


Summer Pop-Up Choirs are here!

This Day in History - August 19, 1960



On August 19, 1960, two dogs named Belka (Russian for "squirrel") and Strelka (Russian for "little arrow")

were launched into the Earth's orbit by the Soviet Union aboard the Sputnik 5 spacecraft. Forty mice, two rats, and a variety of plants were also on-board. Recovered the next day after

18 orbits, the menagerie became the first living creatures to return safely to Earth after being placed into orbit.
