jumped in to help) we were able to load it up and bring it back. When you go to St. Mary's take a look at it. You'll see its size, the wonderful craftsmanship, and its height; it barely fit.

But this adventure of the vesting case is for me a microcosm of this entire project: an exciting idea, a plan that has bumps in the road, but, with God's grace and our good will, it all works out in the end.

Many thanks to Our Lord and His Mother, Star of the Sea, for watching over this project and helping it come to completion. And thank you all for your help, prayers, and patience. It's been quite the ride, but it's been worth it.

GOSPEL MEDITATION -
 ENCOURAGE DEEPER
 UNDERSTANDING OF
 SCRIPTURE

July 4, 2021
14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's all so ordinary that we can easily miss it. The seagulls hunting and diving for mollusks at the beach offer a display of determination and precision as they gather their food for the day. It's simply what these creatures do. Yet, there's a magical artfulness and skill to their work that speaks volumes about the One who breathed life into their being. This is pretty much the way it is with God's presence. God comes in common ways through common things and ordinary people. Sadly, we are so engulfed in our little worlds of order and ideas to notice the beauty and wonder of it all. Many have numbed themselves to the Divine spark at the essence of all life because that's just the way it is. What's so special about it? A sunset is a sunset and a seagull is a seagull. That's precisely what they thought about Jesus too. After all, isn't he just the carpenter's son? What merit can his words possibly have?

If we're looking for God to come in an event that is so dramatic and intense that it knocks our socks off, then think again. When pondering God's relationship with His people and God's action in our lives, we have to go back to the stable and the recurring, creative, unending power of God's presence. It was a quiet, run of the mill kind of night. There was nothing spectacular or extraordinary. To the naked eye, a woman gave birth to a child and there wasn't anything extraordinary to see. We have a hard time understanding God's ordinary-ness. Jesus grew up in an ordinary town, had neighbors and did normal human things. Perhaps that's why we don't always like the Gospel. It doesn't dazzle us with extraordinary things but simply challenges us to take a different look at our ordinary stuff. That makes us uncomfortable. We prefer things as they are. Our lack of faith can even cause us to take offense at what Jesus says and does, dismissing it as folly.

God's life-giving presence continues to sustain that seagull in flight and keep all things in being regardless of whether we have the faith to see and understand this. Our personal agendas, preconceived ideas, misconceptions, and expectations can often cause us to be hardened and blinded to what God is doing or desiring to do. While God continues to do what he has done for all eternity, faith is needed for God's presence to bear fruit. The blinders we wear and the expectations we bring to life can often prevent us from seeing graced moments that radiate with God's graceful presence. They also prevent God's transforming, healing, and hope filled vision for our world from being realized. Without faith, God won't be able to do much for us either.


