

"As I Walk This Way"

Dear Parishioners,

Happy New Year! As we begin 2022, I would like to share my thoughts on how our two parishes are sharing and growing. Holy Cross and Our Mother of Sorrows is a cluster because they share one pastor. The two parishes are separate financial corporations with distinct accounts. Over the past year and a half, we have made progress in celebrating what is unique to each parish while also working collaboratively. This working together helps to strengthen each parish. Some examples of working together are a young man from OMOS who oversaw and organized the improvement of the landscaping of the Queen of Peace Shrine at HC. A parishioner of HC helps to replenish the vigil candles at OMOS. The two Buildings and Grounds Committees (BGC) regularly share ideas and best practices. For example, since the sound system at OMOS has been updated and the sound system at HC is in the process of being updated, I have asked the two Buildings and Grounds Committees to share ideas and strategies in this process. It was wonderful to see many HC parishioners at the Advent Mission sponsored by OMOS. Parishioners from both parishes were some of the 100+ people who came to the Time of Reconciliation on December 21. We also share an amazing staff and a weekly bulletin. The funeral team from OMOS has come to HC to assist when the need arises.

Our two parish councils have also been meeting together and sharing ways to help strengthen the faith in our community. This collaborative work must continue and to this aim I have set as a goal that this June our cluster will have one parish council, consisting of six members from HC and six from OMOS. Our two councils have begun working toward this goal by sharing monthly meetings and growing in relationship. Any parish council is an advisory body made of parishioners that offer input to the pastor as he leads the parish. A council is not a governing committee but rather a gathering of committed parishioners that work with the pastor in accomplishing the Church's mission. One parish council for our HC/OMOS cluster will help us to continue and build on the collaboration that has begun. I will



What is a Human Person? By Jennifer Lozy-Lester

Who am I? What makes me "me"? Am I my soul/spirit? Am I the sum total of my thoughts and my human will or is there more to me? The answer to these questions forms the basis for how we understand and believe what a human person is from the Catholic perspective. It is the lens through which we see the dignity of the human person from the first moment of conception, through our death, and to our eternal life.

We are both spirit and body. Notice I did not say we "have" both a spirit and a body. This is a big distinction. We do not possess our body – we ARE our body. We are embodied creatures created by God in His image and likeness. When we were created in our mother's womb, what makes us "human" is the gift of our human soul/spirit and the gift of our material body, both of which makes us who we are -ahuman person. Our physical DNA helps to guide the

development and maintenance of our bodies and our spirit/soul is linked to every cell of our human body.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church CCC 364 states, "The human body shares in the dignity of 'the image of

God': it is a human body precisely because it is animated by a spiritual soul, and it is the whole human person that is intended to become, in the body of Christ, a temple of the Spirit. Cf. 1 Cor 6:19-20; 15:44-45: Man, though made of body and soul, is a unity. Through his very bodily condition he sums up in himself the elements of the material world. Through him they are thus brought to their highest perfection and can raise their voice in praise freely given to the Creator. For this reason man may not despise his bodily life. Rather he is obliged to regard his body as good and to hold it in honor since God has created it and will raise it up on the last day. GS 14 § 1; cf. Dan 3:57-80"

Let's rejoice that God gave us his only Son to redeem us and restore us body and spirit in unity together and with Christ. Gratefully, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." John 3:16

Thank you so very much for the hospitality you showed our family this past weekend as we laid to rest our dear uncle, Fr. Thomas H. Wheeland. There is little doubt now as to why Fr. Tom loved the Holy Cross/Mother of Sorrows family so very much.

The viewing and prayer service Friday evening, capped off by the touching sermon of Fr. Dan Holland, served as an intimate way to honor Fr. Tom and allowed us to meet so many of his close friends and parishioners. The stories people shared were sometimes touching and other times humorous, but always sincere. Afterwards, we ventured to the Charbroil for some great food and hospitality. More stories and tears were shared and it seemed as if everyone in the establishment knew Tom.

The funeral Mass was such a beautiful tribute to Fr. Tom and the police honor guard and bagpipers were a sign of respect for a man who had an even higher respect for the men and women in blue. We have never seen mounted police at the entrance of a cemetery before and likely will never again. And the pallbearers literally carried the load and deserve a pat on the back (and a trip to a local chiropractor).

The luncheon at Mr. Dominic's following the burial was so very special. We felt ourselves captured in the warm embrace of Charlotte and again realized that everyone seemingly is related to everyone else. I am not sure that gaining 10 pounds during a funeral weekend is a proper way of mourning the loss of a loved one. But who could resist the cannoli?

Fr. Tom loved being a priest and loved all of you so very much. Fr. Bill said something very insightful as we prepared to leave town after 8 a.m. Mass on Sunday. To paraphrase, "You, the parish family of Holy Cross/Mother of Sorrows, made Fr. Tom Wheeland a better priest." He fed off of your love and faith. Allowing him into your hearts and homes kept him ever connected to his priestly vocation. Besides the presence of God, the transmission of the sacraments requires one person to administer and another to receive. Baptisms, confessions, eucharist, etc. You each gave him a way to serve as that conduit between God and humankind and he was not only a better priest, but a better man because of it.

There are too many to thank and we will be sending out cards over the next few weeks. For now, please accept our warmest thanks and continued commitment to pray for all of you. We are humbled by your love and know, even in Fr. Tom's absence, we still have family in Rochester.


