The Pastor's Corner

The Feast of the Holy Family

He went down with them to Nazareth and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom, age, and favor before God and man (Lk 2:51-52).

This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. In honoring the Holy Family, we honor all of our families—including God's family—our Church. But in a special way, we focus on the hidden, day-to-day life of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.


What was it like to live in St. Joseph's household? I wonder what it was like to have Jesus for a son and Blessed Mary for his wife. I suspect that they spent a lot of time working, eating, and dealing with problems together. Like most families, they would have also had fun together and disagreed with each other. They would have done everything that most families do.

It's worth noting that the virtues of Jesus and Mary were perfect, and that St. Joseph was "a just man." With that being said, the Holy Family wouldn't have been exempt from the challenges and hurts that other families face. They certainly faced death, and it's most likely that St. Joseph passed away before Jesus began his public ministry. They weren't shielded from gossip and misunderstanding. For example, the fact that Mary was with child

out of wedlock would most definitely have been a topic of discussion amongst the townspeople. Like other families, Mary and Joseph had daily chores to complete, family gatherings to attend, and many other responsibilities that other families have. The Holy Family would have lived a normal family life in every way.

Friends, this shows us just how much God loves family life—that he would allow His Divine son to be born into that life. In doing so, the Father elevated the family. In the Holy Family, we are reminded that every family is invited to share in God's life and encounter everyday life with grace and virtue.

After the first of the year, we will be preparing letters for parishioners summarizing their donations in 2021.


We are required by IRS laws to send letter to anyone who donated more than \$250 in a single donation, but we don't send out letters to everyone.
