

MISSION COOPERATIVE PROGRAM (MCP) ~ COLLECTION JULY 17-18 weekend. John & Betty's Column: Our God longs to speak to His children. Throughout the entire Bible, He is reaching out to teach and to lead those He has called in the path of righteousness. He wants to speak to us right now, today, at this very moment, if we will let Him. We may say that we already know Jesus. We have grown up with Him. We know He is the Son of God. We may say that we have come to church all our lives, and we pray to Him daily. But what if today Jesus Christ wants to give us a new vision of Himself. Are we open to that possibility? Perhaps, today Jesus wants to clean our spiritual glasses so that we can see Him in new ways. Jesus speaks to us every day, but time and time again, we, His children, ignore His words and go our own way, and do our own thing. Or perhaps we don't take the time to really listen. But the Lord does not give up on us. Not only does the Lord speak to us, but He also welcomes our questions. Jesus wants us to ask Him questions, but then He also asks us to listen. We can listen to Jesus through His Word, the scriptures, the Mass, and the Eucharist. He can speak to our hearts in the sights and sounds that surround us, and He can guide us through the love and support of our Christian family and friends. God speaks to us each day as a loving Father, an obedient Son, and a life-giving Spirit, but we need to give Him the freedom to speak to our hearts. If we look at Him as the God of our childhood or of our youth, we can mute His voice, just like we do to our televisions when we do not want to hear the sound. We are sent to share Jesus' mission to spread the Good News. One of the most difficult groups to share about our life with the Lord could be our own family and friends. They are aware of our shortcomings, our mistakes and our sins, just as those in Nazareth only saw Jesus as a carpenter, neighbor, and a friend. Undoubtedly, they had heard the rumors that Jesus could be the Messiah, the long-awaited one. But they just could not handle it. In that atmosphere, there was nothing Jesus could do. Do we have a preconception of what the Lord can do in our lives and the lives of the ones we love? Do we put Him in a box, and fail to see all the possibilities when we put our faith and trust in Him? Our job is not to create disciples for the Lord, but to plant seeds – seeds of kindness, seeds of faith, seeds of hope, and seeds of true happiness. Those seeds may bloom, or they may remain dormant for many years. But the watering of those seeds is the Lord's work. We may never know when they will bloom. We hope and pray that through God's grace, they bloom in time to bring happiness and peace into the lives of those we love. We don't have to figure out how to lead our lives on our own. He is there to help us. He is there to be our wisdom, our strength, and our friend. More than words, what will speak the loudest to those closest to us are our actions. When we stop living for ourselves and begin living for others, that will speak volumes to those who know us. It will create a hunger in their hearts to know what is going on inside us. We will be a light shining in the darkness to them, even if they do not admit it. It is about the joy of sharing our life with the Lord with others. Perhaps today Jesus Christ is asking us to look at life a little differently. He may be asking us to place an old hurt in His loving hands; He may be asking us to smile a little bit more; or He may just be asking us to pass on His love to someone else. We need to become the Lord's voice to a world that needs to hear Him. Is Jesus asking us to help set their spirits free by being His voice to them, by helping them see the gifts that the Lord has given to them? (And yes, God gave all of us gifts, you included.) We are God's homily to the world by the lives that we live and by the care that we show each other. We are God's homily in the difficult times of our lives. When we know deep in our hearts that our Lord speaks to us, we will rely on Him just like St. Paul did in our second reading. Our weakness will become our strength. All the Lord asks is for us to listen to Him.
