GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE



From a young age, I loved winning at sports. I confess that winning was a bit of an addiction. It was probably coming from a deep desire for attention and affirmation from others. Nevertheless, it was a driving motivation for me. Baseball, soccer, track, table tennis, and whatever else I could find was a chance to win. Competition was my obsession.

Another John, and his brother James, demonstrate a kind of wildly competitive obsession when they dare to say to Jesus: "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory" (Mark 10:37). Their audacity arouses an indigent reaction from the other apostles, who are clearly raw that these two are out to win the highest spots.

How does Jesus respond to us in our desires for greatness? The same way he does to James and John.

He does not criticize them for their desire for glory. But he does highlight their ignorance ("you do not know what you are asking."). Then he invites them to be champions of true greatness: by drinking not the cup of worldly victory, but his cup of self-giving suffering love, to be the "slave of all." The true winners are slaves of love. This week, dare to tell Jesus what your ambitions truly are. Hear him call you to an even greater victory.

— Father John Muir ©I Pi Charles de Foucauld (1858-1916) also known as Brother Charles of Jesus, was born to an aristocratic family in Strasbourg, France. He was orphaned at the age of six. By his teenage years he had rejected the Catholic faith. His adventurous spirit led him to join the French army which gave him the opportunity to travel.

In his 20s he resigned from the army to explore Morrocco, a relatively dangerous undertaking. He was influenced by the strong faith of Muslims he met, which inspired him to begin to question his own lack of faith. When he came back to France, he returned to his Catholic faith.

On January 15, 1890, he became a Trappist monk. However, he felt his true calling to be the imitation of the life of Jesus. In fulfillment of this mission, he lived for a time as a hermit near a convent of Poor Clares in Nazareth. His devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist was so profound that he often spent hours before the Tabernacle. In 1901, at the urging of the superior of the Poor Clares, he returned to France to be ordained a priest.

After his ordination he went to live as a hermit with the Tuareg people in the Sahara Desert in Algeria. He spent13 years there, learning the Tuareg language and culture. He made the first French-Tuareg dictionary and translated the Gospels into Tuareg.

Though his dream of establishing religious orders did not come true, St. Charles de Foucauld is the inspiration for lay associations, religious communities and secular institutes of laity and priests collectively known as "the spiritual family of Charles de Foucauld."

Known as one of the pioneers of interreligious dialogue, Charles was assassinated in 1916. He was beatified in 2005 and canonized by Pope Francis on May 15, 2022. St. Charles de Foucauld, pray for us!



Contest is open to: All Catholic Students in public, private and parochial schools, **Grades 8-12**. **About the Essay Contest**: Students are encouraged to write a 500-750 word essay on the following theme:

"What are the two most important virtues for an elected leader to possess, and why? How can you determine if the leader has these virtues??"

Virtue is a habitual and firm disposition to do good. It governs our acts, orders our passions, and guides our conduct by reason and faith. It also encourages Christians to live in a relationship with the Holy Trinity. The call to live a virtuous life applies to individuals in every state of life and occupation, including our elected leaders.

Type the essay and complete the provided Essay Contest Entry Form. Both Students and Parent/Guardian must sign the Entry Form. Attach the typed essay to the form and provide them to: Millet LoCasale, SKD Youth Minister, at the St. Katharine Drexel Church Office.

Due Date: Essays/Form must be provided to the SKD Youth Minister by **Sunday, November 10th**. **Judging:** The Local Knights of Columbus Council will have a team of 3 judges score each essay and select the 1st Place Winner in each grade, 8 through 12.

Awards: Each 1st Place winners will receive an Award of \$100 and all participating students will receive a Certificate of Participation.

The 1st Place winner essays will be entered into additional levels of competition at the District, Jurisdictional and International levels if deadlines for entry are met by our council.

RULES

Essays must reflect the assigned theme and be the student's original work.

Essays must be typed and be between 500 and 750 words in length.

The student's name should appear only on the official Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest entry form, which must be stapled to the essay.

All entries become the property of the Knights of Columbus and will not be returned.

JUDGING

A 100-point scoring system will be used to determine the winner.

35 Points: Content — How thoroughly is the topic examined?

30 Points: Grammar — How well is the essay written with respect to sentence and paragraph construction?

35 Points: Style — Does the essay show creativity, imagination and development of the topic in a logical and compelling style?


