

Many people give their allegiance to something until it asks them to do something challenging or radical. Then, they find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it. The task before us is to commit to the truth even when it may be easier to pursue something else. Truth is always worth obtaining even when it is difficult. Jesus offers us the truth of life, a life that is found in His own flesh and blood and a life of discipleship.

- 4) **How can one know when is an act morally good?**
 - 1) The twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit are: charity (or love), joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, long-suffering, mildness, faith, modesty, continency, and chastity. Fortitude is a moral virtue.
 - 2) Charity, also defined as "Divine Friendship" or friendship with God and all His children, lifts man beyond the limits of his human nature and lets him be at home with God. Like every true and perfect friendship, it extends to those loved by God, His children. Without Charity or Divine Friendship, all other virtues are not practiced to the fullest.
 - 3) It is through transubstantiation that the risen Jesus becomes truly present in the Eucharist. The word transubstantiation is made up of two parts: 'trans' and 'substantiation.' The first part is a prefix that means 'across', 'beyond', or 'through'. It suggests that some kind of change has taken place. The second part of the word, 'substantiation,' refers to the philosophical term substance.
 - 4) An act is morally good when it assumes simultaneously the goodness of the object, of the end, and of circumstances. A chosen object can by itself vitiate an act in its entirety, even if the intention is good. It is not licit to do evil so that good may result from it. An evil end corrupts the action, even if the object is good in itself. On the other hand, a good end does not make an act good if the object of that act is evil, since the end does not justify the means. Circumstances can increase or diminish the responsibility of the one who is acting but they cannot change the moral quality of the acts themselves. They never make good an act which is in itself evil. (See CCC 1755-1756, 1759-1760)

FATHER CAPARAS' Q & A CORNER

I have some broken rosaries and statues. Can I just throw them in the trash?

Religious objects (even if they are not blessed), communicate and remind us of the presence of God and intercession of the Blessed Mother or the saints in heaven. Blessed objects are also considered “sacred” items and should therefore be accorded with respect. The Church recommends that religious objects that have been “blessed” should be disposed properly by burying or burning them. They can be burned at home or buried in our yard. Even if we are not sure if an item has been blessed, out of prudence we should properly dispose of them as recommended by the Church.

We may think of queens as the spouse of the king, but there is another key relationship: the king’s mother. And while Jesus doesn’t rule a political kingdom, we honor and recognize Him as the King of Kings, Lord of Heaven and Earth. To God alone belongs absolute authority over all of existence. 
