

JUN 26/27: LIFTING DISPENSATION

Dear Parishioners,

The weekend of June 26/27 commences the return of the Sunday Mass obligation for the faithful in the Archdiocese of Washington. I so look forward to seeing many of you at Eucharist, even without face masks!

St. Peter's Church has been diligent in safety protocols for Mass attendance throughout the pandemic. (We have had zero incidents of viral transmission that I know of, even in the height of the pandemic. Thank you, Lord!) We will continue to be prudent, for instance, setting aside our window seating for those who are unvaccinated or prefer a bit of social distancing. We will adjust protocols as needed as we see the numbers of people who attend Mass and identify safety issues that need to be addressed.

As much as I would love to see the entire faith community assembled again for Mass, I realize that there are individual circumstances that may preclude attendance just now. Here is an excerpt from archdiocesan guidelines that speak to this point:

*"It should be noted that those persons remain dispensed from the obligation who are unable, **for serious reasons**, to attend Mass.*

Serious reasons include, but are not limited to, such things as illness, caring for others, the need to quarantine, or concern for one's health and safety due to chronic conditions. Inclement weather, including extreme heat, can pose health risks for some, while icy conditions could be dangerous for drivers or for the elderly who are in danger of falling. The serious unavoidable requirements of one's work can also excuse from the obligation. Examples like this could go on. But as a venerable principle of Roman Law states: "No one can be obliged to do the impossible."

Those who have questions should consult their pastors and parish priests, who also have the power to dispense and commute the obligation in individual cases."

I would only add that we are a spiritual family. We need to look out for one another, and act in the best interest of all. Your presence at Mass strengthens and unifies the family. But there are conditions in which your presence could be harmful to yourself, or to the community. So let us be prudent and prayerful as we consider Mass attendance for you or your family. Fr. Brendan and I are happy to converse with you about any of this.

I am on vacation June 21-July 2. I delight in the anticipation of reconnecting with many of you upon my return, especially at the celebration of Eucharist.



St. Peter's Haiti Ministry is offering **online orders** and no-contact delivery for coffee, tea and chocolate. All profits will benefit our twinned parish and school at Notre Dame D'Altigrace parish in Cap Haitien, Haiti. To order, please visit: saintpetersdc-haiti.square.site.

Our food donations support the food pantry of our neighbor parish, Holy Name, 920 11th St NE. **Anytime you come to church, bring donations of non-perishable food** and place them in the crates under the right hand table in the back of the church. Below is a list of basic food items needed.

- High protein foods that require little or no preparation: peanut butter, canned tuna and salmon
- Soups (beef stew, chili, chicken noodle, turkey rice)
- Pasta, rice, brown rice, macaroni and cheese
- Canned pasta sauce (No Glass Containers, please!)
- Multigrain or Honeynut Cheerios, Raisin Bran
- Dried foods: lentils, beans, oatmeal, grits
- Canned fruits, vegetables, sauces, and juices
- Baby supplies: diapers, wipes, infant formula (canned or powdered)

- St. Peter volunteers will deliver the coffee for orders within a 2-mile radius of the church. If you need delivery outside that area, contact Beth Martin at elizbmartin@gmail.com. Please use "Fair Trade for Haiti" in the subject line.
- **There will be no pick-up at the rectory or the church.**
- We usually deliver on the weekends. Orders must be in by **Thursday at 5pm** to assure delivery on the following Saturday or Sunday.
- Orders are limited to 10 items total so our volunteers can carry them easily.


SJ: Good Neighbors Capitol Hill (GNCH)

St. Peter's concern for social justice reaches worldwide! We provide support to Notre Dame d'Altagrace (our sister parish in Haiti); and our membership in Good Neighbors Capitol Hill (GNCH) allows us to collaborate with seven other neighborhood congregations to assist with the resettlement of refugee families. These particular refugees come here through a special visa program, and often they come with only with the clothes on their backs! The GNCH website (www.goodneighborscapitolhill.org) includes compelling stories about the program, especially about the resettlement of families coming from Afghanistan.

GNCH has just finished furnishing its 58th apartment—this time for a family of eight (two parents and six children ages 1 to 17). For each apartment, donors provide furniture, accessories, and all the other items that go into furnishing a home. What has impressed the St. Peter's parishioners involved with GNCH is how welcoming GNCH has made these apartments by providing many lovely touches in addition to the basic furnishings and provisions.

During the month of June, St. Peter's will focus on providing cleaning supplies for the resettled families. And you can help! Just as many parishioners do for SOME, you can collect and place cleaning supplies into Ziplock bags for delivery to our new neighbors. Please select from this list of supplies several items you can fit into a **gallon** bag: dishwashing soap (*not dishwasher detergent*), cleanser, glass cleaner, all-purpose liquid cleaner, dishcloths, sponges, dish towels, scrubbies, bottle brushes, and sink stoppers. Be creative about the "cleaning set" you create, and place your bag in the GNCH-labeled boxes in the back of the church throughout June.

You can donate larger items as well: furniture, covered kitchen and bath waste baskets, buckets, scrub brushes, toilet brushes and plungers, vacuum cleaners, mops, brooms, dust cloths, laundry detergent, trash bags, and paper towels. **For more information about donating these larger items, please contact either Lynne Boyle djblkb@aol.com or Kay O'Brien ccobrien723@gmail.com.
