

# THIS WEEKEND Mass parking during the Glastonbury Apple Harvest & Music Festival

The 49th Annual Glastonbury Apple Harvest & Music Festival takes place from Oct. 18 - Oct. 20. This will impact parking in the St. Paul parking lot for ALL MASSES on Sat., Oct. 19, and Sun., Oct. 20. To accommodate all parishioners who wish to attend Mass that weekend, we ask that you please enter the St. Paul parking lot via the North side entrance on Main Street (closest to the CVS). The Welles Street entrance to the parking lot will be CLOSED, and LIMITED PARKING will be made available to those parishioners requiring handicapped access via the South entrance on Main Street. Church volunteers will be stationed at all entrances to ensure you have access to parking at Mass time. Please plan a few extra minutes of travel time to your regular schedule, as traffic will be heavy.


### Oct. 24: Bereavement Facilitator Training Workshop

#### Inspiration for the Week by Rev. Mark Suslenko


It's the positions of power and great authority that people often admire. We equate success with six-figure incomes, high positions, management, and influence. We even go above and beyond to find favor with our bosses to get a little extra recognition and maybe the next promotion when it comes up. This is the way of the world. Those who have their values set on earthly things are going to work by worldly rules. We forget that it doesn't work that way in the Kingdom of God. Success is measured not from the place of status, influence, or prestige but from the place of humility, service, and sacrifice. The authority that one hopes to achieve is not an authority over others but an authority that comes from wisdom and developing one's relationship with God. Jesus flips the tables on our priorities. Even the first disciples had a tough time understanding this. They really thought that they would somehow receive a privilege or bonus for being faithful. We often operate under that same illusion.

# November 2 is the Feast of All Souls.

This is traditionally the time of year when we remember our loved ones and all souls who have departed this life. This time of prayer helps us not forget that we are still connected with them and united with God.

Remembrance envelopes for All Souls Day, Nov. 2, are now in your offertory packets and at the entrances of St. Paul Church. The envelopes will be placed on the altar, and the deceased will be remembered throughout November.



"What do you wish me to do for you?" Whether we realize it, this is a question God is always asking. It's an important question because our answer will reveal much about where our

hearts lie. Our requests of God can often appear noble and altruistic. They consist of requests for healing for someone in need of prayers, successful resolution of a personal conflict, assistance in overcoming a disease, and myriad other desires for ourselves and others. We are especially concerned about those we love and can easily find ourselves bringing their struggles to God for a hearing in our prayer.

Is that really all that prayer is about? The woman in today's Gospel, having been put in her place by Jesus, was only looking out for the wellbeing of her sons. She was doing what mothers do: protecting and securing the livelihoods of her children. But she was sadly mistaken when her request was not granted. We all make this same misguided mistake from time to time. The goal of prayer is not to convince God of the worthiness of our agenda or to gain a

hearing. Sometimes, we believe that the more we multiply our prayers or discover the right supplications, the more we will receive God's attention. That's not how it works. Even though God desires to hear, know, and be an intimate part of what is on our minds, it goes much deeper.

What we need from God is a relationship. It's a relationship that guides and immerses us in the very stuff of life and in the direction of the Gospel. This relationship sees God's kingdom and agenda, not our own, as what is most important. It builds the strength of character necessary to bring God's Gospel into a world that may not receive it with open arms. It may cause us discomfort and suffering. We are asked to heroically journey with God through suffering, hardship, ridicule, and even death! Ultimately, our desire from God must become our desire for God. Only when this happens will the powerful words "thy will be done" be found with sincerity and humility on our lips. Whatever God wishes becomes what we wish as we see this glorious union of wills. Our humble lives will then become powerful witnesses, and what happens to us in God's eternal kingdom is the result of his mercy. We become faithful servants and find ourselves discovering God's definition of success. That definition has nothing at all to do with status, income, or privilege.



#### Charles de Foucauld

(1858-1916) also known as Brother Charles of Jesus, was born to an aristocratic family in Strasbourg, France. He was orphaned at the age of six. By his teenage years he had rejected the Catholic faith. His adventurous spirit led him to join the French army which gave him the opportunity to travel.



In his 20s he resigned from the army to explore Morrocco, a relatively dangerous undertaking. He was influenced by the strong faith of Muslims he met, which inspired him to begin to question his own lack of faith. When he came back to France, he returned to his Catholic faith.

On January 15, 1890, he became a Trappist monk. However, he felt his true calling to be the imitation of the life of Jesus. In fulfillment of this mission, he lived for a time as a hermit near a convent of Poor Clares in Nazareth. His devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist was so profound that he often spent hours before the Tabernacle. In 1901, at the urging of the superior of the Poor Clares, he returned to France to be ordained a priest.

After his ordination he went to live as a hermit with the Tuareg people in the Sahara Desert in Algeria. He spent13 years there, learning the Tuareg language and culture. He made the first French-Tuareg dictionary and translated the Gospels into Tuareg.

Though his dream of establishing religious orders did not come true, St. Charles de Foucauld is the inspiration for lay associations, religious communities and secular institutes of laity and priests collectively known as "the spiritual family of Charles de Foucauld."

Known as one of the pioneers of interreligious dialogue, Charles was assassinated in 1916. He was beatified in 2005 and canonized by Pope Francis on May 15, 2022.

#### This Day in History - Oct. 27, 1904

#### **New York City Subway:**

# The World's first underground and underwater subway.

The first underground line of the subway way opened on Oct. 27, 1904, built by the Interborough Rapid Transit Co. (IRT) almost 36 years after the opening of the first elevated line in New York City. The 9.1-mile subway line, then called the "Manhattan Main Line", ran from City\_Hall station northward under Lafayette St. and Park Ave. before turning westward at 42nd St.

It then curved northward again at Times Square, continuing under Broadway before terminating in Harlem. Its operation was leased to the Interborough Rapid

Transit Co. and over 150,000 passengers paid the **5¢ fare** to ride it on the first day of operation.

Say Oliver, too bad we weren't around to help dig out the first subway in NY. Dad knows we are "experts"! Remember when We started to dug our own subway" at the fence! Fun time!


