



**remains.** When a believer realizes without doubt that God is love, it is a powerful moment. Placing our resurrection trust in this fundamental truth allows us to experience God's

presence in all our experiences: the good and the bad, positive and negative, life-enriching and destructive events we encounter. It is no wonder that St. Paul so accurately tells us that love endures all things and lasts. How can God not endure or ever fade away? Because he is God, Jesus also guarded and protected his disciples as the endearing shepherd who always had their best interests at heart.

If we become too immersed in the world, we lose touch with these deeper realities. We can become so preoccupied with preserving what we have created or think we need that we forget that it is not building our city that matters but God's. Jesus clearly did not belong to the world, and by his resurrection, he tries to get us to understand that we do not either. The truth brings us to more divine places and takes our eyes off concerns that often captivate our fears and storm our senses.

Life can easily erode our faith. Think of your life over the last couple of weeks. What challenged your faith and distracted your divine glance? Even being overly stimulated by technology and social media can erode our sense of confidence and cause us to forget who we are. We need to distance ourselves from the world to experience Christ's joy. The world will never like the word of God. It is too challenging and too perplexing. The world mistakenly believes that it can survive on its own. It is a mistaken judgment that may cost people a lot in the end. It is all so straightforward: God remains when we love one another. If in all business of our lives and all that, each day brings, the good and the bad, we follow the call and path of love; we will walk with God. There is nothing to fear, and anxiety finds no home.



## St. Isidore the Farmer — Feast Day May 15

**Patron:** National Rural Conference in the United States **Canonized:** March 12, 1622, Rome by Pope Gregory XV

Isidore was born in 1070 to a peasant family near Madrid, Spain. The farmer Isidore was a day laborer working on the wealthy John de Vargas farm at Torrelaguna, just outside Madrid. He married a poor girl, Maria Torribia. Their only child, a son, died in infancy.

The couple took a vow of continence to serve God. Isidore's life is a model of simple Christian charity and faith. He prayed while at work. He shared what he had with the poor, even his meals. He often gave them more than he had for himself.

St. Maria (feast day, September 9) always kept a pot of stew on the fireplace in their humble rural dwelling. She knew that her husband Isidore would often bring home anyone hungry. In representations, St. Isidore is portrayed as a peasant with a sickle or staff and sometimes with an angel or white oxen near him. He died in 1130 and was canonized in 1622.

Maria became a hermit after Isidore's death, but she also performed miracles. Her remains are honored by all of Spain through pilgrimages and processions at Torrelaguna, where they were transferred in 1615. She was beatified in 1697.

# This Day in History — The Invention of Duct Tape



#### Vesta Stoudt (April 13, 1891 - May 9, 1966)

Vesta Stoudt was the woman who had the seminal idea for duct tape. While working at an ordnance plant during World War II, she noticed that the way ammunition boxes were sealed made them difficult to open quickly. So, she developed a waterproof, tearable cloth tape to solve the problem. Her bosses at the plant were unimpressed, so she wrote a letter to U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt: Roosevelt liked the idea and sent it to the War Production Board who implemented her tape. The tape was made with a woven

fabric, known as "duck cloth", coated in waterproof plastic with a layer of rubber-based adhesive and could be torn by hand without the need for scissors. The tape worked great on ammo boxes and soon GIs found it was also useful for fixing leaks, repairing equipment, and even closing up wounds on the battlefield. Stoudt received Chicago Tribune's War Worker Award for her idea.

So Oliver, I bet Sean, our Facilities Manager has a picture of Vesta in his office. After all, she is the hero of duct tape, the



most important "tool" in a handyman's box! I think our Dad has mentioned how good it is at keeping things "shut". He was looking at me at the time. I wonder why?


