

From Father Tom:

The Baptism of the Lord

"O living water. flow over me!"

Today we celebrate **the Baptism of the Lord Jesus** in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. This baptism was not the same as Christian Baptism. John's baptism was simply a sign of repentance, a public gesture to signify the willingness to repent. Jesus had no need to be baptized as a sign of repentance or to remove sin since He is the sinless Son of God. Jesus was baptized to make holy the waters that would sanctify His people; to show His solidarity with sinners; to reveal His willingness to die for them; and to reveal His identity as the Messiah. I thought this would be an opportune time to review some facts concerning the meaning of the great gift of baptism which we have been blessed to receive. The following paragraphs are taken from the **Catechism of the Catholic Church.**

1210 Christ instituted the sacraments of the new law. there are seven: Baptism, Confirmation, the Eucharist, Penance, the , Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders, and Matrimony

1213 Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as Sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word."

1250 Born with a fallen human nature and tainted by original sin, children also have need of the new birth in Baptism to be freed from the power of darkness and brought into the realm of the freedom of the children of God, to which all men are called. The sheer gratuitousness of the grace of salvation is particularly manifest in infant Baptism. The Church and the parents would deny a child the priceless grace of becoming a child of God were they not to confer Baptism shortly after birth (within one month).


1254 For all the baptized, children or adults, faith must grow after Baptism.

1255 For the grace of Baptism to unfold, the parents' help is important. So too is the role of the godfather and godmother, who must be firm believers, able and ready to help the newly baptized - child or adult - on the road of Christian life. Canon#874

To be admitted to undertake the office of sponsor (godparent), a person must:

- 1. Be not Jess than 16 years of age;
- 2. Be a Catholic who has been confirmed and has received the Blessed Eucharist, and who lives; a life of faith which befits the role undertaken;
- 3. Not be either the father or the mother of the person to be baptized. One sponsor, male or female is sufficient; but there may be two, one of each sex. (Canon 873) (A baptized person who is not catholic may be admitted only in company with a catholic sponsor, and then simply as a witness to the baptism)

1257 The Lord himself affirms that Baptism is necessary for salvation. He also commands his disciples to proclaim the Gospel to all nations and to baptize them. Baptism is necessary for salvation for those to whom the Gospel has been proclaimed and, who have bad the possibility of asking for this sacrament The Church does not know of any means other than Baptism that assures entry into eternal beatitude; this is why she takes care not to neglect the mission she bas received from the Lord to see that all who



can be baptized are "reborn of water and the Spirit." God has bound salvation to the sacrament of Baptism, but he himself is not bound by his sacraments.

1258 The Church has always held the firm conviction that those who suffer death for the sake of the faith without having received Baptism are baptized by their death for and with Christ. This Baptism of blood, like the desire for Baptism, brings about the fruits of Baptism without being a sacrament.

1260 "Since Christ died for all, and since all men are in fact called to one and the same destiny, which is divine, we must hold that the Holy Spirit offers to all the possibility of being made partakers, in a way known to God, of the Paschal mystery." Every man who is ignorant of the Gospel of Christ and of his Church, but seeks the truth and does the will of God in accordance with his understanding of it, can be saved. It may be supposed that such persons would have desired Baptism explicitly if they had known its necessity (Baptism by desire).

1261 As regards children who have died without Baptism, the Church can only entrust them to the mercy of God as she does in funeral rites for them. Indeed, the great mercy of God who desires that all men should be saved, and Jesus' tenderness toward children which caused him to say: "Let the children come to me, do not hinder them," allow us to hope that there is a way of salvation for children, who have died without Baptism. All the more urgent is the Church's call not to prevent little children coming to Christ through the gift of holy Baptism.

1263 By Baptism all sins are forgiven, original sin and all personal sins, as well as all punishment for sin.

1264 Yet certain temporal consequences of sin remain in the baptized, such as suffering, illness, death, and such frailties inherent in life as weaknesses of character, and so on, as well as an *inclination to sin* that Tradition calls *concupiscence*, or metaphorically, "the tinder for sin"; since concupiscence "is left for us to wrestle with, it cannot harm those who do not consent but manfully resist it by the grace of Jesus Christ." Indeed, "an athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules."

"...Baptism" continued:

1266 The Most Holy Trinity gives the baptized sanctifying grace, the grace of justification: - enabling them to believe in God, to hope in him, and to love him through the theological virtues; giving them the power to live and act under. the prompting of the Holy Spirit through the gifts of the Holy Spirit; - allowing them to grow in goodness through the moral virtues.

1269 Having become a member of the Church, the person baptized belongs no longer to himself, but to him who died and rose for us. From now on, he is called to be subject to others, to serve them in the communion of the Church, and to "obey and submit" to the Church's leaders, holding them in respect and affection. Just as Baptism is the source of responsibilities and duties, the baptized person also enjoys rights within the Church: to receive the sacraments, to be nourished with the Word of God and to be sustained by the other spiritual helps of the Church.

1270 "Reborn as sons of God, [the baptized] must profess before men the faith they have received from God through the Church" and participate in the apostolic and missionary activity of the People, of God.

1272 Incorporated into Christ by Baptism, the person baptized is configured to Christ. Baptism seals the Christian with the indelible spiritual mark (character) of his belonging to Christ. No sin can erase this mark, even if sin prevents Baptism from bearing the fruits of salvation. Given once for all, Baptism cannot be repeated.

1274 "Baptism indeed is the seal of eternal life." The faithful Christian who has "kept the seal" until the end; remaining faithful to the demands of his Baptism, will be able to depart this life "marked with the sign of faith," with his baptismal faith, in expectation of the blessed vision of God (Heaven) - the consummation of faith - and in the hope of resurrection.




