

ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION:

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

ASK FATHER CAPARAS

Q: Where does the church stand on its teaching regarding Capital Punishment? Shouldn't this issued be viewed in the same way as abortion?

A: The Church on occasion has always preached a "consistent ethic of life" -- meaning, that our ethical approach to life should be consistently upheld from conception to natural death. Therefore, one should be concerned not just with the dignity of the unborn child, but all human life, including those who are on death row. Recent popes, including Pope Francis and Pope Benedict XVI have spoken about the non-existent need for capital punishment, especially in today's society when we have the ability to safely incarcerate criminals without executing them. Pope Francis in 2017 went so far as to "update" the Church's teaching on Capital Punishment in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The revised version in paragraph 2267 now states:

Consequently, the Church teaches, in the light of the Gospel, that "the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person", and she works with determination for its abolition worldwide.

While it does not completely rule out the death penalty, recent magisterial positions have leaned towards abolishing it and encouraging governments to adopt such policy. It's the strongest statement of the Church yet on Capital Punishment. However, it has also been a long standing position of the Church for centuries that society has a right for self defense, order, and the common good. In times past, Capital Punishment was sometimes the only recourse available to protect innocent lives and the common good. Many Church leaders now believe, especially the recent popes, that we now have arrived at a point in human society when we are in a position to resort to a more humane option than execution, which would in turn would strengthen the Church's own witness to the dignity of life. Whether this is true or not, governments and those in charge of the common good have the moral obligation to properly discern on the need for Capital Punishment.

This Christmas, we are pleased to introduce a new addition in the sanctuary of both of our churches- - an *antependium*.

An antependium is a frontal decorative piece that is used to "dress" the altar for the Mass. It is meant to emphasize the dignity and reverence owed to Christ at the Mass-especially in the Eucharist. We are grateful that two families from our parish have already come forward to purchase and dedicate the antependium, one in each church. However, there are other matching pieces that can be made and dedicated to someone's memory. The following are items:
