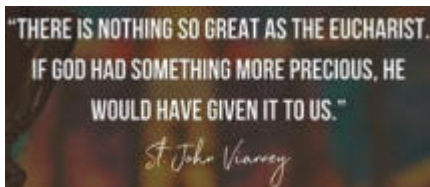

### Proper Reception of Holy Communion

Since Sunday Masses resumed on June 14<sup>th</sup>, I have made an announcement before distributing Holy Communion. I have done this for several reasons. **First**, and most importantly, many have not been properly taught, or they have forgotten, how to properly receive Holy Communion. This is of the utmost importance because what we do affects what we believe. Faith in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is waning. We need to do all we can, therefore, to bolster people's faith in this amazing gift of Jesus' True, Flesh-and-Blood Presence among us. **Second**, I needed to explain how to line up along the altar rail and let you know you have the option of receiving either standing or kneeling. If you are sitting together in the pew, you may kneel/stand together at the altar rail. When you arrive at the first pew, if you are first in line, go to the far end of the altar rail where the kneeler pad begins. Do not stop half-way down. **If you receive Holy Communion in the hand:** 1) Remove your mask before I present the Body of Christ to you. 2) Place your hands one on top of the other, not side by side, and keep them flat. 3) Do not move your hands or your thumbs until I have moved away so as to avoid contact with my fingers. 4) Consume the host immediately; do not walk away with Jesus in your hand.

**If you receive Holy Communion on the tongue**, do not move your head; keep it still and wait for Jesus to come to you. It is much easier while kneeling, so if you are able, please kneel. When I approach you, close your eyes and rotate your head upwards as if you are raising your eyes to heaven. If you keep your eyes open, the tendency is to react as the host is moving toward you, which makes it harder for me to give you Holy Communion. After receiving Holy Communion, it is the ancient tradition of the Church to return to your pew and make an act of thanksgiving, i.e. a prayer of gratitude to God for blessing you with the Holy Bread of Eternal Life. **Third**, I wanted to remind everyone to remain in church until I process out of the sanctuary at the end of Mass.



### **54-day Rosary Novena**

**for Peace in our Nation and for the Upcoming Elections**  
Beginning Saturday, August 15th and ending Wednesday, October 7th, you are invited to join Catholics nationwide who will be praying a 54-day Rosary Novena, petitioning Our Lady's intercession for peace in our nation and for the upcoming elections. The Novena consists of praying five decades of the Rosary each day for 27 days in petition, followed by an additional 27 days in thanksgiving to complete the 54 days. Our Lady appeared in 1884 with the Christ Child in her lap and the Rosary in her hand, together with St. Dominic and St. Catherine of Siena, and gave us this devotion. In these troublesome times, let's pick up our weapon, the rosary, and storm heaven!

### **Ways to Embrace the Immaculate Heart of Mary this August (even with Social Distancing)**

Find the suggestions that are just right for you, depending on whether you're celebrating the re-opening of your church or are under self quarantine.

### **Call Your Mother First Thing in the Morning**

Your Heavenly Mother, that is!! Celebrate the Immaculate Heart of Mary by praying the Fatima Morning Offering daily this month, as it concludes with these words, invoking the Immaculate Heart.

*Precious Blood of Jesus, save us!  
Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us!  
Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!  
Amen.*

### **Pray the Rosary Every Day**

Our Lady of Fatima told us to pray the Rosary every day. In the words of St. Padre Pio: "Some people are so foolish that they think they can go through life without the help of the Blessed Mother. 
## CHANGES TO THE BISHOP'S APPEAL

We want to let you know about a few changes to the annual campaign formerly known as the Bishop's Appeal:

The campaign will now be known as the *Diocesan Appeal* and themed, "For we walk by faith, not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5:7)

- There will no longer be "in-pew" collection of pledges.
- The 2020-2021 Diocesan Appeal will begin with a mailing sent to parishioners from the Roman Catholic Diocese of Albany (RCDA) - Office of Stewardship and Development. You should expect to receive this correspondence between now and early September; it will include a pledge card and envelope.
- Pledges and payments will no longer be processed in the parish office.
- The appeal year runs through June 30, 2021 (rather than ending in March as in the past).
