"As I Walk This Way"


Dear Parishioners,

I wanted to share a portion of my homily from the Baptism of Lord with our entire cluster of HC and OMOS. With the many issues that face our community, our world, our church, our lives, we may begin to ask: "Has God forgotten us?" "Comfort, give Comfort to my people says Your GOD." Isaiah 40:1-5. God's comfort is the assurance of mercy and strength. This message of comfort and healing, is just as needed in our day as it was in days of old.

The Holy Father, Pope Francis has referred to the Church as a field hospital, a place of healing and comfort. The Church exists to extend the mercy, comfort and love of God to the human family! Sadly, we are well aware of the lack of comfort. I am referring to the abuse of minors and vulnerable people in the Church and our community. In response to that sin, we are called to do our best to prevent similar abuse by working together to provide much needed healing and comfort to God's people. This healing and comfort involves all the ministers of the Church working together: clergy, lay people—especially, ushers, greeters, lectors and ministers of Communion.

To our lay ministers: lectors, ushers, greeters and ministers of communion and others: you are the first people seen by those who come to the field hospital, the Church. People tell you things they may not tell me. You see things I do not see. You are the EMT's, nurse's aide, and essential support team in this Field Hospital. You represent the Church and in many ways you are the face of the Church. That is why as ministers of the Church, we are all called to be trained in ways that will help us to identify issues and to verify that we are of sound moral character because we represent something larger than just ourselves. In the same passage, Isaiah continues "Prepare the way of the Lord." Isaiah 40: 9-11 What is the way? In the Gospel of John 14:6, Jesus says, "I am the WAY, the truth and life." The Lord is the divine Physician who provides for each of us, and all our brothers and sisters, the Comfort we find

here in this field hospital, the Church. I pray that our Church and our community will know the comfort that comes from the Lord. Peace to you! In Christ,




At OMOS we have reached the CMA goal. Thank you to all the 463 OMOS parishioners who have helped to meet this milestone!




