

THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM

Parents are <u>required</u> to attend a preparation session concerning the Sacrament of Baptism. Baptism Preparation Sessions are held on the <u>second</u> Monday of every month from 7:00-8:00 p.m. Baptisms are on the <u>first</u> Sunday of the month at 1:00 PM at <u>Mary Mother of Peace</u>. Baptisms on the third Sunday of the month during the 11:00 AM Mass are suspended until further notice.

In order for your child/children to be baptized, you must be registered parishioners of the parish. Basic Guidelines and Information to be Qualified as a Godparent/Godparents: A person may only have one or two

godparents (also called sponsors); if two are chosen, they must be male and female. In order for someone to be eligible as a godparent they must be chosen by the parents, have the ability and the intention to fulfill the role, be at least 16 years of age, be a baptized Roman Catholic, be a confirmed Roman Catholic, received the Most Holy Eucharist, and be in good standing which is leading a life in harmony with the Catholic Faith (including Marriage) and will be a good role model for the one being baptized, and be neither the father nor the mother of the child (Code of Canon Law, cc. #867-868; Catechism of the Catholic Church #1251).

A baptized person who belongs to another Christian community may be admitted only as a "Christian witness" (not a godparent) provided that there is at least one Roman Catholic godparent who fulfills the above criteria. A non-baptized person cannot be a witness (Code of Canon Law, cc. #872-874; Catechism of the Catholic Church #1255).

MARRIAGE

Diocesan policy requires a year of preparation. Please contact the Pastor at least one year prior to the wedding to begin preparation.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Parishioners facing surgery or struggling with serious illness may request the Sacrament of the Sick by calling the Parish Office.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

This process welcomes any unbaptized person who is seeking to become a member of the Catholic Church; to any person baptized in another Christian Church who is considering the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church. Please contact the parish Office for more info.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Father Thomas E. Hanley, 83, a longtime pastor in the Diocese of Wilmington, died Jan. 6.

A Wilmington native, Father Hanley attended Christ Our King and Salesianum schools before



beginning studies for the priesthood at St. Mary's College in Kentucky. He was ordained by Bishop Michael W. Hyle in 1965. As an associate pastor, he served at St. Francis de Sales in Salisbury, Md., and in 1967 he moved to St. Paul's, Wilmington. In 1972, he became the diocesan director of planning.

In 1976, he was named pastor of St. Paul's while continuing as the planning director. After a stint as departmental secretary in charge of Catholic Charities from 1979-88, Father Hanley moved to Holy Cross Parish in Dover, where he remained as pastor until suffering two strokes in 2002. Funeral Services were held in Dover on Jan. 13.

Sister Margaret served for 21 years in the Diocese of Wilmington as the vice president of St. Francis Hospital in Wilmington. She ministered for 24 years in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, spending 13 of them at Neumann University as a professor and program director of Clinical Laboratory Services.

Sister Margaret had a doctoral degree in medical technology and authored several articles in professional journals and a textbook on clinical parasitology. She also served on various boards.

Services were held on Jan. 6 in Assisi House.




