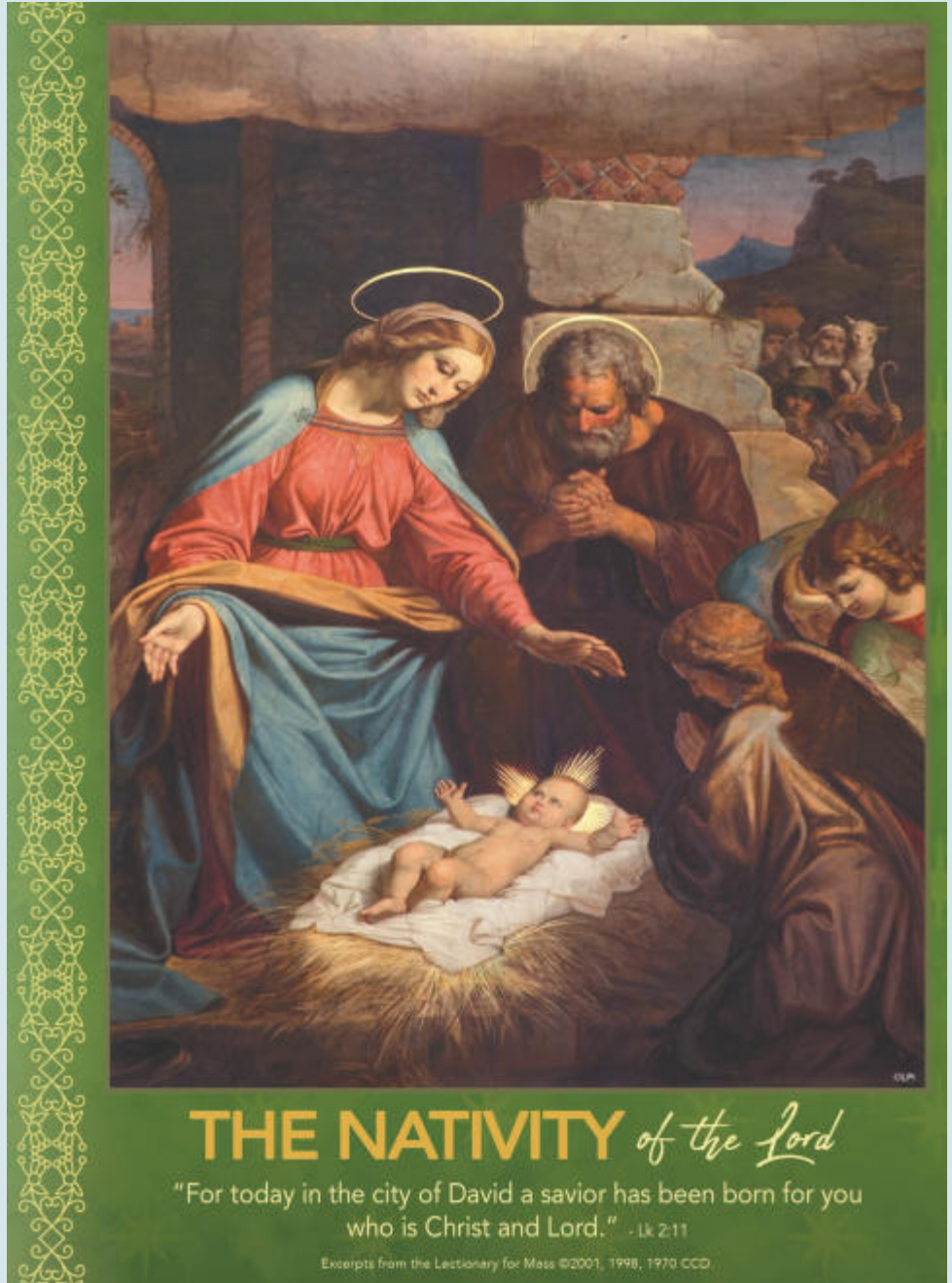

Something wants our attention. It's a light that has been shining since God first created it thousands and thousands of years ago. God gave it a singular

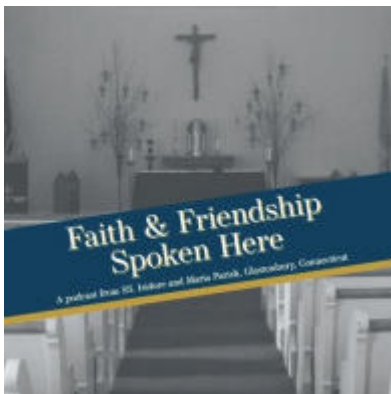

While this is most certainly true, we can only really begin to do this when we realize that we are still works in progress, not anchored to the wounds and sins of our past, and still a leading star in God's continually unfolding story of love. 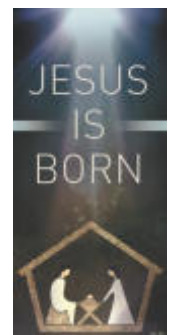

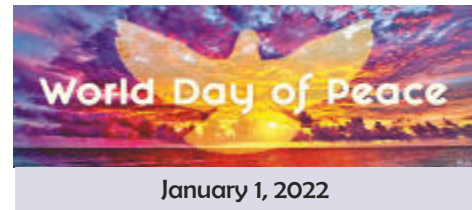

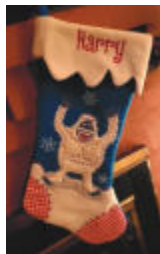
