Dear Parishioners –



Many years ago, I had to go to summer school to catch up on math. It was warm with no air conditioning and involved a bit of hard work. It wasn't much fun. This past week we had school at St. Jane's and it was fun for all involved. It was Vacation Bible School. I attended just two of the sessions but couldn't get over how enjoyable it was for the 31 children enrolled, our teen aged mentors and adult supervisors. The final evening was full of life, enthusiasm and joy. Many thanks to Melissa and all who helped make it the highlight of our summer.

Over the past few months we had the sad duty to announce the closing of St. Jane Frances Preschool. Since then, people have inquired about the future of the school building. Immediate plans call for it to be used for Parish meetings, Religious Education classes, and Youth Ministry meetings, etc. In addition to parish functions, there will be an Independent Catholic school that will rent some of the classrooms for just one year. In addition to the changes in the school building, a daycare center will rent half of the Parish Center during the current year.

The parish itself remains strong and vibrant. Even though attendance was down as was the offertory, our cost cutting measures and the generosity of so many parishioners signing up for Electronic Fund Transfer donations have left us in a good financial position which will be disclosed in the bulletin when the financials are completed in the next few weeks. Thank you ever so much.

Each year at Mass our gospel readings concentrate on one of the three synoptic (seen in a similar way) gospels. One year it's Matthew; another year it's Luke; and this year it's Mark. So what happened to John's gospel? Since Mark's gospel is the shortest, during his year, there are a number of weeks that we hear from John. As a matter of fact, this week and the following 4 weeks will center on John's gospel and concentrate on Jesus' "Bread of Life" discourse. As the Catholic Church embarks on this year of the Eucharist, there is no better way to begin than chapter 6 of John's gospel.

Today we hear the familiar story of Jesus feeding the 5,000 people on just five loaves and two fish. The reading from 2 Kings also speaks of God's miraculous feeding of a crowd. These passages remind us that nothing is impossible for God, and that He wants to feed His people. Add in Psalm 145, and you see the overall message for today: God will provide EVERYTHING we need — not just food – and He will do so abundantly! Sometimes in our discipleship, it is easy to fall into the lie that we are the ones doing all the work and that it is up to us to solve the world's problems. The truth is, our Heavenly Father already has the solutions, we need only look to Him in faith and hope! And we might want to be prepared for a solution that defies reason, like feeding 5,000 people with a meager sack lunch! Don't make excuses. Don't point out the flaws in God's plan. Simply take action and believe. God will "satisfy the desire of every living thing."

Holy Father has announced the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly is to be celebrated this month, on July 25.

Question:

July 26 is the feast of Joachim and Anna. Who are they and what do we know about them?

Answer:

Joachim and Anna are the parents of Mary, the mother of Jesus, yet there is absolutely no biblical reference to them whatsoever. So where do we get their names, and what is their story?


Their names are found in an apocryphal (hidden) gospel known as "The Infancy Gospel of James." Apocryphal, or hidden gospels, consist of accounts of Jesus' life that were ultimately not accepted as inspired works, and thus were not included in the Bible. However, they sometimes captured the Christian imagination, spilling into the devotional dimension of the community.

James' infancy gospel begins with the parents of Mary and their desire for a child. In their prayer and petitions to God, they are heard and given the blessings of a child, whom they named Mary. While we have no idea who Mary's parents really were, the fact that we celebrate the feast of Joachim and Anna indicates that the bond of family love is important in the Christian life.

Long before Grandparents' Day was established, the church had a feast that honored the presumed grandparents of Jesus. While their names are part of non-inspired apocryphal legends, the fact of the Savior's human ancestry is not. Christ, the incarnate Word, dwelt among us in the flesh in a human family. In honoring the grandparents of Jesus we really proclaim our faith in the Incarnation--God becoming human!
