

### Theology 101: Early Church History- Part 20

Perhaps the most influential figure in the early days of Christianity was Augustine. His life story is well known. He was born in North Africa to a Christian mother and pagan father. He was a brilliant student, a natural leader, and prone to getting himself and others into trouble. He was a bully. At seventeen he took a mistress and a year later she bore him a son. About this time, he became associated with the Manichee movement -- a gnostic sect. He taught rhetoric in Carthage -- basically teaching how to win arguments, a subject much in demand by students in those days -- and eventually applied for and landed a job teaching rhetoric in Milan, where he had the opportunity to hear the Bishop, Ambrose. It was about this time that he became disillusioned with the Manchees and started becoming interested in Christianity. His mother Monica, about this time, attempted to arrange a marriage to a woman of mobile birth, but as she was only ten, the marriage could not take place for four more years. In the meantime, Augustine sent his mistress back to Carthage and found another. It was around this time that he prayed "God, grant me chastity, but not yet". Augustine was eventually baptized and began to direct his intellectual powers toward defending Christianity and pointing out the errors in other religions. At the age of thirty-seven he was ordained a priest and shortly after, made bishop of Hippo, a city in North Africa. There he developed a rule for the priests of his diocese, which many centuries later became the basis for the Augustinian order.

A monk from Britain, Pelagius, taught that human beings by living virtuous lives, could achieve salvation. In response, Augustine delineated the doctrine of Original Sin, saying that nothing a human being could do could make up for the offense of Adam and Eve, which was passed on to all their descendants. For Augustine, the natural fate of everyone was damnation, and only baptism could make a difference. He believed in predestination; God saved those he chose to save, for his own reasons. During this time, the Donatist heresy was competing with orthodox Christianity, and there were rival bishops and clergy throughout North Africa. The Donatists arose during the persecution of Diocletian when many Christians under pressure renounced their faith. For the Donatists, this meant that they had to be rebaptized and barred from administering the sacraments if they were priests or bishops. Augustine argued that sacraments like baptism and holy orders changed a person permanently and could not be re-administered. He also argued that the validity of a sacrament did not depend on the holiness of the priest or bishop who administered it. The sacrament depended on the authority of the one giving it, and the use of the proper rite. Augustine accepted the authority of the Catholic Church and promoted the idea of unity under the Pope. He said at one point that he would not have believed the gospel had not the Church proclaimed it.

When Augustine died, he had left behind an enormous canon; his <u>Confessions</u> and <u>City of God</u> are still widely read. The sermons he left behind are beautiful in their simplicity.

Historically when the western empire fell, the papacy became the political center of the western empire. Augustine paved the way for the papal authority that allowed for this. ~ Deacon Donald Higby


