While they always include on their meal donation, what they have prepared for our recipients, they also add a poem, a song, or something inspirational for that particular week. We anxiously await what special note they have included. This past Saturday, the lyrics to a song by Lennie Gallant of Canada, was on top of their donated meals.

Frankly, I was struck by the title "The Innkeeper". So many Christmas songs are about the shepherds, the angels, and the Kings, but I had never heard a song before about the Innkeeper who turned the Holy Family from his door. Theology 101: Early Church History- Part 19 ~ Deacon Donald Higby

During the persecutions of Decius, a man named Paul of Thebes fled to the desert in Egypt, where he became the first hermit. Several years later he was joined by Saint Antony, who had given his inheritance away, following the advice Jesus gave to the rich young man. There he limited himself to bread and water, slept on the ground and wore animal skins. His reputation for miracles and holiness spread, and soon followers joined him, living in caves and imitating his lifestyle.

A pagan soldier, Pachomius, converted to Christianity and became a disciple of another hermit, Paleomon. Like Antony, his reputation spread, and he attracted followers, but unlike Antony, he organized them into a world of discipline, security, and hard work, who supplied their own food and other wants, within the walls of a monastery. In short, he did not abandon the world, but recreated it. At his death he oversaw nine monasteries for men and two for women. Pachomius wrote an extensive rule based on his military experiences. He dictated what the monks were to wear, and how long they had to go before washing their clothing. Nearly every facet of life was covered. The monasteries themselves were designed to withstand raids and the monks were not afraid to defend themselves. As the monastic movement spread, some monasteries contained over a thousand men, organized into houses of thirty to forty, based on their occupations. It is unclear as to whether Pachomius' monks were ordained, as during his lifetime he did not permit clergy to become monks.

Would-be monks had to stand outside the monastery for a few days while they were scrutinized as to their intentions and taught to memorize some prayers and psalms. Once admitted they were not allowed full membership for three years, during which time if they were illiterate they were taught to read and write. The rule of Pachomius persists in modified form even up to the present.

Basil was another founder of eastern monasticism, who built his monastery on some of his family land. His rule was more moderate than that of Pachomius, He cut back the amount of formal prayer, and prescribed seven times each day for that activity. He allowed more varied diets and the use of wine with meals. He insisted that his monks care for the poor, the orphans and the sick and his monks built hospitals and hostels for the poor. Pachomius had devoted little of his time to spiritual questions, but Basil is a doctor of the Church based on his writings on the Holy Spirit. The rule he wrote is still used by Eastern Orthodox monks.

In the fourth century John Cassian, who had been a monk in the east, erected two monasteries in France. Seventy years later Benedict wrote his rule, and Benedictine monasticism became the western standard. His rule is brief and shows remarkable temperance and practical wisdom. It's worth reading.

Why monasticism? Most likely the movement thrived because the church and state had become so intertwined that people wanted to escape the system to lead more spiritual lives. Also, since martyrdom was now reserved for heretics and pagans, Christians sought alternative ways to avoid the corruption of the world.

St. Mary's & Climate Change

Pope Francis in his 2015 encyclical "Laudato Si" writes, "We know that technology based on the use of highly polluting fossil fuels – especially coal but also oil and to a lesser extent gas – needs to be progressively replaced without delay." He was most concerned about poor nations least able to adapt to the effects of climate change but who will bear the brunt of its effects.

On September 7, 2021, in their joint statement, "Listen to the Cry of the Poor" the Pope, the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Orthodox Patriarch write, "Today we are paying the price. The extreme weather and disasters of recent months reveal afresh to us with great force and great human cost that climate change is not only a future challenge but an immediate and urgent matter of survival."
