Love is the common way in how we relate to God, to others, or to ourselves. As followers of Christ, love is our trademark.


Love is a tricky word. It's most often understood as an intense feeling of deep affection. Spiritually, love has a much deeper and richer meaning; it transcends a feeling or emotion. This is what we see in our second reading from St. Paul to the Corinthians. Paul tells us that love isn't merely a feeling but a way of relating to others. While most of us are fairly familiar with this reading, slowing down to read it empowers us to enjoy subtle beauties we may otherwise miss. In this timeless passage on love, Paul instructs us about what we need to hold close and what we need to let go. He empowers us with a framework to respond to any situation in love. Sometimes we will need to do things that are out of our comfort zone; sometimes we will need to not do things that feel natural to us. In both situations, love empowers us to respond beyond our feelings so we may convey life to others.

We can begin by putting these into practice with those closest to us, our family. Although as Christians, we don't stop there. As outlined in 1 Corinthians, we're called to love everyone God brings into our lives. We are to imitate Christ and his love for others even when that is difficult. Love never fails.

St. Blaise | February 3

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.



First Corinthians and the Stewardship of Social Media

"Love is patient, love is kind ..." As familiar as these words are, they never seem to stray into the territory of becoming trite or silly. At their core they communicate a truth about us and about our Creator that never fails to inspire.

But despite the fact that you've probably heard it at many weddings over time, First Corinthians isn't just for newlyweds. It wasn't written for married folks. It's for every single one of us, in every state of life and every social situation, in every country and culture and language across the globe.

Which means that First Corinthians is even for the online world. It's for Facebook and Twitter and Instagram and all the other platforms I'm forgetting (there seems to be a new one every day, doesn't there?).

A sense of division — whether rooted in politics, culture or anything else — is growing in our world, and it's never more obvious than when we observe interactions online. It is far easier, after all, to remember what love is when a human being of flesh and blood stands before us. When all we see is an avatar or a profile picture on a screen — especially accompanied by an opinion with which we vehemently disagree — even the most loving Christians can throw First Corinthians out the window.

As everyday stewards we know that we are charged to be not only gracious but grateful. We receive others but we also give thanks for what they bring to us—even if that's an opportunity to "strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts."

So before the next time you post anything online, I suggest giving First Corinthians a read — and remember, love never fails.

LIBRARY BY MAIL

Free Service for the Homebound

What is Library by Mail?

Anne Arundel County Public Library will mail library material to county residents who are homebound due to illness, injury or disability. This free service is called, **Library by Mail.**

Library material is sent via US Mail in a pouch that includes a pre-paid postage label to return the items to the library.

What is available through Library by Mail?

Library material such as books (including large print versions), magazines, CDs, DVDs and audiobooks that are available at the Anne Arundel County Public Library or through the Maryland interlibrary loan network may be borrowed through **Library by Mail**. Material must fit in the designated mail pouch.

How do I sign up for Library by Mail? Call the Glen Burnie Regional Library at 410-222-6270 and ask for Library by Mail, or contact by email at lbm@aacpl.net. Staff will explain the service, answer questions, and mail the application form which must be completed by a medical professional and returned to the library.

Once approved, **Library by Mail** staff will contact you to determine your needs and interest. Library material will be mailed to you within a few weeks, or staff will suggest appropriate free services available through the Maryland State Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped.
