



## Inspiration for the Week

To be humble means to see ourselves as we are. It comes with recognizing that we are never perfect, better than another, or free of sin. The humble person knows their faults and failings as well as their successes and triumphs. They also realize they are nothing without God, especially God's mercy. The humble one knows who they are, who they can be, and how they have fallen short. Being desperately in love with God, they know how they have sometimes given in to their desires rather than God's will, almost with a sense of embarrassment. Being justified in our relationship with God is not about a list of the good things we do and the bad things we don't. We are vindicated when we realize how dependent we are upon God's gratuitous, abundant, and unconditional love. It is a gift we often take for granted and is often unappreciated.

## Not for Sale: St. Augustine Church

“It has come to my attention that there is information being communicated in the community-at-large regarding the status of the ownership of St. Augustine Church and the property on which it sits.

As your pastor, please allow me to take a moment to let you know that neither I nor the Archdiocese of Hartford have any plans in the foreseeable future to sell St. Augustine Church. Its status as a church and as a vital part of SS. Isidore and Maria Parish remains unchanged.”

There is a thing called “false piety.” It is when we wear a religious disguise of devotion, attend to our obligations, and outwardly abide by rules while being inwardly unkind, uncharitable, and exclusive. Wearing the right clothes, saying the proper prayers, being in sacred places, and reading holy books, those exhibiting false piety craftily try to control others using the pretense of love. The Pharisees, consistently criticized by Jesus, are prime examples. Thinking they are superior to others, they foolishly believe they are better positioned with God and more worthy of God’s attention. Forming an exclusive “club,” they divide things between “mine” and “yours” and “us” and “them.” They quickly criticize and point out flaws and errors in rituals and thinking. Conformity becomes the first commandment and control is the game’s name.

The “club membership” requirements are clear: do what we do, think what we think, and believe what we believe. Attempting to control others using the lure of “status” or “salvation,” they seduce others into thinking conformity is the only way to holiness. Clinging to “my beliefs,” “my parish,” and “my way of thinking,” they fail to see the more significant relationship with God that is veiled in all of these superficial rules and practices. Shallow, hollow, and empty vessels, they gloss over the more important virtues of justice, mercy, faithfulness, and forgiveness. Sparkling clean on the outside but dirty on the inside. Spiritual arrogance is a grave sin. It alienates and hurts the little ones, those considered “least” in the kingdom.

God knows no favorites. Everyone belongs regardless of whether you are an official, bona fide member. Sometimes membership may be a detriment to living the Gospel if you join the team for the wrong reasons. The genuinely humble ones may not appear to be overly “pious.” They may not know the proper prayers or abide by the correct rituals, but they know they are broken and need mercy. There is no shame in being broken. Many things need to be broken to be what they indeed are! There is a reason Jesus told us to pray in private. It’s only between you and God. It is nobody else’s business.





## Reflect and Respond to Scripture

### First Reading:

Sirach teaches us that the Lord hears the prayers of those most vulnerable — the oppressed, the widow, the orphan, and the poor — because God cares deeply about justice. *Who do you know in those categories? How can you reach out to them?*

### Second Reading:

In his second letter to Timothy, Paul speaks of his impending death and in his firm belief that he will receive a just reward for his ministry. *When you think about the end of your life — what do you believe will happen to you for eternity?*

### Gospel:

In the parable of the Pharisee and tax collector, Jesus teaches crowds the proper approach to prayer: “O God, be merciful to me a sinner.” *What do you think God says in response?*

## This Day in History — Oct. 27, 1904

### New York City Subway: The World's first underground and underwater subway.

The first underground line of the New York City subway opened for use on October 27, 1904. It was built by the Interborough Rapid Transit Co. (IRT) almost 36 years after the opening of the first elevated line in New York City. The 9.1-mile subway line (then called the “Manhattan Main Line”) ran



from City Hall station northward under Lafayette St. and Park Ave. before turning westward at 42nd St. It then curved northward again at Times Square, continuing under Broadway before terminating in Harlem. Its operation was leased to the Interborough Rapid Transit Co., and over 150,000 passengers paid the 5¢ fare to ride it on the first day of operation.
