FROM THE DEACON'S DESK

Dear Parishioners—

The word epiphany means “manifestation.” Luke’s gospel presents the shepherds as the first to pay homage to Jesus. For Matthew, the magi, Gentiles, were the first to adore Jesus. The Magi of this Sunday’s gospel are not the fortune teller magicians of Acts 8:9-25. Matthew portrays them as wise men from the East who probably had knowledge of Astrology and Astronomy. It was a common ancient belief that a new star appeared at the time of a ruler’s birth. The Magi saw the star and followed it, not knowing exactly where it would lead them. The fascination with the star and its origins should not take away from the true meaning of the passage that these Gentile men saw the Jewish star and that was enough for their faith. They got up and left everything and allowed the light to guide them and they chose the right path. On the other hand, King Herod feared the coming of a Messiah who could threaten his power and tried to get rid of him. The Gentile magi accepted the new born king, and his poverty and lack of power did not confuse them, instead it filled them with joy and moved them to adoration and surrender.

While the powerful become restless and reject Jesus, the Gentiles acknowledge Him as King. We should learn from the Magi to identify the signs, set out on the journey with determination and not allow anyone or anything to become an obstacle along the way. May we lay down our life and offer our treasure in worship to the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords.

May everyone have a blessed and joyful year in 2022.

Epiphany (also known as Twelfth Night, Theophany, or Three Kings Day) marks the occasion of a time-honored Christian tradition of “chalking the doors.” The formula for the ritual — adapted for 2022— is simple: take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 22. The letters have two meanings.

First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: “May Christ bless the house.” The “+” signs represent the cross, and the “20” at the beginning and the “22” at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

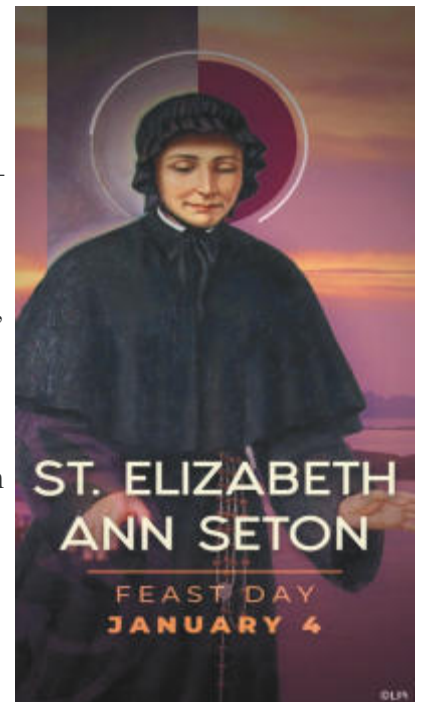
St. Elizabeth Ann Seton | January 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph’s Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter’s Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of “saint.”
